Addendum 1 - Bid 20-146 - Centennial Greenway Phase 4, Federal Project No. TAP 7305 (618)

To all Contract Bidders of Record,

This Addendum, consisting of 14 pages, is issued to answer questions received, modify, explain, or correct the original contract documents as noted below, and is hereby made a part of the contract documents.

- 1. Are there any prefabricated trail bridges included in this project?
 - No
- 2. Who is installing the Light Poles on the project AUE or The Contractor?
 - The contractor is to install the streetlight poles (see proposal Item 44).
- 3. If the contractor is to install, where can the Specs for the pole be found?
 - See Section L, Technical Description of Proposal Items, Item 44.
- 4. Is the pole a direct embedded or bolt down? The Special Sheet DT 102 of the plans shows the light pole is to be installed in an 18" plastic culvert pipe, this is only done if the Utility Company is to install the pole.
 - The culvert pipe will not be required. All other items shown in DT-102 will be required.
- 5. Who is to install the Luminaire AUE or the Contractor?
 - The contractor shall install the luminaire (see proposal Item 44)
- 6. The Distribution Pedestal, Emerson Network UPCBD2 called for on DT102 is a telephone pedestal not a power pedestal. What should be installed?
 - The contractor shall install the Emerson UPCBD2 as specified in the plans and bid proposal (see proposal Item 45).
- 7. Where on the plans does it show the new pole and luminaire location?
 - Where streetlights are not in conflict with the multi-use path they are to be removed and replaced in their existing location. Where streetlights are in conflict with the multi-use path they are to be removed and replaced behind the multi-use path.
- 8. On Page 80 of 210 of the Specs, Item 38 Drilled Caisson (24") calls for a concrete base to be installed in accordance with JSP-13 of Sec N, There a total of 7 EA called for in the pay item, that would be 2 EA for the Push Button Post and 5 EA for the Light Poles. If the light poles are to be embedded, no concrete base is required.
 - The correct quantity for Item 38 is 2. Please see the revised proposal starting on page three of this addendum.
- 9. Is there a spec for the push button post? Specifically height and base type?
 - The push button post is to be a standard powder coated black Frey 130821 FMC Crosswalk Pedestal (P-base) or equivalent.
- 10. What are the specs for the street light post?
 - Streetlight pole shall be black fiberglass, 17' length with 3" diameter x 3½" steel or aluminum tenon on top and a 1½" diameter wiring hole 2' from bottom. When installed to a 3 foot setting depth, the pole shall be able to withstand a 475-pound horizontal load applied 12 inches from the top without damage.
- 11. What is the location of the pushed conduit?
 - The bored conduit is to be installed at the intersection of McClay Rd and Hackmann Rd for the new pedestrian P-bases.
- 12. What kind of wire is to power the pushbuttons?
 - The push buttons shall be powered by 2c#16 cable.

The CONTRACTOR agrees that this Bid Proposal shall be good and may not be withdrawn for a period of sixty (60) calendar days after the scheduled closing time for receiving proposals.

<u>FEDERAL AND STATE INSPECTION:</u> The Federal Government is participating in the cost of construction of this project. All applicable Federal laws, and the regulations made pursuant to such laws, shall be observed by the contractor, and the work will be subject to the inspection of the appropriate State or Federal Agency in the same manner as provided in Sec 105.10 of the Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2021 Edition with all revisions applicable to this bid and contract.

PREVAILING WAGE (FEDERAL AND STATE): This contract requires payment of the prevailing hourly rate of wages for each craft or type of work required to execute the contract as determined by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, and requires adherence to a schedule of minimum wages as determined by the United States Department of Labor. For work performed anywhere on this project, the contractor and the contractor's subcontractors shall pay the higher of these two applicable wage rates. The applicable state wage rates for this contract are detailed in "Annual Wage Order No. 26" that is attached to this bidding document. The applicable federal wage rates for this contract are the effective Davis-Bacon federal wage rates posted the tenth day before the bid opening date and are attached herein.

These supplemental bidding documents have important legal consequences. It shall be conclusively presumed that they are in the bidder's possession, and they have been reviewed and used by the bidder in the preparation of any bid submitted on this project.

<u>WORKER ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:</u> Execution of the construction contract for this project is dependent upon the awarded bidder providing an Affidavit of Compliance AND E-Verify Memorandum-of-Understanding (MOU) between the bidder and Department of Homeland Security to the Contracting Authority as required by section 285.530 RSMo.

This requirement also applies to subcontractors and contract labor, but this contract only requires submittal of the verification documents for the prime contractor. It is the prime contractor's responsibility to verify the worker eligibility of their subcontractors in order to protect their own company from liability as required by section 285.530 RSMo.

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<u>BUY AMERICA REQUIREMENTS:</u> Construction contracts shall assure compliance with Section 165 of the Surface Transportation Assistance Act of 1982, Section 337 of the Surface Transportation and Uniform Relocation Assistance Act of 1987, and 23 CFR 635.410 regarding Buy America provisions on the procurement of foreign products and materials. On all contracts involving Federal-aid, all products of iron, steel, or a coating of steel which are incorporated into the work must have been manufactured in the United States. The Contracting Authority may allow minimal amounts of these materials from foreign sources, provided the cost does not exceed 0.1 percent of the contract sum or \$2,500, whichever is greater. The Contractor, and any subcontractor under such contractor, shall require all on-site employees on the Project to complete a ten-hour Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) construction safety program that includes a course in construction safety and health approved by OSHA, or a similar program approved by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations that is at least as stringent as an approved OSHA program (the "Safety Course"). All on-site employees are required to complete the Safety Course within sixty days of beginning work on the Project. Any employee found on the Project work site without documentation of the successful completion of the Safety Course shall be given twenty days to produce such documentation before being subject to removal from the Project. In addition, the Contractor shall forfeit to the Owner, two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00), plus one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each calendar day each employee is employed by the Contractor or subcontractor, without the required Safety Course training. When making payments to the Contractor, the Owner shall withhold and retain all sums and amounts due and owing as a result of any violation of this requirement. The Contractor may withhold from any subcontractor sufficient sums to cover any penalties the public body has withheld from the contractor resulting from the subcontractor's failure to comply with the terms of this requirement.

GOVERNING STANDARD: Except as modified or supplemented herein, all work under this contract shall conform to all applicable requirements of the Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2021 Edition including all revisions. St. Louis County Standard Specifications for Highway Construction shall be used for any items not covered in the Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2021 Edition including all revisions. Eastern Missouri Pavement Consortium 2021 Specifications shall be used for Portland Cement Concrete mix design. All storm sewers shall be constructed per the Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District's Standard Construction Specifications for Sewers and Drainage Facilities, 2009.
