Economic Impact Study

Missouri's airport system is not only a means of safe and efficient transportation, but also provides over 100,000 jobs and accounts for more than \$11 billion in total economic activity. Each of the airports in Missouri has a specific impact on its local community that goes far beyond the local level to serve as a catalyst for economic growth.

STUDY PROCESS

Similar to the 2002 Missouri economic analysis, the economic impact generated by Missouri's airports is quantified in terms of direct, indirect, and induced economic activity and spending.

Direct impacts are based on the employment, wages, and sales generated by on-airport business activity. Common direct impacts stem from tenants like fixed-base operators (FBOs) or aircraft maintenance operations.

Indirect impacts arise from visitors arriving by aircraft and their spending on food, hotels, entertainment, transportation, and other activities. These expenditures support additional jobs, wages, and output.

Induced impacts, also referred to as multiplier impacts, are created through the "spin-off" effect of users purchasing goods and services from other local businesses and through workers spending wages and other income for household goods and services. For example, when an airport employee is paid, he or she uses their salary to purchase local goods and services at businesses in the area, which in turn spend their revenue locally, thus generating additional economic activity in the region.

Combined, the direct, indirect and induced impacts determine the total economic impacts for each airport and the statewide airport system.

IMPACT MEASURES

Jobs represent the number of people who are employed and are presented as full-time equivalent jobs.

Payroll represents the total annual wages, salaries, and benefits paid to all workers.

Output measures the value of goods, services and capital expenditures.

BENEFITS OF THE AIRPORT

Camdenton Memorial Airport is located in central Missouri near the Lake of the Ozarks within the City of Camdenton. The airport is owned and operated by the City of Camdenton. The airport has one asphalt paved runway, Runway 15/33 which is 4,000 feet long. Through a commitment to serve and attract general aviation users, the airport contributes to meeting the needs of individuals, the general public, the armed forces, and the business community it serves.

Common activities at the airport consist of corporate flying, flight training, and recreational flying. Bott Radio Network has a corporate flight department based at Camdenton Memorial, conducting regular activities at the airport. Accord Financial,

Bodell Construction Company, Central Cable Contractors,
Olsson Associates, and Wings of Hope are additional
companies and organizations who rely on the airport to
transport staff, equipment, and goods in and out of the region.
Seasonally, the airport supports aerial agricultural spraying,
Civil Air Patrol (CAP) search and rescue training and

missions, aerial photography, aerial advertising, and real estate tours.

The airport also serves as a gateway to outdoor attractions in the region, attracting visitors to Lake of the Ozarks, Osage Beach, and local colleges in the area. The airport serves as a staging area for community events and meetings, actively participating in youth and community outreach. The airport hosts an Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) Young Eagles event, which offers introductory flights to youth of all ages. In addition, the airport hosts the annual Lake of

the Ozarks Airshow featuring static aircraft displays, aerobatic aircraft performers, educational booths, and aircraft flights for veterans and the public. The airport further enhances the quality of life in the area by supporting emergency medical evacuation and medical doctor transports.

Lake Aviation Center provides typical FBO services that include fuel, hangar and tie-down rentals, aircraft maintenance and repair services, and flight crew facilities. In addition, Air Lake Aviation also offers flight instruction, aerial advertising, scenic flights, aerial photography, and aircraft rental.
