Sealed proposals and bids will be received by St. Joseph Regional Port Authority until 10:00 a.m. (Prevailing Local Time) on Wednesday, July 8th, 2026, at the office of the St. Joseph Chamber of Commerce, 3003 Frederick Avenue, St. Joseph, Missouri 64506, and at that time will be publicly opened and read.

The proposed work includes, but not limited to:

Furnishing and installing a 14'x45' hopper bin, overhead conveyor and catwalk, under bin mixer, and loadout conveyor as shown in the plans and detailed in the specifications. Additionally, a 60'x120' hoop structure building with precast walls and concrete slab shall be furnished and installed as shown in the plans and specifications.

Special Needs: If you have special needs addressed by the Americans with Disabilities Act, please notify the St. Joseph Chamber of Commerce, at (816) 364-4110 or through Missouri Relay System, TDD 7-1-1, at least five (5) working days prior to the bid opening you plan to attend.

The wage rates applicable to this project have been predetermined as required by the law and are set forth in the bid proposal.

A Pre-Bid conference will be held at the St. Joseph Regional Port Authority located at 1616 Stockyards Expressway, St. Joseph, Missouri 64501 on Wednesday, June 24th, 2026, at 10:00 a.m. Pre-Bid is not mandatory but is highly encouraged.

The St. Joseph Regional Port Authority hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, businesses owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, religion, creed, sex, age, ancestry, or national origin in consideration for an award.

Plans and specifications may be inspected at the St. Joseph Regional Port Authority and complete instructions of bidders and proposal blanks may be obtained from Snyder & Associates at 802 Francis, St. Joseph, MO 64506 (816.364.5222) upon the receipt of Forty dollars (\$40.00). **Payment is non-refundable.** Only contractors who have paid for plans and specifications and are listed on the plan holders list will be eligible to bid.

Missouri Law, 292.675 RSMO, requires the awarded Contractor and its subcontractor(s) to provide a ten-hour occupational safety and health administration (OSHA) construction safety program (or a similar program approved by the Missouri Department of Labor and Industrial Relations as a qualified substitute) for their on-site employees (laborers, workmen, drivers, equipment operators, and craftsmen) who have not previously completed such a program and are directly engaged in actual

construction of the improvement (or working at a nearby or adjacent facility used for construction of the improvement).

The awarded Contractor and its subcontractor(s) shall require all such employees to complete this ten-hour program, pursuant to 292.675 RSMO, unless they hold documentation on their prior completion of said program. Penalties for non-compliance include Contractor forfeiture to the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission in the amount of \$2,500, plus \$100 per Contractor and sub-contractor employee for each calendar day such employee is employed beyond the elapsed time period for required program completion under 292.675 RSMO.

The project will be awarded to the lowest, responsive, responsible bidder. Bidders must be on MoDOT's pre-approved contractor list.

Proposals must be on forms provided in the Specifications and Contract Documents. The right is reserved to reject any or all bids.

GENERAL NOTES

COMPLETE WORK IN ACCORDANCE WITH MODOT, CITY OF ST. JOSEPH AND OWNERS SPECIFICATIONS.

NOTIFY CITY OWNER, ENGINEER AND PROPERTY OWNERS 48 HOURS PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION.

PROPOSED CONTOURS AND SPOT ELEVATION REPRESENT FINISH GRADE. FINISH GRADE CONSISTS OF TOP OF PAVEMENT, SIDEWALK, OR TOP OF EARTH, DEPENDING ON SITE LOCATION.

THE FINISH FLOOR ELEVATIONS SHOWN WERE UTILIZED FOR GRADING AND UTILITY DESIGN. THE ELEVATIONS SHOULD BE REVIEWED IN THE FIELD PRIOR TO CONSTRUCTION OF THE INDIVIDUAL UNITS.

MISCELLANEOUS GRADING, EXCAVATING, AND/OR BACKFILL ASSOCIATED WITH PAVING, STORM SEWERS, SANITARY SEWERS, OR WATER LINE CONSTRUCTION IS SUBSIDIARY TO THE PROJECT.

CONTRACTOR SHALL ENSURE POSITIVE DRAINAGE AWAY FROM ALL STRUCTURES UPON THE COMPLETION OF GRADING.

CONTRACTOR SHALL REFER TO SHOP DRAWING PLAN FOR EXACT BUILDING DIAMETER FOR EXACT DIMENSIONS OF BUILDING.

SITE TOPOGRAPHY TAKEN FROM SURVEY COMPLETED BY SURVEY. CONTRACTOR TO VERIFY EXISTING CONDITIONS OF THE SITE THAT MAY NOT BE REPRESENTATIVE OF CONSTRUCTION PLANS.

CONTRACTOR TO PROVIDE A LEVEL BUILDING PAD BASED UPON PROPOSED FINISHED FLOOR ELEVATIONS TO ±0.10' OR AS ESTABLISHED THROUGH ALTERNATIVE BID DOCUMENTS.

ANY ADDITIONAL EXCAVATION REQUIRED FOR RE-SHAPING OF ADJACENT AREAS TO PROVIDE FOR DRAINAGE IS CONSIDERED INCIDENTAL.

GENERAL NOTES:

A ST JOSEPH OPERATING PERMIT FOR STORM WATER DISCHARGE IS REQUIRED. COMPLIANCE WITH THE STORM WATER POLLUTION PREVENTION PLAN IS REQUIRED IN THIS INSTANCE. A CONSTRUCTION PERMIT FOR LAND DISTURBANCE WILL BE SECURED FROM THE CITY

SLOPES ARE TO BE LEFT IN A ROUGHENED CONDITION DURING GRADING.

INLET PROTECTION SHALL BE INSTALLED IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING INSTALLATION OF STORM INLETS & REMAIN IN PLACE UNTIL GROUND COVER HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED.

EROSION CONTROL MEASURES SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED PRIOR TO BEGINNING GRADING OPERATIONS WHERE POSSIBLE. ALL REMAINING EROSION CONTROL MEASURES SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING GRADING OPERATIONS.

SEDIMENT IS TO BE REMOVED FROM STORM WATER DRAINAGE SYSTEMS.

ROCK LINING IS TO BE INSTALLED AT AREAS OF CONCENTRATED FLOW (I.E. CULVERT OUTLETS).

ROCK LINING SHALL BE TYPE 2 ROCK DITCH LINER ACCORDING TO MISSOURI STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS FOR HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION SEC. 609.60. ALL NECESSARY STEPS SHALL BE TAKEN TO PREVENT SEDIMENT AND SOIL EROSION FROM BEING TRANSPORTED ONTO ADJACENT PROPERTY AND INTO STREAMS, LAKES, PONDS, OR OTHER AREAS.

CONTRACTOR SHALL INSPECT EROSION CONTROL MEASURES AT LEAST ONCE A WEEK AND AFTER EACH RAINFALL. ANY REQUIRED REPAIRS SHOULD BE MADE IMMEDIATELY.

ADDITIONAL EROSION CONTROL MEASURES MAY BE NEEDED IF UNFORESEEN EROSION PROBLEMS ARISE OR IF THE SUBMITTED PLAN DOES NOT FUNCTION AS INTENDED.

