New Route 47 Missouri River Bridge to open in December

After years of planning, preparation and hard work the new Route 47 Missouri River Bridge is just weeks from opening. The columns are up, the deck is poured and the finishing touches are underway.



A public viewing of the new bridge starts at 1 p.m. on December 1, with a ribbon cutting ceremony set for 3 p.m. Following the ceremony, the city of Washington will host a party on the riverfront to mark this momentous day.

The bridge itself is expected to open to traffic the week of December 3. This is not the end and there is still a lot of work to do including demolition of the old bridge and cleaning up and reopening the trail under the bridge. Both of those will happen in 2019.

Judy's Safety Minute

There is a growing problem in the region with drivers running red lights.

Here are some basic rules of the road when it comes to traffic signals:

- Stop at all red lights, even flashing ones.
- Stop at the stop line. Do not move into the intersection until the light turns green.
- A flashing red light should be treated like a stop sign. Come to a complete stop and when it is safe to do so make your turn or proceed through the intersection.
- When your light turns green don't just take off. Take a second to make sure everyone else is stopped.
