St. Louis County Department of Transportation (SLCDOT) is requesting the services of a highly qualified consulting engineering firm to perform professional services for this project. Qualifications-Based Selection (QBS), in accordance with RSMo. 8.285 through 8.291, will be used to determine the successful respondent. Note, St. Louis County Revised Ordinance 107.071 is not applicable to the selection process for this contract.

Fees for acquisition work will be negotiated as a contingent item to the Engineering Services Contract (ESC). SLCDOT will evaluate project land acquisition needs relative to its available staffing at the time the A-Date request is made and will determine whether acquisition will be performed under the ESC or by SLCDOT staff. Fee appraisal work will be separately contracted by SLCDOT and appraisal review work will either be separately contracted by SLCDOT or performed by SLCDOT staff.

Request for Qualifications Consulting Engineering Services McKelvey Road Resurfacing and Sidewalks – Phase 2

Please limit your Qualifications Statement to no more than seven (7) pages. The submittal should include the following:

- A statement expressing your firm's interest in the project.
- Key project staff and their qualifications.
- Current workload and availability of key staff throughout the project.
- Project approaches.
- Experience in designing ADA improvements and shared use paths.
- Experience in coordinating with MSD on roadway projects with drainage issues.
- Details of other similar projects your firm has taken through final design in the recent past. Contact information should be provided for similar projects completed for other agencies.
- DBE Utilization Plan
- Statement concerning the Computer-Aided Drafting and Design (CADD) software to be used for the project. SLCDOT's preference is for the plans to be prepared natively in Microstation and the use of SLCDOT CADD standards is required. SLCDOT CADD standards are only available in Microstation/InRoads format and SLCDOT will not convert its standards or surveys to other formats for consultants. SLCDOT reserves the right to review the CADD files for a project at any time and the consultant will be required to provide those in Microstation format upon request.

Firms may submit a copy of their company's general qualifications <u>separately</u> as a <u>single</u> additional document. There is no length limit to this document. This supplemental information is not required and is not guaranteed to be considered in the scoring process. <u>All project specific information should be included</u> in the seven-page Qualifications Statement.

All prime consultants shall be prequalified with MoDOT. It is further required that your firm submit an Affidavit of Compliance with the federal work authorization program along with a copy of your firm's E-Verify Memorandum of Understanding (15CSR 60-15.020) be submitted with your firm's Statement of Qualifications. These items do not count towards the seven-page limit.

Qualifications Statements will be scored based on the following criteria:

- Overall Experience and Technical Competence Pass/Fail plus 25 points
  - Project Manager has appropriate qualifications and has successfully managed similar projects (10 points)
  - Technical Leads have appropriate qualifications and have successfully performed on similar projects (10 points)
  - o Project Team has experience working together on similar projects (5 points)
  - Staff or subconsultant proposed that is qualified to perform LPA land acquisition in accordance with MoDOT LPA requirements (Pass/Fail)
- Project Approach 50 points
  - Proposed project approaches demonstrate a thorough understanding of the County's needs. (30 points)
  - O Proposed project approaches offer creative and innovative ideas that will enhance the County's ability to improve these roadways while minimizing impact to local residents, businesses and traveling public. (15 points)

- o Consultant states they will prepare plans natively in Microstation (5 points)
- Past Record of Performance 25 points
  - o Prior projects presented are representative of the technical challenges of the project being solicited (10 points)
  - o Experience in coordinating with MSD on similar projects (5 points)
  - o Performance on prior projects (10 points)

Selection will be made based upon the scoring of the Qualifications Statements received and interviews will not be conducted for this project.

A Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) goal of 18% has been established for this project. DBE firms must be listed in the MRCC DBE Directory located on MoDOT's website at <a href="www.modot.gov">www.modot.gov</a>, in order to be counted toward participation in any established DBE Goal. St. Louis County encourages DBE firms to submit as prime on any project for which they are qualified. Any sub-consultants needed to complete the professional services requested by St. Louis County must be listed.
