General Summary	The outdoor advertising manager supervises the department's outdoor advertising, junkyard and logo programs, and administers the scenic byways program. Responsibilities are performed under general supervision.
Minimum/Required Qualifications	Bachelor's Degree: Public Administration, Business Administration, or related field. Six years of experience in positions related to right of way, program administration, or legal practices.
Supervisory Responsibilities	Full Supervision
Location	Central Office - Right of Way
Special Working Conditions/Job Characteristics	Job requires statewide, overnight travel.

Examples of Work

- (1) Monitors outdoor advertising and junkyard activity statewide for conformance with federal and state standards/regulations; supervises the preparation of automated reports and programs and reviews for quality assurance.
- (2) Plans and controls budgeted outdoor advertising, junkyard, and scenic byway expenditures.
- (3) Responds to inquiries, complaints, and requests for information from internal and external customers, including outdoor advertising companies, state and municipal officials, media, and the general public.
- (4) Reviews proposed legislation to analyze possible affect to the department; recommends changes in future legislation to benefit the department.
- (5) Develops and reviews policies and procedures governing outdoor advertising, junkyards, and scenic byways.
- (6) Testifies at informal hearings, administrative hearings, court hearings, and legislative hearings regarding outdoor advertising and junkyard issues.
- (7) Conducts public hearings and other formal meetings that pertain to scenic byways, outdoor advertising, and junkyard or right of way activities.

- (8) Promulgates state rules and regulations governing outdoor advertising, junkyards, and scenic byways for the state of Missouri based on legislative intent.
- (9) Performs supervisory responsibilities in a manner consistent with the department's Affirmative Action Program.
- (10) Performs other responsibilities as required or assigned.