A. EROSION PROTECTION

1. CODE COMPLIANCE: THE CONTRACTOR SHALL COMPLY WITH SOIL EROSION CONTROL REQUIREMENTS OF THE MISSOURI CODE, THE MISSOURI DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES NPDES PERMIT, AND LOCAL ORDINANCE. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL TAKE ALL NECESSARY MEASUREMENTS TO PROTECT AGAINST EROSION AND DUST POLLUTION ON THIS PROJECT SITE AND ALL OFF-SITE BORROW OR DEPOSIT AREAS DURING PERFORMANCE OR AS A RESULT OF PERFORMANCE.
2. DAMAGE CLAIMS: THE CONTRACTOR WILL HOLD THE OWNER, ARCHITECT AND ENGINEER HARMLESS FROM ANY AND ALL CLAIMS OF ANY TYPE WHATSOEVER RESULTING FROM DAMAGES TO ADJOINING PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROPERTY, INCLUDING REASONABLE ATTORNEY FEES INCURRED TO OWNER. FURTHER, IF THE CONTRACTOR FAILS TO TAKE NECESSARY STEPS TO PROMPTLY REMOVE EARTH SEDIMENTATION OR DEBRIS WHICH COMES ONTO ADJOINING PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROPERTY, THE OWNER MAY, BUT NEED NOT, REMOVE SUCH ITEMS AND DEDUCT THE COST THEREOF FROM AMOUNTS DUE TO THE CONTRACTOR.
3. ALL AREAS DISTURBED BY CONSTRUCTION ON THIS PROJECT WILL BE SUBJECT TO CURRENT REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS AND THESE STANDARDS.

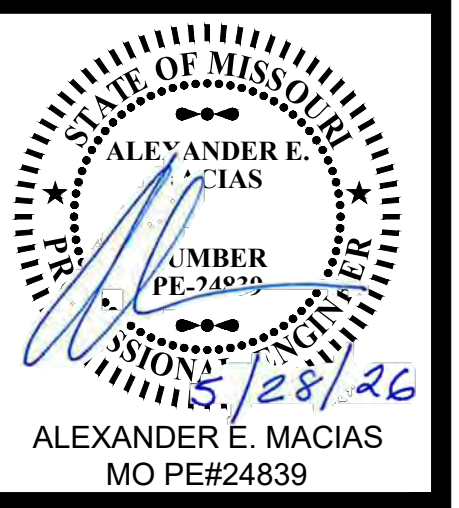
- A. INSTALL PERIMETER AND FINAL SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES SUCH AS SILT BARRIERS, DITCH CHECKS, DIVERSION BERMS, OR SEDIMENTATION BASINS DOWNSTREAM OF SOIL DISTURBING ACTIVITIES PRIOR TO SITE CLEARING AND GRADING OPERATIONS.
- B. PRESERVE EXISTING VEGETATION IN AREAS NOT NEEDED FOR CONSTRUCTION AND LIMIT TO A MINIMUM THE TOTAL AREA DISTURBED BY CONSTRUCTION OPERATIONS AT ANY TIME.
- C. MAINTAIN ALL TEMPORARY AND PERMANENT EROSION CONTROL MEASURES IN WORKING ORDER, INCLUDING CLEANING, REPAIRING, REPLACEMENT, AND SEDIMENT REMOVAL THROUGHOUT THE PERMIT PERIOD. CLEAN OR REPLACE SILT CONTROL DEVICES WHEN THE MEASURES HAVE LOST 50% OF THEIR ORIGINAL CAPACITY.
- D. INSPECT THE PROJECT AREA AND CONTROL DEVICES (BY QUALIFIED PERSONNEL ASSIGNED BY THE CONTRACTOR) EVERY SEVEN CALENDAR DAYS. RECORD THE FINDING OF THESE INSPECTIONS AND ANY RESULTING ACTIONS IN THE SWPPP WITH A COPY SUBMITTED WEEKLY TO THE OWNER OR ENGINEER DURING CONSTRUCTION. REVISE THE SWPPP AND IMPLEMENT ANY RECOMMENDED MEASURES WITHIN 7 DAYS.
- E. PREVENT ACCUMULATION OF EARTH AND DEBRIS FROM CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES ON ADJOINING PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROPERTIES, INCLUDING STREETS, DRIVEWAYS, SIDEWALKS, DRAINAGEWAYS, OR UNDERGROUND SEWERS. REMOVE ANY ACCUMULATION OF EARTH OR DEBRIS IMMEDIATELY AND TAKE REMEDIAL ACTIONS FOR FUTURE PREVENTION.
- F. COORDINATE LOCATIONS OF STAGING AREAS WITH THE OWNER AND RECORD IN THE SWPPP. UNLESS NOTED OTHERWISE, STAGING AREAS SHOULD CONTAIN THE FOLLOWING: JOB TRAILERS, FUELING / VEHICLE MAINTENANCE AREA, TEMPORARY SANITARY FACILITIES, MATERIALS STORAGE, AND CONCRETE WASHOUT FACILITY. BARRIERS AND DIRECT TO A SEDIMENT BASIN OR OTHER CONTROL DEVICE WHERE POSSIBLE. CONCRETE WASHOUT MUST BE CONTAINED ONSITE.
- G. REMOVE ALL TEMPORARY EROSION CONTROL MEASURES AND SITE WASTE PRIOR TO FILING OF THE "NOTICE OF DISCONTINUATION".

