The Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission is requesting the services of a consulting engineering firm to perform the described professional services for the project included on the attached list.

If your firm would like to be considered for these consulting services, you may express your interest by responding to the appropriate office, which is indicated on the attachments. Limit your letter of interest to no more than **three** pages. This letter should include a statement to indicate your firm's understanding of the project. It should also include any other information which might help us in the selection process, including key personnel you would assign to the project and the backgrounds of those individuals, and any subconsultants you would propose to use, and an indication of your firm's approach to promoting and developing a diverse workforce. MoDOT is committed to reflecting the diversity of the communities we serve and we expect our partners to do the same. We will utilize the consultant information already on file so we will not need a lengthy submittal of other general company information. In addition, please attach one page with detailed information on similar projects that your key personnel have worked on. Indicate the role your key personnel played in the projects and include reference contact information.

DBE firms must be certified by the Missouri Department of Transportation in order to be counted as participation towards an established DBE Goal. We encourage DBE firms to submit letters of interest as prime consultants for any projects they feel can be managed by their firm. We also encourage both DBE firms and non-DBE firms to consider joining MoDOT's Mentor/Protégé program whenever possible as part of a MoDOT project.

MoDOT will evaluate firms based on: Project Understanding & Innovation, Past Performance, Qualifications of Personnel Assigned, General Experience of Firm, Familiarity/Capability, Accessibility of Firm & Staff. Firm's not providing a response on approach to workforce diversity will be considered non-responsive to this solicitation. Firm's that are not current on all of the required prequalification categories found in MoDOT's Approved Consultant Prequalification List at the date of the solicitation expiration will be considered non-responsive.

Consultant Services Required:	The consultant will conduct all necessary site-specific topographic surveying, including topographic surveying of the railroad right of way and rail profiles.	
	The consultant will conduct all necessary utilities coordination.	
	The consultant will conduct necessary Section 106 (historic preservation) investigations and clearances, and NEPA documentation (a CE2 is anticipated). Remaining environmental services will be provided by MoDOT. The consultant will be responsible for submitting the Request for Environmental Services, and will be available to provide project specific information for environmental clearances as requested.	
	Public meetings and/or hearings will be required due to the number of right of way parcels affected, and public interest in the project. The consultant will prepare exhibits and	

participate in the public meetings and/or hearings as required. At least one in-person meeting is anticipated.

The consultant will utilize the MoDOT Southwest District streamlining typical sections and traffic control plans.

The consultant will be responsible for providing the preliminary geotechnical report, borings (logs provided in gINT format), bedrock cores, laboratory testing, soil properties, MSE wall stability analysis (if required), and final foundation investigation. The consultant will be responsible for all surveying, traffic control, and railroad coordination necessary to conduct the required geotechnical investigations.

The consultant will review the data and the conclusions contained in the MoDOT-furnished traffic study for the signal installation at Route FF and Stephens Boulevard, and incorporate this data into the conceptual study report.

The consultant will prepare the necessary conceptual study report, conceptual roadway and bridge construction cost estimates, and other required supporting documents.

The consultant will prepare the necessary roadway preliminary plans, roadway construction cost estimate, and other required supporting documents.

The consultant will prepare the necessary preliminary bridge design plans (TS&L), MSE wall layout (if required), bridge memo, bridge construction cost estimate, sounding layout, and other required supporting documents.

The consultant will prepare the necessary right of way plans, roadway and bridge construction cost estimates, and other required supporting documents.

MoDOT will provide the necessary right of way estimates (by parcel), appraisals, negotiations, and acquisitions. The consultant will provide the land survey, property exhibits (tract maps), legal descriptions, and monumentation as required.
