


"<u>Safety</u> is improved, no question about that, because now you're going to have interstate all the way from Kansas City to Fort Smith, and you will not be going through the <u>congestion</u> that is in the Bella Vista area," Farber said. "Secondly, from an economic development standpoint, it connects Southwest Missouri and Northwest Arkansas very easily and improves the transportation so the <u>economic</u> <u>development</u> that comes out of that is going to mean dollars in working people's pockets."