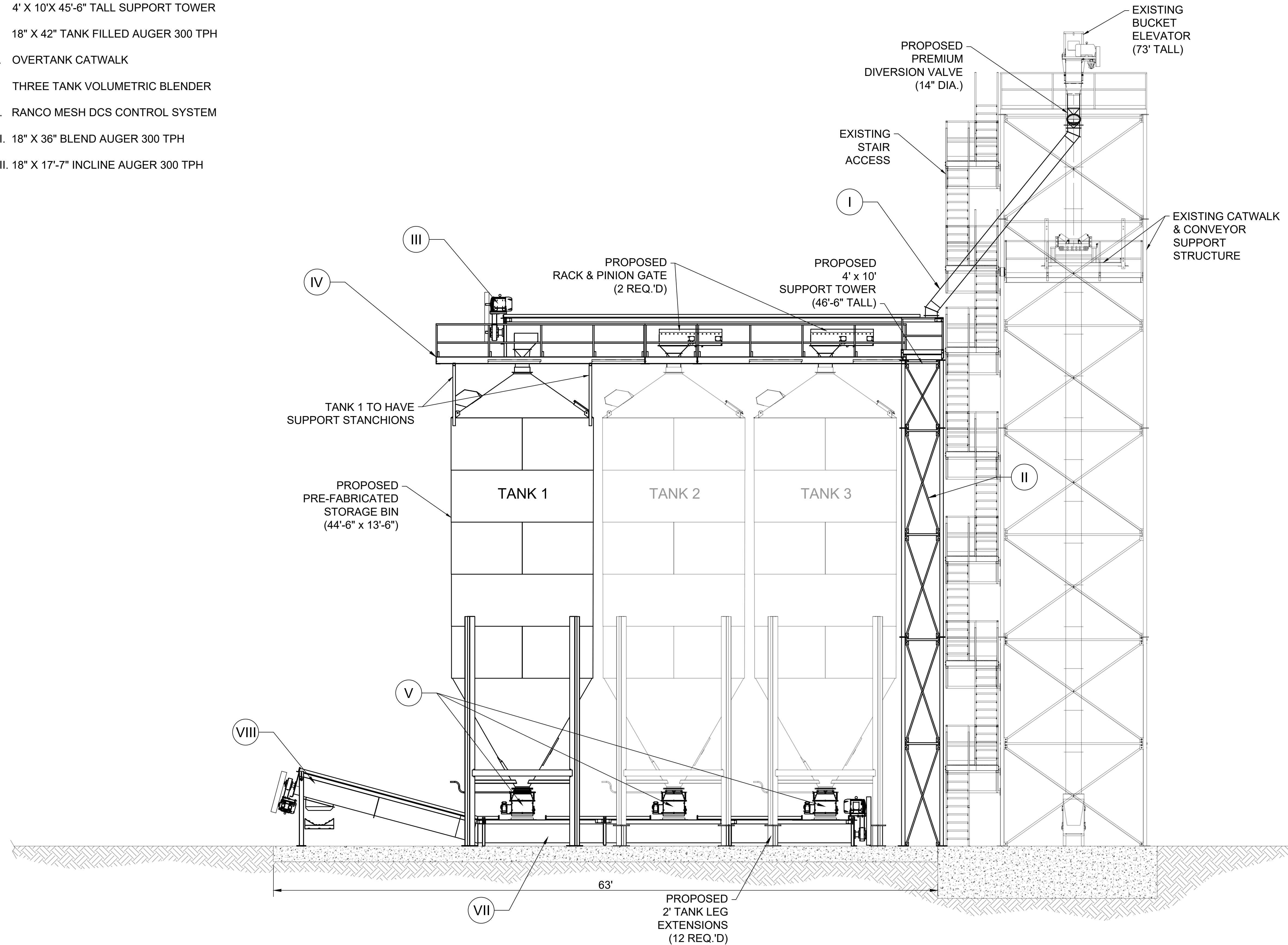

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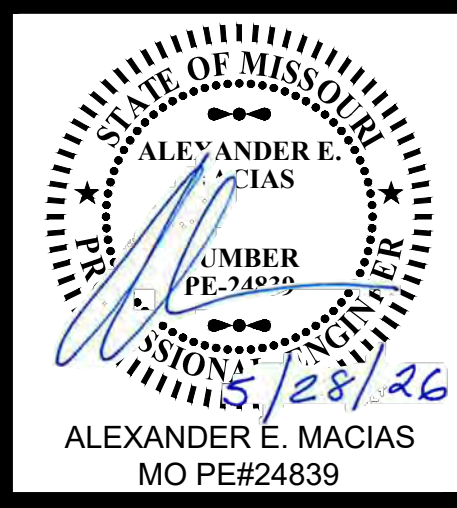

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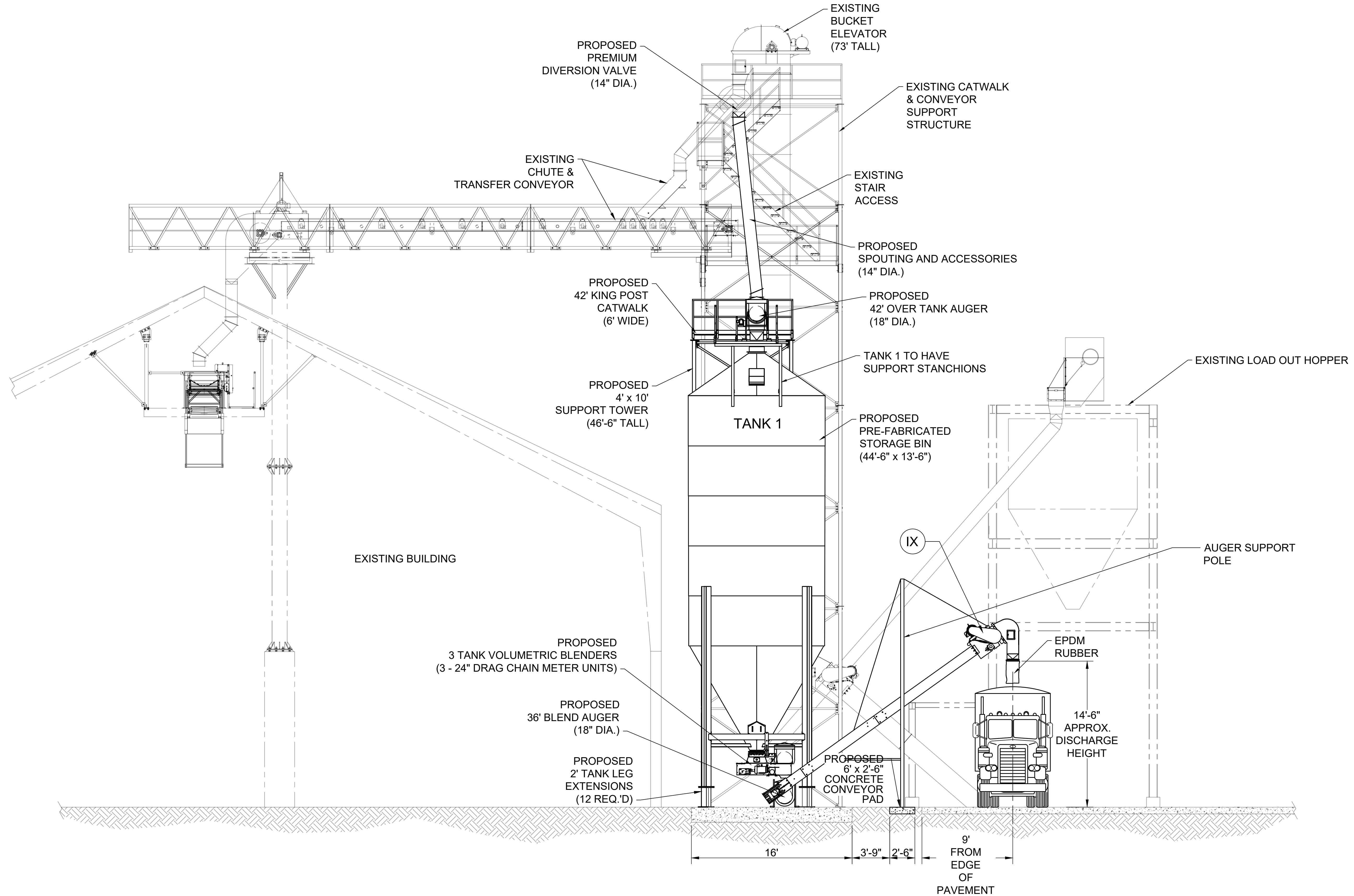

GENERAL SPECIAL PROVISIONS

GENERAL

This proposal and contract contains provisions requiring payment of the prevailing hourly rate of wages for each craft or type of workman required to execute the contract as determined by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (State), and a schedule of minimum wages as determined by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations.

GOVERNING SPECIFICATIONS AND DEFINITION CHANGES

The general requirements, provisions and technical specifications governing the completion of the work contemplated shall be the Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction and insurance requirements together with the General and Job Special Provisions and other State requirements contained in the contract documents. The General and Job Special Provisions and the Plans shall take preference over all other documents whenever any disagreement exists.

Contract Form, Contract Bond and Contractor's Acknowledgments will be in identical form to those contained herein.

All reference to the "Commission" made in the Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2026, shall be interpreted as the Regional Port Authority. All reference to the "Engineer" made in the above standard specifications shall be interpreted as the Board President or his designated representatives. All reference to the "State" made in the above standard specifications shall be interpreted as the Port Authority.

