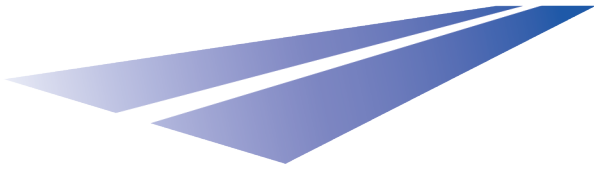


Southeast Coalition for Roadway Safety
