


Top 2024 Work Zones for St. Louis Region

**** Work shared is not all-inclusive. There are many sidewalk and resurfacing projects throughout the region currently underway or set to start this year. ****



1. I-55 bridge and pavement improvements (St. Louis City and St. Louis County) – This project replaces or rehabilitates the driving surfaces on several bridges along I-55 between I-44 and Lindbergh. This year, crews will work between River Des Peres and Loughborough, as well as near Gravois Creek and Green Park Road, on the northbound and southbound lanes. Drivers can expect shifted traffic lanes between Lindbergh and Loughborough as crews remove and replace the driving surface on several bridges along that corridor. Cyclists can also expect a full closure of the Carondelet Connector south of Loughborough later in the year and short duration closures of the River Des Peres and Grants Trail greenways. Crews will pave the interstate and associated interchanges as bridge work is completed. During resurfacing, crews will remove the ramp from Cherokee to southbound I-55 in St. Louis. The project continues through mid-2025.

2. I-55 from Route M to U.S. Route 67, U.S. Route 67 from Route 61 to CC and Route A from Collins Drive to Route 61/67 (Jefferson County) – New bridges, signals, add lanes, resurfacing and guardrail upgrades. Construction underway.

3. I-70 Bridge rehabilitation project (St. Charles County) - Rehabilitation of 12 bridges along the I-70 corridor. Construction underway. Bryan Road over the interstate will be closed summer 2024. It's expected to be completed in fall 2024.

4. I-70 from Fairgrounds to Cave Springs (St. Charles County)- Interchange improvements. Construction is underway and ends summer 2024.

5. I-70 (St. Louis County) - Bridge improvements to the McDonnell Blvd. and Lambert International Blvd. ramps onto eastbound I-70. This work will include lane and ramp closures and will be completed by the fall of 2024.

6. I-70 pavement improvements (St. Louis City) – This project makes various pavement repairs and updates the driving surface on the interstate between Goodfellow and Kingshighway. This project will remove some equipment and update median barriers and guardrail along the corridor.

7. I-270 bridge replacement (St. Louis County) – This project replaces the I-270 bridge over Conway just north of the I-64 interchange. The project also widens and replaces the driving surface on the Ladue bridge on I-270. The project has begun and should be complete by late 2025.

8. Route 21 from Meramec River to Schenck Road (Jefferson County) – Resurfacing, bridge rehabs, and pavement repairs. Construction is ongoing.

9. Route 50/61/67 (Lindbergh) roadway improvements – This project makes updates to sidewalks along the corridor between Big Bend and Barracksview to meet Americans with Disabilities Act requirements and resurfaces the roadway. Another project along Lindbergh makes updates to signals, updates sidewalks to meet Americans with Disabilities Act requirements and resurfaces the roadway between Swan Drive and Route D (Page Ave). The roadway improvement projects are underway and should be complete in late 2025.

10. Route 100 from Washington Crossing to east of Fifth Street (Franklin County) – Resurfacing, guardrail upgrades, and ADA upgrades. Construction begins early 2024.

11. Route 115 (Natural Bridge Road) (St. Louis County) – Resurfacing, drainage and pedestrian facility improvements from Lucas & Hunt to St. Louis city limits. Another project on Route 115 includes pavement resurfacing, signal upgrades, drainage and sidewalk improvements from I-170 to North Hanley Road and on Engler Ave. from Route 115 to Wood Ave. This work will result in lane drops along Natural Bridge. Some construction is underway and should be complete by the end of 2025.

12. Route MM from Route T to Route 100 (Franklin County) - Resurfacing, guardrail upgrades, curve correction, replace box culverts and add shoulders. Construction begins Summer 2024.

Various locations in St. Louis County, St. Louis City and Jefferson County– Safety measures to reduce fatal and serious injury crashes. Construction is underway.