INSURANCE

- A. Before commencing of use of Railroad Crossing or entry on any portion of the Licensor's property, the Licensee shall obtain the insurance coverage described in Exhibit C, attached hereto and hereby made part of and to provide to the Licensor, the insurance policies, certificates, binders and endorsements described therein.
- B. Regional Port Authority required insurance.

General

The Contractor shall secure and maintain throughout the duration of the Contract, insurance of such types and in such amounts as may be necessary to protect himself, and the interests of the OWNER and ENGINEER against all hazards or risks of loss as herein specified. The form and limits of such insurance, together with the underwriter thereof in each case, shall be approved by the OWNER but, regardless of such approval, it shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to maintain adequate insurance coverage at all times. Failure of the Contractor to maintain coverage shall not relieve him of any contractual responsibility or obligation.

If a part of the contract work is to be sublet, the Contractor shall do the following: (1) Cover any and all subcontractors in his insurance policies, or (2) Require each subcontractor not so covered to secure insurance which will protect said subcontractor against all applicable hazards or risks of loss designated herein.

Workmen's Compensation & Employer's Liability Insurance

This insurance shall protect the Contractor against any and all claims brought under the Workmen's Compensation law for the state or states involved in the work performed under this contract. It shall also protect the Contractor against claims for injury to, disease, or death of workmen engaged

in work under this contract which, for any reason, may not fall within the provisions of the Workmen's Compensation Act. This policy shall include an "all states" endorsement.

Liability limits shall not be less than the following:

Workmen's Compensation - Statutory
Employer's Liability - \$100,000 per person
Disease Liability - \$100,000 aggregate

Comprehensive General Liability Insurance

This insurance, to be on comprehensive form, shall protect the Contractor against any and all claims for injuries to members of the public and damage to property or others arising out of any act or omission of the Contractor, his agents, employees, or subcontractors, in connection with the operation or performance of work under this contract.

In addition, this general liability insurance policy shall specifically insure the contractual liability of the Contractor assumed under the foregoing paragraph.

The property damage liability coverage under this policy shall contain no exclusion (commonly referred to as XC&UP exclusion) relative to blasting, explosion, collapse of buildings, or damage to underground property.

Liability limits shall not be less than the following:

Bodily Injury - \$ 500,000 per person
Bodily Injury - \$1,000,000 per accident
Property Damage - \$ 500,000 per accident
Property Damage - \$ 500,000 aggregate

Installation Floater Insurance

This insurance shall insure and protect the Contractor and OWNER from all insurable risks of physical loss or damage to materials and equipment not otherwise covered under Builder's Risk Insurance, in warehouse or storage areas, during installation, during testing, and after the work is completed.

It shall be of the "All Risks" type with coverage designed for the circumstances which may occur in the particular work included in this contract.

Coverage shall be for an amount not less than the value of the work at completion, less the value of the materials and equipment insured under Builder's Risk Insurance.

The value shall include the aggregate value of any OWNER furnished equipment and materials to be erected or installed by the Contractor not otherwise insured under Builder's Risk Insurance.

Installation Floater Insurance shall also provide for losses, if any, to be adjusted with and made payable to the Contractor and the OWNER, as their interests may appear.

If the aggregate value of the OWNER furnished equipment is less than \$10,000, such equipment may be covered under Builder's Risk Insurance, and if so covered, Installation Floater Insurance may be omitted.

Owner's Liability Insurance

This insurance shall be in the name of the OWNER, maintained in force for the duration of the contract, by the Contractor.

Policy shall be for the same limits of liability as the Comprehensive General Liability Insurance and shall protect the OWNER against any and all claims, and liabilities for injury to, or death of persons, or damage to property caused by, or alleged to have been caused by, the negligent acts or omission of the Contractor, his agents, employees, or subcontractors, growing out of the operations performed under the terms of the contract.

NOTICE OF LETTING

After the date is fixed for the receipt of bids, the Port Authority may, in addition to the notice required by law, give notice of such date by mail directly to those Contractors known to the Port Authority as being engaged in the type of construction to be bid.

PROPOSAL GUARANTY

A bidder's deposit in cash or certified check payable to the Port Authority, for not less than five (5) percent of the amount of the bid, or by a bid bond will be required before a proposal will be considered.

CONTRACT BOND

A contract (performance and payment) bond shall be provided for the project. A cashier's check or irrevocable letter of credit in the amount of the total bid (base bid plus accepted alternates), will be accepted in lieu of a contract bond.

INSPECTION OF WORK

The Contractor is hereby informed that this is a State project and when the State pays all or any portion of the cost of a project, the State laws, and the rules and regulations made pursuant to such laws, must be observed by the Contractor, and the work and project records shall be subject to inspection of the appropriate State Agency as provided elsewhere.

The Contractor is further informed that the Missouri Department of Transportation acts as a coordinating agent for the Owner, therefore, the work and project records shall also be subject to inspection by agents of the Missouri Department of Transportation.

On this project, the resident inspector will be an authorized representatives designated by the board.

All materials and each part of, or detail of, the work shall be subject to inspection by the Engineer, his authorized representatives and officials of other State agencies having jurisdiction over the work or funding of the project. This shall specifically include representatives of the Missouri Department of Transportation.

Access to all parts of the work shall be furnished with such information and assistance by the Contractor as is required to make a complete and detailed inspection. In lieu of inspection and testing, the Port Authority may request, and the Contractor shall provide, certification that materials used in the construction meet all specification requirements. Acceptance or rejection of minor amounts of commercially available materials may be made on the basis of visual examination.

CONTRACT TIME FOR COMPLETION OF WORK

The computation of time by working day will be based on Sections 108.7.1 of the MoDOT Standard Specifications except that the Engineer will advise the Contractor each month, by written notice, the number of working days charged to the contract during the preceding month.

The Contractor shall be prepared to accept the Notice to Proceed within fifteen days after the Notice of Award of the contract.

PROGRESS PAYMENT REQUESTS

The Contractor may make monthly payment estimates to the Engineer, in writing for the materials in-place, the work performed during the monthly interval and the value thereof at the contract unit bid prices. The proper percentage with relation to completion will be allowed for all completed items. In accordance with Missouri Prompt Pay Act (34.057 RSMo.), the Owner may withhold payment for any of the reasons outlined in 34.057 RSMo., or as determined by the engineer.

SITE CONDITIONS

The Contractor shall view the site of the work and make his own determination of the conditions to be encountered in accomplishing the work.

SURVEYS

The Engineer will locate the survey points shown on the plans and provide the Contractor with an elevation benchmark. All other surveying, construction stake out, and setting lines and grades is the responsibility of the Contractor.

SUBCONTRACTORS

The Contractor shall include the names of DBE and other subcontractors to be utilized on the project on the proposal forms. Prior to commencing work, the Contractor shall provide the Engineer with the names of all subcontractors for approval. The subcontractors listed shall be those who will actually accomplish the work and second-tier subcontracting will not be permitted. Should for any reason a subcontractor not be able to perform the work indicated, the Contractor shall notify the Engineer and obtain approval for assigning such work to another subcontractor before accomplishing the work.

