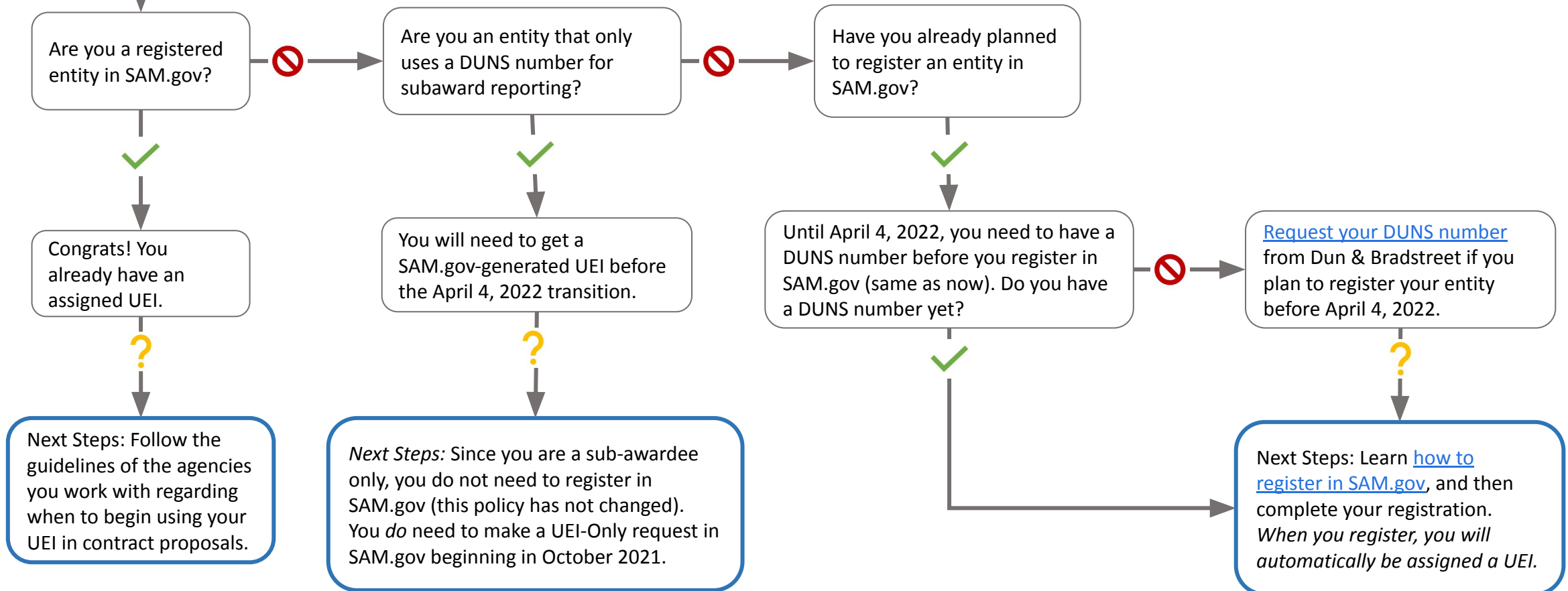

Do you use the DUNS number to search for entities in SAM.gov?



Next Steps: You can search for entities by UEI or DUNS now. After April 4, 2022, you can only search by the entity UEI; DUNS will not be available to search. In addition to UEI, you will be able to continue searching by other entity attributes, like name, CAGE code, socioeconomic status, location, etc.

