GENERAL NOTES

This addendum is issued for the purpose of clarifying the intent of the contract documents or for making necessary corrections, deletions, and/or additions to the documents on all items of discrepancy raised up to the time of the issuance of this addendum.

Each bidder is hereby instructed and authorized to incorporate into his proposal the instructions contained in this addendum. This addendum forms a part of the bidding and contract documents and modifies the original bidding documents, dated October 24, 2023. Acknowledge receipt of this addendum in space provided on Bid Form. FAILURE TO DO SO MAY SUBJECT BIDDER TO DISQUALIFICATION.

This addendum consists of fifteen (15) – 8-1/2" x 11" pages and two (2) 22"x34" Plan Sheet "FP001" & Plan Sheet "FP002"

Summary of Revisions to Plans and Specifications:

The following is a summary of the revisions included in Addendum 2 and is not intended to enumerate all modifications. Refer to the "Project Manual" and "Project Plans" sections below and attachment herein for additional and detailed information.

- 1. The project competition timeline is 60 calendar days from notice to proceed.
- 2. The current Annual Wage Order 30 for Pemiscot County will be applicable to labor on this project.
- 3. The walk doors will be provided by the owner for installation by the contractor, Section 081113 will control hardware and installation requirements.
- 4. The contractor shall provide and install a 3" building insulation package, with minimum R-10 value.
- 5. The owner will provide a location near the contract site to dispose of clean concrete demolition debris.
- 6. The plumbing rough-in drawing have been modified and include some basic dimensions.
- 7. No overhead doors will be provided or installed; delete all references from the plans and specs.

The undersigned further understands and agrees, if this proposal is accepted, to furnish and provide all necessary machinery, tools, apparatus and other means of construction, and to do all of the work and to install all of the materials specified in the contract, in the manner and at the time prescribed, and in accordance with the requirements therein set forth.
- 5. The undersigned further understands and agrees that payment will be made on a **Lump Sum** bid basis for the work specified herein.
- 6. The undersigned further agrees to the fullest extent permitted by law, to waive any claim it has or may have against the OWNER, the Architect/Engineer, and their respective employees, arising out of or in connection with the administration, evaluation, or recommendation of any bid; wavier of any requirements under the Bid Documents; or the Contract Documents; acceptance or rejection of any bids; and award of the Contract.
- 7. The undersigned further agrees that the OWNER may at any time during the progress of the work covered by this contract order other work or materials incidental thereto and that all such work and materials as do not appear in the proposal or contract as a specific item and which are not included under the bid price for other items in this contract, shall be performed as extra work, in accordance with ARTICLE 11 of the General Conditions.

In case of failure to complete the work within the time named herein or within such extra time as may have been allowed by extensions, the undersigned agrees that the OWNER shall withhold, from such sums as may be due under the terms of this contract, the costs set forth in the specifications, which costs shall be considered and treated not as a penalty but as damages due the OWNER from the undersigned by reason of inconvenience to the public, added cost of engineering, and other items which have caused an expenditure of public funds resulting from the failure of the undersigned to complete the work within the time specified in the contract.

SECTION 005200 CONTRACT AGREEMENT

This CONTRACT made and entered into thisday of, 20 by and
between
hereinafter called the CONTRACTOR and Pemiscot County Port Authority, hereinafter
called the OWNER, WITNESSETH, that the CONTRACTOR and the OWNER for the consideration
hereinafter named therefore contract and agree as follows:
1. Scope of Work:
The CONTRACTOR shall furnish all labor, equipment, and machinery and perform all of the work necessary to complete the specified, Pre-Engineered Metal Building Erection & Foundation dated October 2023 all as shown in these bid documents and in accordance with the terms of the Contract Documents.
2. <u>Time of Completion and Liquidated Damages:</u>
The work as shown on the Plans and described in the Specifications shall be substantially completed as defined in Article 15 of the EJCDC General Conditions, within (60) consecutive calendar days after the "Notice to Proceed" date. The Contractor agrees to pay as liquidated damages the DWNER a sum of \$500 for each consecutive calendar day thereafter for each day that expires after the specified time until the work is substantially complete.
3. <u>Contract Sum:</u>
The OWNER shall pay the CONTRACTOR for the performance of the Contract the sum of

4. Progress Payment: Retainage:

The OWNER shall make progress payments on the amount or percentage of Work completed to date, as requested on the basis of CONTRACTOR's Applications for Payment and in accordance with Article 15 of the General Conditions.