QUANTITIES

The quantities contained in the proposal represent an estimate of the work to be accomplished and shall be considered the final pay quantities unless a variation in excess of 10% can be verified and documented by the Contractor, except for the following bid items listed below. If a variation in excess of 10% is found due to error in the quantity calculations or changed field conditions, the Contractor shall be paid for the quantity of work actually accomplished at the unit price contained in his proposal. No adjustment in unit price will be allowed for any overrun or underrun of quantities.

For items such as rock blanket and rock surface, the Contractor shall provide the Engineer with scale tickets as evidence that the required quantities of material have been delivered. Rock surface will be measured by the weight of materials actually delivered.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

The design of this project has been reviewed by various State Agencies, including the Corps of Engineers, the Missouri Department of Natural Resources and the Missouri Conservation Commission. The Contractor's attention is called to various management practices and requirements of these agencies contained in the Contract Documents. The Contractor shall exercise prudent precautions to protect water quality, cultural resources, and rare and endangered species to the greatest extent practical. The Contractor shall be totally responsible for any actions taken by Local, State and Federal agencies because of his operations.

MATERIAL CERTIFICATION AND TESTING

Written certification for all materials shall be provided to the Engineer at least ten (10) days prior to subject material being incorporated into the work. The certification shall state the type, source, quantity, and other

applicable information on the material and shall state that the material being supplied meets all provisions of the contract documents. This certification shall be signed by a responsible individual of the supplier.

Job control tests shall be run by the Port Authority or its representative as the work progresses to assure the Port Authority that the project is constructed in compliance with the applicable specifications. Independent assurance samples and tests may be taken by Snyder & Association, Inc. personnel and shall be submitted to the District Engineer prior to final acceptance of the project. Certain small quantities of materials may be accepted without complying with these sampling and testing requirements.

BUILDING PERMIT COST

1. Building permit costs shall be considered incidental, include in the cost of other items. Below is the City of St. Joseph's permit cost for new building construction:

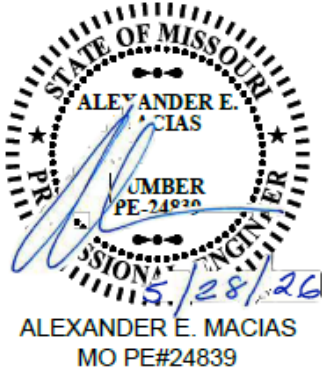

JOB SPECIAL PROVISIONS

GENERAL

The State of Missouri is participating in the cost of construction of this project. This proposal and contract contains provisions requiring payment of the prevailing hourly rate of wages for each craft or type of workman required to execute the contract as determined by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations.

Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2026 and supplements thereto, shall be used as basic specifications except as modified herein.

WORK BY CONTRACTOR

MOBILIZATION

This item shall consist of preparatory work and operations, including, but not limited to, those necessary for the movement of personnel, equipment, supplies, and the incidentals to the project site; for the establishment of all offices, buildings, and other facilities necessary for work on the project except as provided in the contract as separate pay items; and for all other work and operations which must be performed or costs incurred prior to beginning work on the various items on the project site. Erosion control is included in this bid item.

Payment will be based on the contract lump sum price for "Mobilization", partial payments will be allowed as per Missouri Standard Specifications for Highway Construction, 2026.

REMOVALS

This item includes removal and disposal of all existing pavement, piping, trees and any other removal required for project construction. Contractor is responsible for locating a disposal site. All disposals will be in accordance with MoDNR rules and regulations.

SUBGRADE PREPARATION

Item includes subgrade preparation required under concrete as well as shoulders. All subgrade beneath pavement and slabs shall be compacted to 95% of standard proctor.

EARTHWORK

Pricing for earthwork includes all work required to achieve final grade (in areas of both cut and fill) as shown on the plans. Borrow sites shall meet the requirements provided in these specifications. Contractor shall ensure all transitions between new grade and existing are smooth and maintainable. Contact engineer if grading issues arise.

Compact the backfill in paved areas to at least 95% of maximum standard proctor density. Compact backfill outside of slabs or roadway pavement to not less than 90% of maximum standard proctor.

12" AGGREGATE BASE UNDER HOOP STRUCTURE

After completion of grading contractor shall establish a minimum of 12" thick aggregate base consisting of MoDOT Type 5 base. Contractor to submit sieve analysis from quarry for approval. Tensar Triaxial Geogrid shall be placed on 6" of scarified and recompacted subgrade followed by 12" type 5 base.

CONCRETE**Products**

- A. Cement: ASTM C150, Type I - Normal Portland type.
- B. Normal Weight Aggregates: ASTM C33, and as herein specified. Provide aggregates from a single source for exposed concrete. Use crushed stone aggregate for all exposed concrete and floor slabs. Gravel aggregate may be used for unexposed concrete, footings, and grade beams. Aggregate for exposed concrete shall limit chert, shale, iron oxide, and deleterious materials. Maximum aggregate size to be 1" (Unless noted otherwise).
 - 1. Natural Sand Fine Aggregate: ASTM C-33; clean, hard, strong, durable, and uncoated. Limit shale, chert, coal, and iron oxide.
 - 2. Crushed Limestone Coarse Aggregate: ASTM C-33; clean, hard, durable, and uncoated.

- D. Calcium chloride is not permitted.

Concrete Mix

- A. Prepare design mixes for each type and strength of concrete by laboratory trial batch or field experience methods as specified in ACI 301.
- B. Design mixes to provide normal weight concrete with the following properties, as indicated on drawings and schedules:
 - 1. 4000 psi 28-day compressive strength; W/C, 0.45 maximum (or greater depending on hoop manufacture requirements).
- C. Adjustment to Concrete Mixes: Mix design adjustments may be requested by contractor when characteristics of materials, job conditions, weather, test results, or other circumstances warrant; at no additional cost to Owner and as accepted by Engineer. Laboratory test data for revised mix design and strength results be submitted to and accepted by Engineer before using in work.

EROSION CONTROL

Erosion control shall include installation of silt fence and/or ditch checks as required and maintenance as needed throughout the duration of the project for continuous erosion control. Contractor is responsible for identifying eroding areas and providing adequate control measures to address the problem. This is not a separate bid item and included in the cost of mobilization. Contractor to comply with Clean Water Act and permitting from Missouri Department of Natural Resources and the City of St. Joseph.

SURFACE RESTORATION

Lump sum pricing for surface restoration includes all equipment, labor, and materials required to provide smooth surfaces with gentle grade breaks prior to aggregate surface placement. Contractor shall ensure all abrupt grade changes are eliminated and all surfaces match in with the newly constructed trail and existing drives, parking areas, etc.

GRADE ADJUSTMENTS

Minor grade adjustments are anticipated to match field conditions, improve planned slopes, or to ensure proper drainage. These adjustments are expected and will be considered incidental to the project. No additional payment will be provided for minor grade variations.

UTILITY RELOCATES

Contractor is responsible for coordination of any required utility relocates including associated signing for the utilities. Contact information for the utility companies is provided on the plans.

UTILITIES USED BY CONTRACTOR

The Contractor shall provide all electricity, water, gas, etc. required for the work under his contract.

MATERIAL CERTIFICATION

Written certification for all materials shall be provided to the Engineer at least ten (10) days prior to subject material being incorporated into the work. The certification shall state the type, source, quantity, and other applicable information on the material and shall state that the material being supplied meets all provisions of the contract documents. This certification shall be signed by a responsible individual of the supplier.

