Work Zone Awareness Week: What's Ahead?

As you may already know, the eastbound I-70 Blanchette Bridge rehabilitation project is already underway and is scheduled to have major impacts until November 2020. We also have pavement repairs set to begin the week of April 6, 2020 from eastbound I-64 to Lake Saint Louis. These repairs are a part of the I-70 to Lake Saint Louis Boulevard project. The completion date is Winter 2020.



With each new season, especially Spring, more construction rolls out! That's why it's so important to pay attention to our work zones throughout the St. Louis District.

Don't Zone Out in Work Zones

- Buckle Up! – Every trip, every time – safety belts save lives.
- Put Your Phone Down! – Dedicate your full attention to the roadway.
- Follow Signs! – They'll guide you through work zones safely.
- Expect the Unexpected! – Watch for flaggers, workers and equipment.
- Pay Attention! – Turn the radio down and don't use your cellular phone.
- Don't Speed! – Follow posted limits and adjust for weather conditions.
