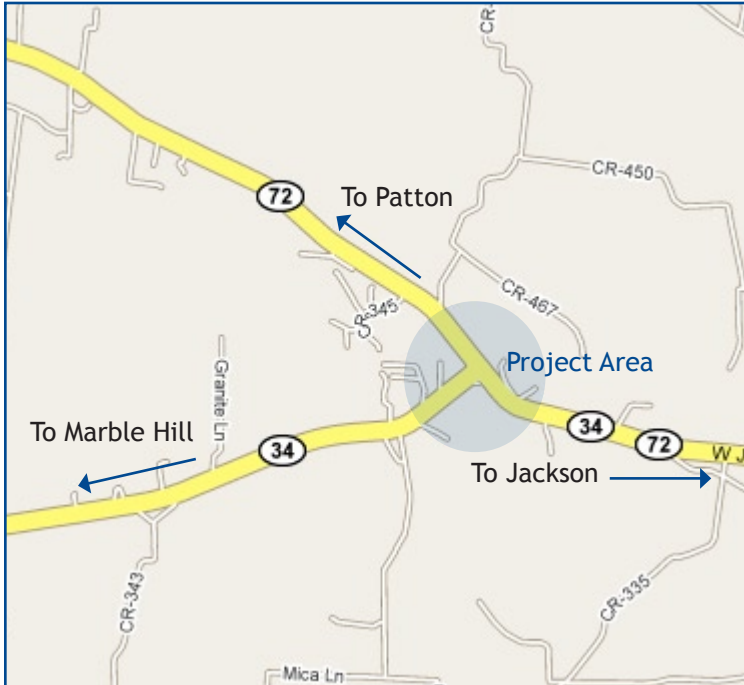


# If you travel Routes 34 or 72 near Jackson, you could be facing

# Big Delays

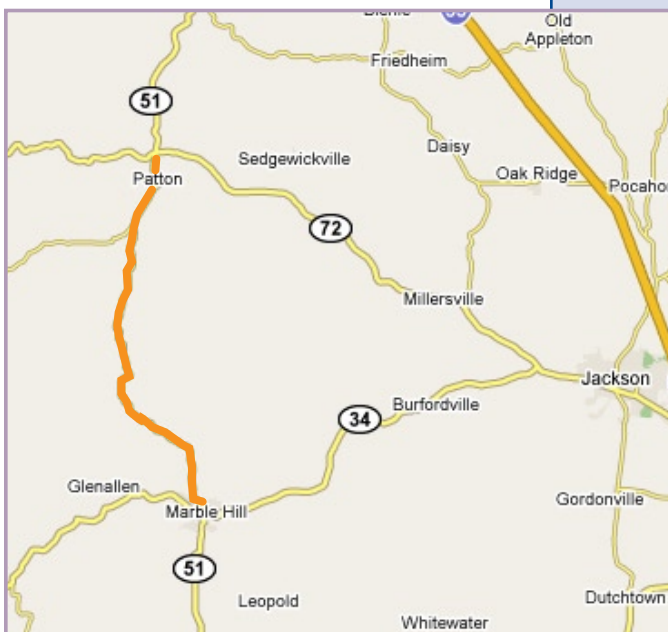


## Why?

The final phase for improvements to Route 34/72 in Jackson includes widening and resurfacing the route to four lanes from County Road 335 to the Route 72 (Starlight) intersection and installing traffic signals at the intersection. By the end of July, work is expected to get started near the intersection, and drivers should expect delays.

## What you need to know

## Possible Detours



### Traffic Conditions:

- Construction will create delays. Traffic will be flagger-controlled. Delays of 10 minutes could occur depending on traffic volumes.

- Most affected travel times will be 6:30 to 8 a.m. and 3 to 6 p.m.

- Some of the work will cause tight turning movements, and large trucks may want to take alternate routes for ease of travel.

- Construction at the intersection is expected to last approximately one month.

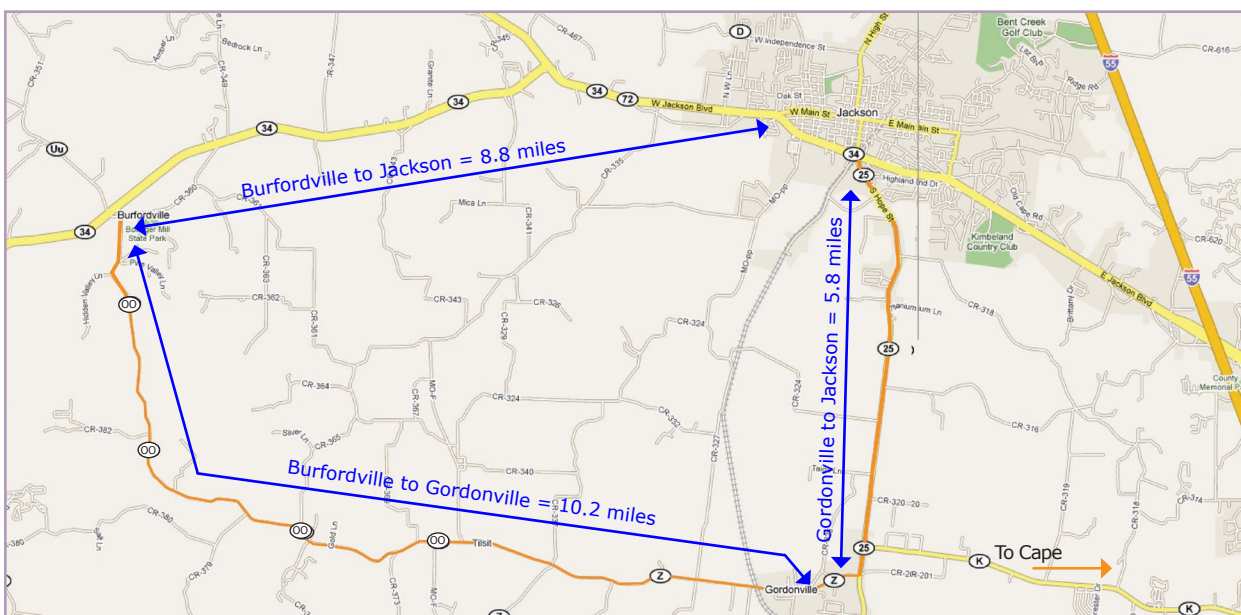
### What Can I Do?

- Consider alternate routes. Some are listed here, and while there may be a difference in mileage, traffic shouldn't be delayed with road work and there are no traffic signals on the detour routes.

- Carpooling. The fewer the vehicles traveling thru the intersection the less delay.

- Flexible work schedule. If possible, leave earlier or later to avoid the peak rush hours.

- Watch the message boards. The start date is anticipated for the end of July but will largely depend upon weather. MoDOT will alert drivers when delays are expected to begin, but motorists should watch message boards placed in the project area for the very latest information on when Intersection Work Begins.
