No bid will be considered unless a certified check or cashier's check on any bank or trust company insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, payable to City of Lebanon, for not less than five (5) percent of the total amount of the bid, or by a bid bond secured by an approved surety or sureties, payable to the owner, for not less than five (5) percent of the total amount of the bid has been received by mail or hand delivered prior to the bid opening date and time.

Bids may be held by the **City of Lebanon** for a period not to exceed one hundred twenty (120) calendar days from the date of the bid opening for the purpose of evaluating bids prior to award of contract.
