Disaster Declaration and Emergency Relief Funds

Missouri has seen it's share of wind and water this spring leaving many agencies to recover from damaged roads and bridges. Did you know there is a program to help? State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA) administers federal grants to eligible public entities for the repair and restoration of damaged roads, bridges, public infrastructure and facilities in federally-declared disaster areas. So far, Missouri has one major disaster declaration affecting 13 counties, <u>DR-4435</u>.



Missouri Buys

Did you know local agencies can purchase commodities from contracts the State of Missouri has in place? Called, Co-op bids, local agencies can purchase items from these contracts without bidding. The purchasing process has already been completed for you. Just call the company and order! Missouri's roadways have entered the busy construction and travel season. When working on roadways, MoDOT wants you to be safe so you go home to your family each evening. With distracted driving on the rise, being visible to motorists is the first line of defense. Wearing personal protective equipment (PPE) that is highly visible and reflective is a must. Never take for granted that a motorist or co-worker will see you working. Always stay alert, have a plan for what you will do if you have to avoid danger, wear appropriate ANSI certified Class 2 or 3 PPE and keep it in good shape.
