Explore the Opportunities!

Have you considered a career in transportation? If you're majoring in civil engineering, computer science, criminal justice or business administration or related studies, the Missouri Department of Transportation has a great opportunity for you!

With MoDOT's Cooperative Education Program, you can earn while you learn and get the hands-on experience you need to get your career started. Co-op students:

- Earn a competitive salary
- Earn vacation and insurance benefits
- May be eligible for college credit hours¹ and tuition reimbursement²
- Receive long-term work assignments

¹Students eligibility for college credit will vary based on university's course requirements and guidelines. Students should contact their academic advisor to confirm eligibility.

²Students must meet MoDOT eligibility requirements prior to reimbursement of tuition.

Work and College

Work assignments and classes become more challenging as students progress within their course of study. Students can choose between an alternating option³, which allows them to alternate between (work phase) working and (school phase) attending class full-time each semester; or a consecutive option, which allows them to work consecutively for four or more months. Unlike a typical internship, a co-op is a long-term work assignment which may continue through graduation.

Upon graduation, a student's degree and cooperative education experience could lead to full-time employment with MoDOT in Jefferson City or any of the ten districts across the state, including Kansas City or St. Louis.

³Students who select the alternating option may be eligible to attend class and/or work during any phase of the program.

Student Eligibility

Co-op students who select either option must have and maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5, completed at least 27 college credit hours, and must have declared a major in civil engineering, criminal justice, computer science, business administration, or related studies for which the department recruits.

Academic standards set by the university and MoDOT must be met throughout participation in the program. Performance reviews will be conducted throughout each work phase.

Benefits

Benefits include vacation, sick leave, health insurance, retirement credit and tuition reimbursement.



Alternating Option Sample Schedule

The sample schedules indicate the work assignment schedule of a typical co-op who selects the alternating option. Beginning with the first year in the program students receive hands-on experience in their field of study. Civil engineering job titles will vary based on area of interest and availability of work assignments.
