- Freight movement is the foundation for economic development




Your Input is Critical


- YOU are the connection between freight, Missourians, and the local/statewide economy

- YOUR observations are IMPORTANT









Important corridors


"The economic development aspect of highway upgrades makes improvements extremely important. I-70 is one of the busiest roads in the country."
