

MoDOT Minute – Feb. 23, 2010

Hi. This is Sally Oxenhandler with your MoDOT Minute.

The Kansas City area has received \$50 million in federal stimulus money for transportation projects. The funding comes from the TIGER grant program that was established as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. The grant will be used to improve infrastructure in Kansas City's urban core and replace the Troost Avenue Bridge over Brush Creek. The funding will also be used to improve major transit corridors.

The Missouri Bike Federation and MoDOT are partnering to identify high priority bicycle, pedestrian and Americans with Disabilities Act projects. The highest priority projects will be added to MoDOT's planning process with the hopes of completing them in the next five to seven years. That's provided funding is available and the projects are supported by the public. For more information, visit mobikefed.org.
