

INVITATION FOR BIDS

Sealed bids for the City of Mexico, Audrain County Road 820 – Phase 2 (hereinafter “Project”) will be received by Mexico City Hall, 3rd Floor, 300 North Coal, Mexico, MO 65262, until 2:00 p.m. local time, on Wednesday, October 9, 2013, at which time the bids will be publicly opened and read aloud.

The Scope of Work includes approximately 600 feet of roadway improvements including new 24 feet wide concrete pavement, 4' concrete shoulders, pavement preparation, pavement striping, traffic control and other incidental items and work described in the Plans and Project Manual, or reasonably inferable therefrom. The City of Mexico anticipates issuing notice to proceed in the Fall 2013. A prebid meeting will be held on Wednesday, September 25, 2013 at 2:00 P.M. in Mexico City Hall.

Bid packages will be available after 1:00 pm on September 18, 2013 and may be obtained from the Wentzville office of Cochran located at 8 E. Main Street, 636-332-4574, or at the Public Water Department, City of Mexico, 300 N. Coal, Mexico, MO 65205, (573)581-2100, upon payment of a non-refundable fee of \$100.00 per set. Make checks payable to Cochran. For directions, please call either location.

A bid security in the amount of five percent (5%) of the bid amount must accompany each bid, in accordance with the Instructions to Bidders.

For a contractor to be awarded this project the contractor must have a fully responsive contractor questionnaire on file with the Missouri Highway and Transportation Commission at least 7 days prior to the bid opening date.

The wage rates applicable to this project have been predetermined as required by law and are set forth in this specification. When Federal wage rates are applicable and included, this contract is subject to the “Work Hours Act of 1962”, (P.L. 87-581: 76 Stat. 357) and implementing regulations. When state and federal wage rates are both required the higher of the two for each job classification shall be used.

Effective January 1, 2009 and pursuant to RSMo 285.530 (1), No business entity or employer shall knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien to perform work within the state of Missouri. The successful bidder must submit a sworn affidavit and documentation affirming the business entity's enrollment and participation in the federal work authorization program and that all of its employees working for the contracted services are not illegal immigrants.

Upon signing the contract, the successful contractor and any subcontractor performing the work shall provide a ten-hour Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) construction safety program for their on-site employees.

The City of Mexico, Missouri hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, businesses owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, religion, creed, sex, age, ancestry, or national origin in consideration for an award.

The DBE Contract Goal for this project is 8% and DBE firms must be certified by MoDOT to attain credit towards this contract goal.
