Road and Sidewalk Work

Notice to Contractors

Sealed bids for Project #STP-5422(615), “St. Cyr Culvert Replacement, Road Overlay, and Multi-Use Path”, will be received at: The City of Bellefontaine Neighbors, City Hall, 9641 Bellefontaine Rd., St. Louis, MO 63137 until 10:00 o'clock A.M. (Prevailing Local Time) on the 30th day of March, 2015, at the office of the City of Bellefontaine Neighbors , and at that time will be publicly opened and read. All bids shall be submitted in the form of paper bids.

The proposed work includes: Removal of an existing bridge/culvert, construction of a new box culvert and roadway, resurfacing of St. Cyr Road, and the construction of a new Multi-Use Path. Work also includes the removal and replacement of existing guardrail along St. Cyr Road.

Plans and specifications will be available on March 4, 2015 and may be obtained from Drexel Technologies, 135A Weldon Parkway, Maryland Heights, MO 63043 / www.drexeltech.com / 314-872-0900. A non-refundable fee will be charged.

All labor used in the construction of this public improvement shall be paid a wage no less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages of work of a similar character in this locality as established by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (Federal Wage Rate), or state wage rate, whichever is higher.

The City of Bellefontaine Neighbors hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, businesses owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, religion, creed, sex, age, ancestry, or national origin in consideration for an award.”

All bidders must be on MoDOT’s Qualified Contractor List per Section 102.2 of the Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2011 Edition including all revisions. The contractor questionnaire must be on file 7 days prior to bid opening.

Contractors and sub-contractors who sign a contract to work on public works project must provide a 10-Hour OSHA construction safety program, or similar program approved by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, to be completed by their on-site employees within sixty (60) days of beginning work on the construction project.

A certified or cashier’s check or a bid bond in the amount of 10% shall be submitted with each proposal.

The City of Bellefontaine Neighbors reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

The DBE Goal for this project is **12%**.

No 2nd tier subcontracting will be allowed on this project.

The contract will be awarded to the lowest, responsive, responsible bidder.
