


Temporary closure at Dunn Road near Lindbergh Boulevard

As of March 27th, Dunn Road near Lindbergh Boulevard is closed for 28 days. Eastbound Dunn Road traffic will detour to Taylor Road via Imperial Drive to Lynn Haven Lane. Westbound Dunn Road traffic will detour to Dunn Road via Lynn Haven Lane to Imperial Drive.

All I-270 North closures and construction work are part of the \$278 million I-270 North Project infrastructure upgrades. CURRENT AND UPCOMING WORK AREAS:

- I-270 Westbound on ramp from West Florissant Avenue will tentatively close on 4/12 for 1 month.
- Dunn Road closed between Lynn Haven Lane and 637. Dunn Road will open on 4/24.
- I-270 Westbound on ramp from New Halls Ferry Road will tentatively close on 6/1 (after West Florissant Avenue ramp) for 3 months.
- New Florissant Road Bridge construction continues through Spring 2023.
- Route 367 Flyover bridge(s) are under construction through Summer 2023.
- Westbound I-270 widening work continues through 2023.

Florissant Police Chief



“We want to foster a safe and prosperous community for our residents, workers and families,” said Florissant Police Chief Timothy Fagan. “We are dedicated to upholding a welcoming, secure environment and promoting a high quality of life for everyone who lives in or visits Florissant.”

Fagan, who began his career with Florissant’s Police Department in 1994, said the city experienced increased population numbers with its most recent census, and those numbers will result in, among other things, higher volumes of traffic on roadways.

“Higher numbers can mean a higher likelihood of congestion, but our officers have in-depth knowledge of our roadways, and they are adept at patrolling them and enforcing our traffic laws to effectively address traffic-related challenges. Our primary focus is on speeding and reckless driving; something that we receive complaints about on a regular basis,” said Fagan.

Fagan believes that the Missouri Department of Transportation’s (MoDOT) significant investment in North St. Louis County through the I-270 North Project will have both positive and significant impacts on Florissant and the entire region. “My hope is that the I-270 North Project will help increase roadway safety and that the improved traffic flow will allow people to reach their destinations easier and with minimal delay, while encouraging safe driving. Safer roads should also yield positive impacts on businesses, while encouraging economic growth and development,” he said.

He added that while roadway safety is a primary concern, he believes that the project will benefit the City of Florissant and surrounding cities in additional ways. “The project will create safe spaces for pedestrians and cyclists and that will help improve safety and encourage non-motorized transportation options.

The one-way conversions also add value by improving traffic flow, reducing congestion, and improving safety for drivers, cyclists, and pedestrians. We also know that improved bridge lighting can impact safety and enhance the visual appeal of a community. All of these aforementioned improvements will serve to make roadways throughout our communities safer and more user friendly, and for a police chief, those elements are all key factors in keeping the traveling public safe,” added Fagan.