MATERIAL TESTING

Test reports or certifications are necessary for all material incorporated into the work. The test report or certification must show the source and quantity of material being reported and if it meets the specifications. Job control tests shall be performed by the St. Joseph Regional Port Authority or its representative as the work progresses to assure the St. Joseph Regional Port Authority that the project is constructed in compliance with the applicable specifications. Certain small quantities of materials may be accepted without complying with these sampling and testing requirements. The contractor shall notify the engineer prior to each concrete pour.

TESTING ACCEPTANCE

The ENGINEER shall follow Missouri Department of Transportation methods of testing all materials and work. The Contractor shall notify the ENGINEER, in writing, if at any time he needs more tests, or requires test results for further evaluation of his work.

EXISTING FACILITIES

Private and public facilities and improvements, natural obstructions, and other physical obstructions and structures encountered during construction shall be protected or removed as per the job requirements, regardless of whether or not their existence or location is shown on the plans. Particular care shall be exercised while working around these facilities, with the Contractor totally responsible for any damages with repairs being made at the Contractor's expense.

EXISTING SUB-SURFACE PIPE LINES AND STRUCTURES

Existing sub-surface pipelines, sewers, waterlines, culverts, etc. near the work have been located according to the best information available. No guarantee is made concerning their accuracy, however, the Contractor is to assume full responsibility for the location, maintaining, and/or repairing in a satisfactory manner all such existing underground facilities. No delay will be allowed, nor any claim allowed, for encountering any existing underground facilities.

The Contractor shall make every effort to locate all underground utility lines, conduits, and structures by investigating in advance of trench excavation and by contacting the owners of the affected utilities. Any damages caused to affected utilities by the Contractor's work shall be repaired entirely at the Contractor's expense. No additional payment or claim will be allowed when redesign of project, due to utility conflicts, is required.

EXISTING STAKES AND MONUMENTS

The Contractor must carefully preserve benchmarks, reference points, and stakes set by the ENGINEER, and in case of their willful or careless destruction, the Contractor will be charged with the expense of their replacement, and he shall be responsible for any mistakes that may be caused by their unnecessary loss or disturbance. In the case of any permanent monuments or benchmarks which must be removed or disturbed during construction, the Contractor shall properly reference the monument for relocation.

CONTROL OF WORK - Delete Sec. 105.15.1.1 & Substitute the following:

105.15.1.1 - If the contract contains seasonal items such as sodding or painting, or such items as might delay the final completion of the project, a partial acceptance of the completed portion may be made prior to completion of the entire project. If the Engineer finds upon inspection that the completed work is in acceptable condition, he will so notify the Contractor in writing and after such notice has been given, the Contractor will be relieved of the duty of maintaining and protecting that work to the extent provided in the notice.

CONSTRUCTION STAKING

All construction staking shall be furnished by the CONTRACTOR.

CONSTRUCTION NOTIFICATION

The Contractor is responsible for notifying the Engineer/Owner each day he will work. Failure to notify the Engineer/Owner shall cause all work accomplished, without construction inspection, to be deleted from the contract. Shall the contractor fail to notify the Engineer/Owner of his work schedule, the Contractor shall be responsible for paying Engineers/Owner's fees involved in travel time, lost wages, etc. if Contractor does not work.

MAINTENANCE OF TRAFFIC

All street work, trenching, excavation, and other construction work shall be made in a manner to cause the least interruption to vehicular or pedestrian traffic. Where permits are required of the Contractor to excavate or obstruct public property, he shall in all ways comply with the provisions or requirements of the property authorities issuing such permits including, but not limited to, the requirements as to time, notice required, warning devices and temporary structures required. Prior to closing any streets, the Contractor shall notify the City Administrator or his designated representative.

The Contractor shall provide for access for emergency vehicles at all times.

RIGHT-OF-WAY

Construction shall be on the right-of-way provided by the OWNER.

The Contractor shall limit construction operations within the above listed right-of-way or as shown on the Drawings. Existing physical facilities such as structures, buildings, etc., are not to be damaged and are not a part of the easement.

If the Contractor wishes to place material or equipment on private property, he shall furnish a written agreement with the OWNER prior to placement.

PROTECTION OF PUBLIC, WORK, AND PROPERTY

The Contractor shall continuously maintain adequate protection for all his work from damage and shall protect the OWNER'S property from injury or loss arising in connection with this Contract until final acceptance by the OWNER and ENGINEER of the project.

The Contractor shall take all necessary precautions for the safety of the public, employees, and OWNERS on the work, and shall comply with all applicable provisions of State, and Local safety laws and building codes to prevent accidents or injury to persons on, about, or adjacent to the premises where the work is being performed. He shall erect effective barricades on which shall be placed acceptable warning signs on all streets, roads, highways and other public thoroughfares which are closed to traffic.

All open trenches and excavations, and other construction work shall be provided with suitable signs, barriers, and lights to provide protection to the public. Other obstructions such as material and equipment shall be provided with similar warning signs and lights. All excavated material shall be piled in a manner that will not endanger the workers or public and will avoid obstructing sidewalks or driveways.

All barricades, obstructions, and signs shall be lighted with warning lights at night from sunset to sunrise.

All signs, barricades, and lights and other protective devices shall be in conformance with the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices. Rules and regulations of the local authorities respecting safety provisions shall be observed. These protective devices shall be installed prior to commencing construction and shall be maintained throughout the project until completion and acceptance by the OWNER and ENGINEER.

PERMITS AND LICENSES

The Contractor shall pay the expense of all licenses and permits required for work under his contract. It is the Contractor's responsibility to obtain all permits and licenses required. Including Railroad permit and fees.

COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAW

All construction shall be in accordance with applicable State, and Local laws, including the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 and current revisions.

LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

Liquidated damages are to be payment to the OWNER for damages and not as a penalty for work in default of the contract. The amount of damages and construction dates are as specified in the BID form or in the Contract.

Liquidated damages shall be deducted from the monthly and final payment estimates.

EXTRA WORK

When directed, in writing, by the ENGINEER, the Contractor shall furnish materials and perform extra work not otherwise provided for by the terms of the Contract, but which is connected with or is necessary for the proper completion of the Work for which the Contractor has bid. Such materials shall be furnished and work performed as part of the Contract and subject to its provisions. Payment for any such Work shall be determined by the ENGINEER and the Contractor before such Work is done on the basis: (1) of unit

bid prices, (2) of an agreed lump sum price, or (3) of the actual cost of materials and labor furnished, compensation and public liability insurance, and payroll taxes, plus fifteen percent (15%), together with agreed rental prices for use of tools, equipment, and plant.

No claim for any extra work will be allowed unless accompanied by a written work order by the ENGINEER authorizing such extra work and defining the agreed basis of payment.

The Contractor shall, before the tenth day of each month, file with the ENGINEER, in writing, all claims for extra work performed during the previous calendar month. If he shall fail to make such claim before such day, his rights to extra pay for such extra work shall be deemed to have been waived and forfeited.

UNIT PRICES

In the event of a discrepancy between unit prices and extensions on the BID, unit prices shall govern.

PAYMENTS

The Contractor shall submit to the ENGINEER on the first day of each month an approximate estimate of the value of work done and unused material delivered and stored on the site of the work during the previous calendar month. The ENGINEER shall review this estimate, indicate his approval of the payment, and present the partial payment estimate to the OWNER or return the partial payment estimate to the Contractor indicating, in writing, his reasons for refusal to approve all, or a part of, the payment. The Contractor shall then make the necessary corrections and resubmit the partial payment estimate. After each such estimate has been approved by the ENGINEER, it shall be sent to the OWNER for his approval.

