What activities will occur at the event?

Students must arrive at the bowling alley by 1:00am. Once they arrive, they will participate in a variety of games including but not limited to: bowling, arcade games, Wii games. They can win tickets at the games to bid on prizes. Throughout the night they are also eligible for door prizes. Food is available during the entire event. The evening ends with a Hypnotist Show and drawings for the prizes. When each student leaves they will receive a goody bag with a t-shirt, food coupons, and literature on safe driving.

Two months prior to project prom, the Notre Dame Alcohol and Substance Abuse Prevention team will bring in a panel of experts including a lawyer, insurance agent, police officer, and a SATOP counselor to address questions that the students have about drinking or drugged driving, and other traffic violations. The title of the program is called "At What Cost?", addressing the financial and emotional toll that a choice to drive impaired can have on the individual and on the family. The week prior to project prom, the SADD club will use the Missouri Safe and Sober program to reaffirm the importance of making wise choices during prom and graduation season. Finally, the Notre Dame faculty and parents will host a sober after prom party providing a safe and fun environment leaving the students with priceless memories.
