Rudolph (Rudy) E. Farber was appointed to the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission on March 19, 2007 by Governor Matt Blunt. His term will expire March 1, 2013.

A resident of Neosho, Farber is the first Newton County resident to serve on the Commission.
