



Frequently Asked Questions

Improvements at Bus. Route 54 and Second (Rte. O)
Public Hearing
Sept. 1, 2009, 4 – 6:30 p.m.

Q. What is the purpose of this project?

A. The purpose of the project is to improve traffic flow and safety at the intersection of Bus. Rte. 54 and Second Street (Route O) in Fulton. The proposed improvements include realigning the current intersection of Business Route 54 and Second Street to construct a roundabout. A roundabout is an intersection, which accommodates traffic flow in one direction around a central circular island. The Stinson Creek Bridge on Business Route 54 and the Stinson Creek Bridge on Second Street will both be removed and replaced with one box culvert.

Q. What is the project cost?

A. The work is estimated to cost \$1.7 million. MoDOT and the City of Fulton are sharing in the cost of this project. The project is also being funded in part through an \$855,000 federal earmark.

Q. When will work take place and how will traffic be handled during the work?

A. Work could begin in mid-2010. During the public meeting tonight, members of the project team will discuss options for handling traffic during construction and gather input from the community. Lane closures can be expected. Temporary road closures are also needed during the work and traffic will be detoured around the area. The duration of the closures has yet to be determined.

Q. Will additional right of way be needed to construct this project?

A. Right of way and easements are needed to complete work. For those property owners affected, we encourage you to reference the enclosed brochure titled “Pathways for Progress.” This brochure outlines the process and should answer most of your questions.
