

Tiffany Springs Parkway Project

Notice to Contractors

The General Services Department of Kansas City, Missouri will receive sealed Bids until 2:00 PM, on Tuesday August 6, 2013 at 414 E 12th Street, First Floor, Room 102W, City Hall, Kansas City, Missouri, 64106 for Federal Project No. STP 3422 (403), City Project No. 89008141, Tiffany Springs Parkway. Bids will be opened after that time at the same location.

Bidding Documents will be available online to all interested parties at the Kansas City, Missouri Plan Room, <http://www.kcmoplanroom.org>. All addenda will be posted at this location. Any document or plan may be viewed or downloaded from this location.

The proposed work includes the construction of a four lane parkway from the intersection of North Platte Purchase Drive and NW 100th Street to the recently completed NW 96th Street and US 169 interchange. Work will include earthwork, asphalt paving, curb and gutter, storm system, drainage facilities, traffic control and pavement markings, and other assorted street and other items.

All labor used in the construction of this public improvement shall be paid a wage no less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages of work of a similar character in this locality as established by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (Federal Wage Rate), or state wage rate, whichever is higher.

The City of Kansas City, Missouri hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, businesses owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, religion, creed, sex, age, ancestry, or national origin in consideration for an award.”

All bidders must be on MoDOT’s Qualified Contractor List per Section 102.2 of the Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2011 Edition including all revisions. The contractor questionnaire must be on file 7 days prior to bid opening.

Contractors and sub-contractors who sign a contract to work on public works project provide a 10-Hour OSHA construction safety program, or similar program approved by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, to be completed by their on-site employees within sixty (60) days of beginning work on the construction project.

A certified or cashier’s check or a bid bond in the amount of 5% shall be submitted with each proposal.

The City of Kansas City, Missouri reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

The DBE Goal for this project is 18% and 1 OJT.

No 2nd tier subcontracting will be allowed on this project.