CLEANUP

The Contractor shall keep the site in a neat and orderly condition. The ENGINEER and OWNER shall be the judge in the event a dispute arises regarding this part of the work.

LAWSUITS

The Contractor shall indemnify and hold harmless the OWNER and ENGINEER from all costs, damages, expenses, or decrees resulting from a lawsuit or other action brought against the Contractor because of alleged failure, performance, negligence, or action by the Contractor or his subcontractors in the fulfilling of these contract documents.

INCIDENTAL WORK

All work shown and not listed as a bid item shall be included in the bid under related items. Incidental work includes intersection grading, adjustments to ensure drainage or ADA compliance, etc.

FOUNDATION PREPARATION AND GRADING

The work will include excavating 12' below slabs (See Plans) including 12" outside of the proposed footings, then compacting the existing subgrade to provide a uniform surface, then place a triaxial geogrid followed by 12" of MoDOT Type 5 base rock compacted in 6" lifts.

REINFORCED CONCRETE SLAB

Contractor to furnish and install reinforcement and concrete as shown on the plans for the base bid. See plans for typical hoop structure slab.

3.0 Bid Bond Requirements. The contractor shall be required to obtain a bid bond for 5% of the total bid amount for the base bid and all add alternates. This bid bond will be considered applicable to the proposed work for any option.

4.0 Basis of Payment. The accepted quantities of the chosen combination of base plus add alternate sections will be paid for by the contract unit bid price for item numbers found within the schedule of items for each section.

GUIDELINES FOR OBTAINING ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE FOR CONTRACTOR FURNISHED BORROW SITES SUCH AS BORROW SITES, HAUL ROADS, BURN PITS, STAGING AREAS, SPOIL SITES

The necessary clearances for disturbed areas such as those referenced above shall be obtained prior to using these areas for projects. The contractor is encouraged to consider using material from previously disturbed locations (substantial disturbance) or disturbed areas that have previously been cleared, precluding the need to address most, if not all, of the issues described below. The contractor should include the federal project number on all correspondence. The following addresses the primary environmental issues related to clearance of disturbed areas such as borrow sites:

The Endangered Species Act

The Federal Endangered Species Act protects rare species and their habitats. The Act is administered by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS). Violations of this act can result in extensive project delays and severe fines. To determine whether an activity will impact any rare species or their habitats, contact the Missouri Department of Conservation's Policy and Coordination Section at (573) 751-4115 to request a query of the MDC Heritage Database. All queries must be accompanied by a good quality map illustrating the location of the proposed site and a description of the activity. Allow at least three weeks for a response to all requests.

If there are no known records of rare species or sensitive habitats at the proposed site and it is unlikely that any will be impacted by the activity, the contractor will be given clearance to proceed. However, if rare species are known or likely to occur at the site or known critical habitat exists, further coordination with MDC and the FWS will be necessary. Written clearance from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service may be required before the project can proceed.

Floodplain/Regulatory Floodway

An evaluation of floodplain impacts is mandated by Executive Order 11988, Floodplain Management, and subsequent federal floodplain management guidelines. When available, flood hazard boundary maps (National Flood Insurance Program) and flood insurance studies for the project area are used to determine the limits of the base (100-year) floodplain and the extent of encroachment.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) guidelines 23 CFR 650 have identified the base (100-year) flood as the flood having a one-percent probability of being equaled or exceeded in any given year. The base floodplain is the area of 100-year flood hazard within a county or community. The regulatory floodway is the channel of a stream plus any adjacent floodplain areas that must be kept free of encroachment so that the 100-year flood discharge can be conveyed without increasing the base flood elevation more than a specified amount. FEMA has mandated that projects can cause no rise in the regulatory floodway and a one-foot cumulative rise for all projects in the base (100-year) floodplain. For projects that involve the state of Missouri, the State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA) issues floodplain development permits. In the case of projects proposed within regulatory floodways, a "no-rise" certificate, if applicable, should be obtained prior to issuance of a permit.

Documentation of consultation with SEMA regarding the presence of 100-year floodplain/regulatory floodway should be included in the final collection of information to be submitted to MoDOT staff.

Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Buyout Lands

The Flood Disaster Protection Act of 1973, as amended by the Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act of 1988 (The Stafford Act), identified the use of disaster relief funds under Section 404 for the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP), including the acquisition and relocation of flood-damaged property. The Volkmer Bill further expanded the use of HMGP funds under Section 404 to “buy out” flood damaged property that had been affected by the Great Flood of 1993.

There are numerous restrictions on these FEMA buyout properties. No structures or improvements may be erected on these properties unless they are open on all sides. The site shall be used only for open space purposes and shall stay in public

ownership. These conditions and restrictions (among others), along with the right to enforce same, are deemed to be covenants running with the land in perpetuity and are binding on subsequent successors, grantees, or assigns. Any decision involving these properties should take into consideration that 2–3 years is necessary to process an exemption from FEMA to utilize this parcel. This exemption would likely be a permanent easement rather than a transfer of property. If any proposed site is located on a FEMA buyout property, an alternative site should be chosen.

Farmland Protection

In order to comply with the Farmland Protection Policy Act, which has the purpose of minimizing federal programs’ contributions to the unnecessary and irreversible conversion of farmland caused by nonagricultural uses, the Form AD-1006 will need to be completed. This can be accomplished through coordination with United States Department of Agricultural (USDA)-Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and the completion of Form AD-1006. To receive the Form AD-1006, call the NRCS State office in Columbia at (573) 876-9411. An aerial map of the site or sites will also be required with the area to be disturbed identified on the map. This aerial map can be obtained from the local NRCS office. In some areas of the state this office may be located in an adjoining county.

The contractor will need to complete Parts I and III on the Form AD-1006. The form should then be sent to the NRCS State Office for completion of Parts II, IV, and V. The NRCS State Office address is:

After the NRCS office returns the form, the contractor will complete remaining Parts VI and VII. The contractor will provide a copy of the completed form to the MoDOT district contact to document compliance with the Farmland Protection Policy Act.

Wetlands

Federal executive order has decreed a national policy of “no net loss of wetlands.” Under this policy, impacts to wetlands must be avoided if at all practical. Where wetlands are impacted, these impacts must be mitigated by construction or enhancement of a like quantity **and** quality of new wetlands. For these reasons, avoiding impacts to wetlands is a primary goal.

To determine whether wetlands occur on a farmland site, contact the USDA NRCS. The NRCS has identified and mapped wetlands as a requirement under the Food Security Act. These maps are available from county NRCS offices, usually located in the county seat. For all other (non-farmland) sites, consult the FWS Wetlands Mapper at <http://wetlandsfws.er.usgs.gov/wtlnds/launch.html>. If wetlands are identified on either Food Security Act wetland maps or the FWS wetlands mapper, a site visit may be needed to confirm the location of wetlands. If there are no wetland impacts, no other action need be taken.

If there are any questions about the extent of wetlands in the event that wetlands cannot be avoided, contact the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (COE). If wetlands cannot be avoided, a COE Section 404 permit would be processed through the appropriate COE district. There are five COE districts in Missouri. Information about COE district locations, addresses, and phone numbers is available on the COE website at <http://www.usace.army.mil/ContactUs.html>.

