## Construction Activities in Full Swing This Summer

## Gutermuth Road

Crews are working day and night moving dirt at Gutermuth Road in Cottleville. During the next month, crews will be building the new bridge to carry Gutermuth Road over Route 364. Pile driving will be done in mid July, followed by the construction of the retaining walls and supports for the new bridge. Paving will be done in mid to late August with an opening of the bridge by August 30.


Crews move dirt from Gutermuth west building the roadbed for new Route 364.

## Route K

Crews are placing dirt on the east side of Route K to prepare for construction of the Route 364 bridge over Route K. Crews are hauling dirt from Bryan Road day and night, Monday through Saturday.

## Bryan Road

Excavation work continues for the construction of the substructure for the new Bryan Road bridge over new Route 364. By the end of July, blasting will be needed to get through the rock. Blasting operations could be once or twice per day at approximately $10 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. and 2 p.m., Monday through Saturday. Bryan Road traffic will be stopped momentarily for the blast. Blasting operations could last a couple of weeks


Excavation continues at Bryan Road. Trucks are hauling the dirt to the east side of Route in late July/early August.

## Henke and Hanley Roads

 Grading work will begin in the areas around and between Henke and Hanley Roads. The homes purchased by the state on Hanley Road in Dardenne Prairie have been removed. Utility relocations will also begin along Hanley Road.
## Route 94 to Motherhead

Crews are clearing in this area for design surveying work.

## Traffic Changes for South Outer 364 and Route N

The cross streets between Route N and South Outer 364 are closing permanently between July 15 and July 29. These streets were left in place in 2005 when South Outer 364 was opened with the intention they would close when construction of Route

364 occurred. The new highway will be a four-lane divided highway with 60 mph traffic. Local traffic will be using Route K or Bryan Road to access the local area. The two crossings at East and West Brassel close Monday, July 15. The two crossings at

Twin Chimneys close Monday, July 29. The signals at Route K and Route N and at South Outer 364 will be monitored and adjusted to the traffic changes. Route N at South Outer 364 will stay open until new Route N is connected to Bryan Road by November 1.