There shall be retained from the amount so determined, for the first 50% of the total Work, a sum of 10% until issuance of Substantial Completion. After 50% or more of the Work, the Owner may at his/her discretion reduce the retainage to 5% of the amount of Work completed. Upon issuance of Substantial Completion, the retainage shall be reduced to an amount equal to a maximum of 5% of the Work completed.

5. Acceptance and Final Payment:

Final Payment shall be due thirty (30) days after completion and acceptance of the work, provided the contract be then fully performed, subject to the provisions of Article 15 of the General Conditions.

6. Contract Documents:

Contract Documents are as noted in the General Conditions.

SECTION 007343 WAGE RATE REQUIREMENT

The successful bidder and his subcontractors will be required to pay not less than the Prevailing Wage Rate for workmen engaged in work under this contract in accordance with Section 290 RSMo.

The current Annual Wage Order for Pemiscot County, Annual Wage Order #30, is attached to this section.

It is the responsibility of the Contractor to insure compliance and obtain the current Missouri Division of Labor Standards Annual Wage Order that includes hourly rates, overtime rates, and all required fringe benefit rates. If the Missouri Division of Labor Standards Annual Wage Order is revised during the term of this contract, the revised rate shall apply to this contract.

The **Construction Safety Training Act** contains provisions requiring all contractors and subcontractors who enter into contracts with public bodies for construction of public works to train their on-site employees regarding the potential hazards they may encounter while working on the project. The training may be accomplished by providing a standard OSHA 10 Hour Construction course or similar program provided it is as stringent as the OSHA 10-hour program **and** approved by the Division of Labor Standards ("Division").

For all overtime work performed, not less than one and one-half (1½) the prevailing hourly rate of wages for work of a similar character in the locality in which the work is performed or the public works contracting minimum wage, whichever is applicable, shall be paid to all workers employed by or on behalf of any public body engaged in the construction of public works, exclusive of maintenance work or contractual obligation. For purposes of this subdivision, "overtime work" shall include work that exceeds ten hours in one day and work in excess of forty hours in one calendar week; and

A thirty-minute lunch period on each calendar day shall be allowed for each worker on a public works project, provided that such time shall not be considered as time worked.

The scope of work includes the partial demolition of an existing cast-in-place building foundation and floor slab; rough in of plumbing for future bathrooms and kitchen areas; cast-in-place reinforced concrete foundations, floor slabs, and stoops; excavation and backfilling; erection of a pre-engineered metal building (PEMB) per the manufacturers requirements and contract documents (building to be provided by the owner); provide and install one (1) 16'x16' and one (1) 18'x18' steel commercial insulated overhead door with electric operator, remote control(s), and manual override opening/closing chain type operator (coordinate with owner); install three (3) 36" steel insulated commercial walk doors (doors provided by owner); provide and install all overhead and walk door hardware, locks and appurtenances; provide and install building insulation package (3" insulation all around, obtain from building manufacturer) and all other work and appurtenances as specified, detailed and required.
- E. Project will be constructed under a single prime contract.

1.3 USE OF PREMISES / PERMITS

A. General:

- 1. The Pemiscot County Port Authority will obtain a State of Missouri Highway Construction Permit for the proposed rail crossing improvements on the state right of way. The highway permit will be required prior to any work being completed on site. The contractor shall adhere to all requirements set forth in the highway permit.
- Contractor shall have full use of premises for construction operations, including use of Project site, during construction period. Contractor's use of premises is limited only by Owner's right to perform work or to retain other contractors on portions of Project.

1.4 SPECIFICATION FORMATS AND CONVENTIONS

- A. Specification Format: The Specifications are organized into Divisions and Sections using the 48-division format and CSI/CSC's "MasterFormat" numbering system.
 - 1. Division 01: Sections in Division 01 govern the execution of the Work of all Sections in the Specifications.
- B. Specification Content: The Specifications use certain conventions for the style of language and the intended meaning of certain terms, words, and phrases when used in particular situations. These conventions are as follows:
 - Abbreviated Language: Language used in the Specifications and other Contract Documents is abbreviated. Words and meanings shall be interpreted as appropriate. Words implied, but not stated, shall be inferred as the sense requires. Singular words shall be interpreted as plural, and plural words shall be interpreted as singular where applicable as the context of the Contract Documents indicates.
 - Imperative mood and streamlined language are generally used in the Specifications.
 Requirements expressed in the imperative mood are to be performed by Contractor.
 Occasionally, the indicative or subjunctive mood may be used in the Section Text for clarity to describe responsibilities that must be fulfilled indirectly by Contractor or by others when so noted.
 - a. The words "shall," "shall be," or "shall comply with," depending on the context, are implied where a colon (:) is used within a sentence or phrase.