Water Quality/Land Disturbance

The National Pollutant Discharge Elimination Systems (NPDES) program regulates construction activities where 1 acre or more of land is disturbed. If the project proponent has a general NPDES permit for all of their construction activities, this is adequate. If the project proponent does not have a valid general permit and the site to be disturbed is greater than 1 acre in size, a project-specific NPDES permit from DNR is required. If the project is entirely within MoDOT right of way, the sponsor may use MoDOT’s general permit. In either case, the sponsor will need to develop a site-specific stormwater pollution prevention plan for the project. The sponsor shall contact the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (DNR) NPDES Storm Water Program office at (573) 751-1300 or (800) 361-4827 for further directions. A few cities (Kansas City, Columbia, and others) and counties have obtained their own land disturbance permits from DNR for generic land disturbance purposes; see additional discussion on stormwater and erosion control in Section 4.

Hazardous Waste Sites

More than likely, areas to be disturbed will be located in rural areas that have been used for agriculture or similar purposes. Hazardous wastes are most typically associated with commercial or previously industrial properties. If the proposed area is basically farmland or pasture and has not been used for any commercial activity or dumping, hazardous wastes are unlikely. The contractor should simply document the existing and historic land use of the parcel and tell how this assessment was obtained.

In nonrural, suburban, or commercial areas a nonintrusive investigation may be used to “diagnose” the environmental conditions of a selected site. The following is a list of suggested items, but not inclusive, for a cursory nonintrusive investigation.

- Examine any noticeable contamination in the form of surface staining, oil sheen, odors, stressed vegetation, spills, leaks, illegal dumping, etc.
- Conduct interviews of local citizens and current owners to identify past land use practices and hazardous waste management practices.
- Consult with local and state [Missouri Department of Natural Resources, Hazardous Waste Program, (573) 751-3176] environmental regulatory agencies to identify whether any past problems (complaints, citations, etc.) have occurred at the site, whether any permits/licenses have been filed for the site, or whether enforcement actions have occurred.

If the above analyses produce negative results, the contractor should provide documentation to the MoDOT district contact as to who was contacted and the results of the contact. However, if potential problems are identified through the search for information described above, it would be wise to locate another site.

The potential to encounter wastes from sites that are unknown should always be a consideration. Any unknown sites that are found will be handled in accordance with federal and state laws and regulations.

Historic Preservation

All jobs requiring environmental clearance for historic preservation (archaeological sites and structures) must be reviewed and approved by the State Historic Preservation office (SHPO), Department of Natural Resources. To initiate SHPO's review and clearance of a proposed site for cultural resources, a "Section 106 Project Information Form" must be completed and submitted to SHPO along with a copy of a United States Geological Survey (USGS) topographic map indicating the location of the project. In addition, photographs of **any** structures that will be impacted must be provided. Based on the information supplied, SHPO may clear the project at that time or request that the contractor acquire the services of an archaeological consultant to conduct a historic preservation survey of the proposed area. Public Land

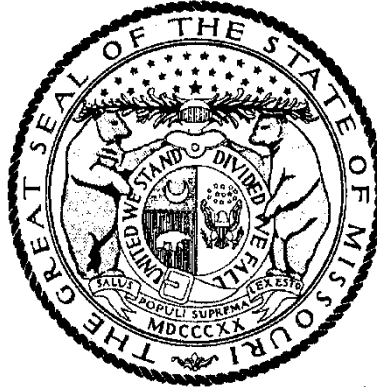
If borrow sites are proposed on any publicly owned land, contact the MoDOT district representative before proceeding. Section 4(f) of the Department of Transportation Act of 1966 (now codified as 49 U.S.C. 303 and 23 U.S.C. 138) protects certain public lands. Section 4(f) requires that all U.S. DOT-funded transportation projects must avoid impacts to public parkland and wildlife refuges (and cultural resources deemed eligible for the National Register of Historic Places), unless it is successfully demonstrated that no feasible and prudent alternative exists that avoids "use" or impacts to the park or refuge. It is strongly recommended that public lands not be considered as potential borrow sites.

Once the contractor has obtained all of the above information, it should be provided to the MoDOT district contact. The transmittal letter must include **County, Route, and Job Number** of the project, along with a map depicting the location and limits of the site(s).

OVERTIME and HOLIDAYS

OVERTIME

For all work performed on a Sunday or a holiday, not less than twice (2x) the prevailing hourly rate of wages for work of a similar character in the locality in which the work is performed or the public works contracting minimum wage, whichever is applicable, shall be paid to all workers employed by or on behalf of any public body engaged in the construction of public works, exclusive of maintenance work.

For all overtime work performed, not less than one and one-half (1½) the prevailing hourly rate of wages for work of a similar character in the locality in which the work is performed or the public works contracting minimum wage, whichever is applicable, shall be paid to all workers employed by or on behalf of any public body engaged in the construction of public works, exclusive of maintenance work or contractual obligation. For purposes of this subdivision, "**overtime work**" shall include work that exceeds ten hours in one day and work in excess of forty hours in one calendar week; and

A thirty-minute lunch period on each calendar day shall be allowed for each worker on a public works project, provided that such time shall not be considered as time worked.

Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the classifications listed may be added after award only as provided in the labor standards contract clauses (29CFR 5.5 (a) (1) (iii)).

The body of each wage determination lists the classifications and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the type(s) of construction and geographic area covered by the wage determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical order under rate identifiers indicating whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate), a survey rate, a weighted union average rate, a state adopted rate, or a supplemental classification rate.

Union Rate Identifiers

A four-letter identifier beginning with characters other than "SU", "UAVG", "SA", or "SC" denotes that a union rate was prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2024. PLUM is an identifier of the union whose collectively bargained rate prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. The date, 07/01/2024 in the example, is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all changes over time that are reported to WHD in the rates in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing the classification.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

The UAVG identifier indicates that no single rate prevailed for those classifications, but that 100% of the data reported for the classifications reflected union rates. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 01/01/2024. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the State of Ohio. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 01/01/2024 in the example, indicates the date the wage determination was updated to reflect the most current union average rate.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January, to reflect a weighted average of the current rates in the collective bargaining agreements on which the rate is based.

Survey Rate Identifiers

The ""SU"" identifier indicates that either a single non-union rate prevailed (as defined in 29 CFR 1.2) for this classification in the survey or that the rate was derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As a weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SUFL2022-007 6/27/2024. SU indicates the rate is a single non-union prevailing rate or a weighted average of survey data for that classification. FL indicates the State of Florida. 2022 is the year of the survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 6/27/2024 in the example, indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

?SU? wage rates typically remain in effect until a new survey is conducted. However, the Wage and Hour Division (WHD) has the discretion to update such rates under 29 CFR 1.6(c)(1).

State Adopted Rate Identifiers

The ""SA"" identifier indicates that the classifications and prevailing wage rates set by a state (or local) government were adopted under 29 C.F.R 1.3(g)-(h). Example: SAME2023-007 01/03/2024. SA reflects that the rates are state adopted. ME refers to the State of Maine. 2023 is the year during which the state completed the survey on which the listed classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. The date, 01/03/2024 in the example, reflects the date on which the classifications and rates under the ?SA? identifier took effect under state law in the state from which the rates were adopted.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- a) a survey underlying a wage determination
- b) an existing published wage determination
- c) an initial WHD letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- d) an initial conformance (additional classification and rate) determination

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests
