

Camden County Route J Bridge Replacement Public Meeting May 22, 2017

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the purpose of tonight's meeting?

The purpose of tonight's meeting is to provide information on plans to replace the Route J bridge over the Little Niangua River, as well as the bridge over Rainwater Creek, north of Camdenton. The proposed work will improve safety for motorists who use the bridge.

Why is this work necessary?

The existing bridges were built in 1932 and are 20 feet wide. The new bridges will be 26 feet wide.

How will traffic be affected?

The bridges and road will remain open during most of the work. Construction of the improvements will take about one year to complete. The roadway will need to be closed for approximately 3 months while the Rainwater Creek bridge is completed and the new Route J roadway connections are made. Access for property owners will be maintained throughout the duration of the project. Signed detours will be in place during the project.

When will the work take place?

The project is scheduled to be bid in the spring of 2018, with construction tentatively scheduled to take place in the summer of 2018.

Will additional right of way be needed to construct this project?

The project will require the acquisition of new right of way.

What will the project cost?

The total construction cost is approximately \$3 million.
