

INVITATION TO BID No. 2772

Sealed bids for the 2024 Traffic Signal Improvements Project STBG-5901 (824) will be accepted at the City of Springfield, Busch Building, 840 Boonville, Springfield, MO 65802 until 10:30 a.m. on Tuesday, March 3, 2026 and then publicly opened and read aloud in the 2nd Floor East Conference Room of the Busch Building. Bids received after 10:30 a.m. will be returned unopened.

This project consists of traffic signal replacements at six (6) intersections within the City of Springfield, including Battlefield Rd at Fort Ave, Campbell Ave at Broadmoor St, Grant Ave at Atlantic St, Grant Ave at High St, Kimbrough Ave at Madison St, and National Ave at Dale St. Project also includes the construction of fiber optic interconnect along National Ave, from Commercial St to Kearney St. Intersection improvements include the replacement of the existing traffic signal and also removal and replacement of curb ramps and concrete sidewalk to meet current ADA standards.

Pre-bid Conference: A pre-bid conference will be held at 2:00 p.m. on Wednesday, February 18, 2026 in the 2nd Floor West Conference Room of the Busch Building, 840 N Boonville Ave, Springfield, MO 65802. **All Bidders are encouraged to review the work sites and attend the Pre-bid Conference.**

A certified or cashier's check or bid bond in the amount of 5 percent of the bid shall be submitted with each proposal. Note all labor shall be paid Missouri Prevailing Wages and/or Federal Davis-Bacon Wages, whichever is higher.

Bidders must be on MoDOT's Qualified Contractor List per Section 102.2 of the Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, current version including all revisions. The contractor questionnaire must be on file 7 days prior to bid opening.

Contractors and sub-contractors who sign a contract to work on this project must provide a 10-Hour OSHA construction safety program, or similar program approved by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, to be completed by their on-site employees.
