Off-System Bridge Replacement Program (BRO)

- Off-system means bridges on roadways with a functional classification of Rural Local, Urban Local, or Rural Minor Collector
- Historically \$20.7M per year
- Money distributed to <u>Counties</u>
- 80%/20% match

Changes:

- Distribution of money based on the area of <u>poor</u> condition bridge deck versus <u>deficient</u>
- November 2021, Congress passed a new five-year ('22-'26) highway infrastructure bill: Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (<u>BIL</u>)...

Off-System Bridge Replacement Program (BRO)

- For the BRO program:
 - BIL made available additional money
 - Increase of \$7M per year

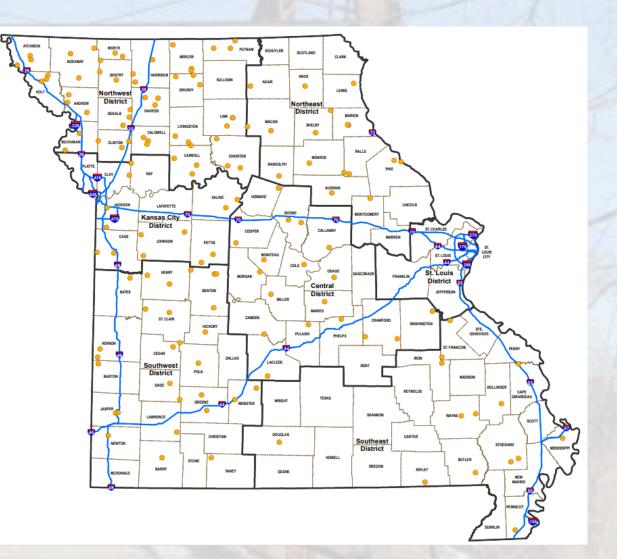

Regionalization Outcome

- 2022-2024
 - 316 applications received (\$240M total project cost)
 - 145 selected (\$121M total project cost)
 - 5 Large Bridges, \$2.4M
 - On average, 48 bridges per year (includes Cities/Road Districts)
 - Compared to 20-30 per year
 - Does not include St. Louis Region
 - EWG doing call for projects

Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)

- Historically (prior to the BIL) we received approximately \$18.6M in TAP funds:
 - 50% was allocated to the LPAs (\$9.3M).
 - The other 50% (any area) was used for MoDOT's ADA Transition Plan (\$9.3M).
- 80%/20% match



Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)

Changes:

BIL:

- Amount of funding set-aside increased to 10% of STBG funds per fiscal year (\$31.4M for fiscal year 2022).
- 59% of these funds suballocated to substate areas based on population (prior to BIL this was 50%).
 - Population distributions:
 - >200,000
 - 50,000-200,000
 - 5,000-49,999
 - <5,000

- The remaining 41% is available for "Any Area".
- All TAP funds distributed and made available for competitive process.
- Non-BIL Change:
 - Maximum federal reimbursement was changed to \$500,000 from \$400,000.