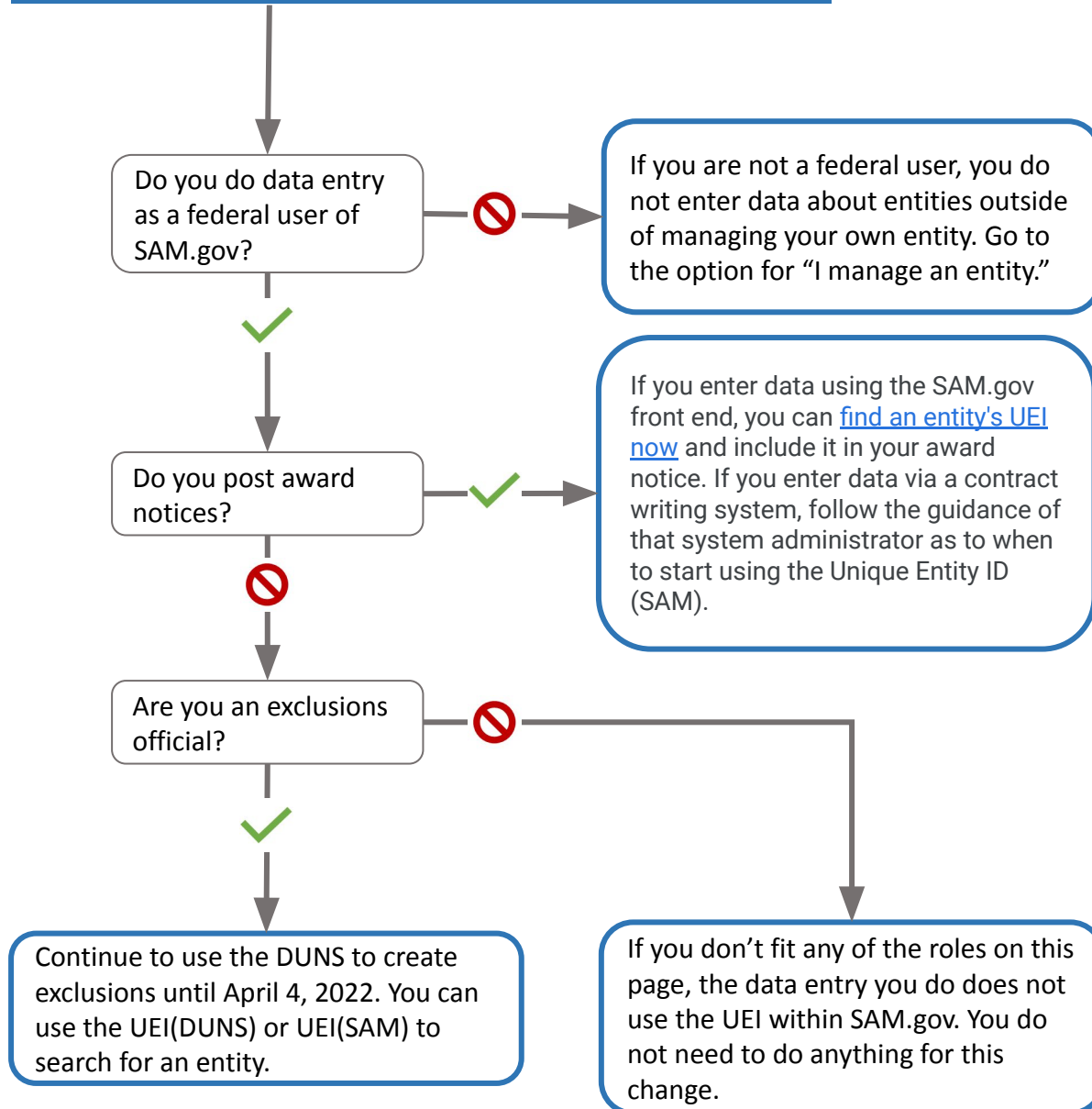


Next Steps: If you do not currently use the DUNS to search and view entity data, there is no change for you. You can continue searching by other entity attributes, like name, CAGE code, socioeconomic status, location, etc.

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Do you use the DUNS number to filter ad hoc reports in SAM.gov?



Next Steps: You can filter ad hoc reports now using either the Unique Entity ID (SAM) or the DUNS number. After April 4, 2022, you can only filter on the UEI. The DUNS number will not be available in any IAE systems after April 4, 2022.

Next Steps: There is no change for you. You can continue to filter reports by other entity attributes, like name, CAGE code, socioeconomic status, location, etc.

TIP: If you use API, the field for DUNS will remain, but will return blank when run, and will not receive information with uploads.
