



WHAT COULD ENHANCED CROSSING LOOK LIKE?

Pedestrian crossing details will be determined through engineering analysis. Possible installations could include one or more of the following:



PEDESTRIAN REFUGE ISLAND

A raised area in the middle of the road that lets pedestrians cross one direction of traffic at a time.



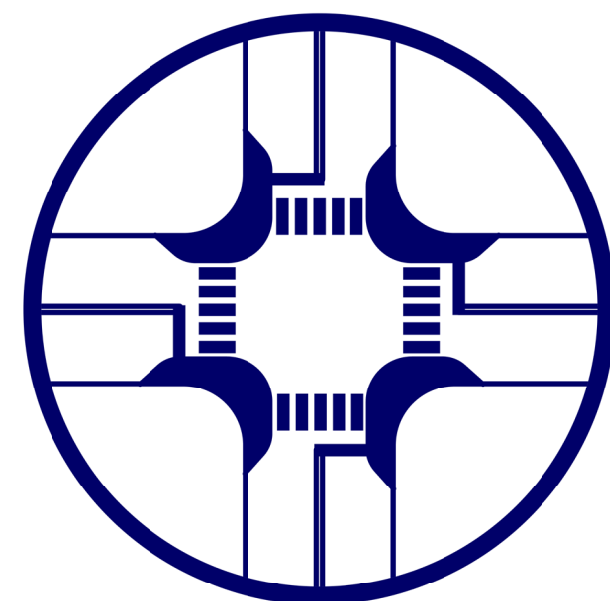
CROSSWALK VISIBILITY ENHANCEMENT

Features such as high-visibility markings and lighting that make crosswalks easier for drivers to see, especially at night.



RECTANGULAR RAPID FLASHING BEACON (RRFB)

Flashing yellow lights that turn on when a pedestrian presses a button, alerting drivers to slow down and yield.



BUMP-OUTS TO SHORTEN CROSSINGS

Extended curbs that shorten crossing distance and make it easier for drivers and pedestrians to see each other.



PEDESTRIAN HYBRID BEACON

A special traffic signal that stays dark until activated by a pedestrian, then stops traffic to allow for a safe crossing.



ENHANCED SIGNAGE

Improved or additional signs that give drivers clearer advance notice of pedestrian crossings.
