

Learn More About the New Roadway and Sidewalks Planned for Holden in 2019

MoDOT is planning a project to rehabilitate the aging roadway, sidewalks, and drainage structures of Route 58 (2nd St./Pine Street) and Route 131 (Olive/Lexington St.) in the City of Holden.

Why is MoDOT doing this project?

The current infrastructure needs attention. The Route 58 roadway was last resurfaced in 2006; the Route 131 roadway was last resurfaced in 2009. All of the existing sidewalk is in poor condition and does not meet ADA standards. Most of the existing sidewalk is more than 90 years old.

What is MoDOT Doing?

The project will consist of roadway resurfacing, new curbing, drainage and sidewalk improvements.

As part of the sidwalk improvements, the majority of the steps will be removed and the sidewalk adjacent to the doors of local businesses will be

flat. Ramps with landings will be provided. See reverse for sample plans.

Crews will also fill in existing ditches. New sidewalk will be closer to the road with new curbs and gutters in the residential areas.


Construction WILL require lane and shoulder closures to reconstruct the sidewalks. For short periods of time the routes may be closed (one or two blocks at a time) and traffic will be detoured.

When does construction begin?

Construction is scheduled to begin the summer of 2019 and be complete by late Fall 2020.
