

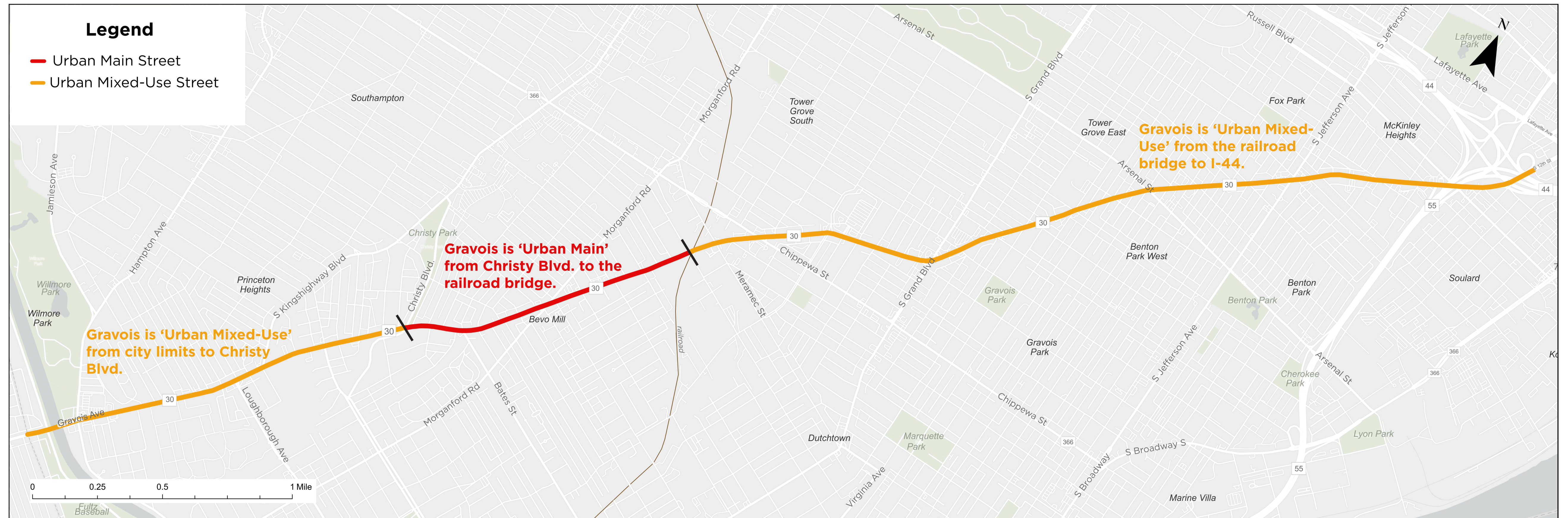


GRAVOIS TYPOLOGY

WHAT IS TYPOLOGY?

A typology describes how a roadway should function based on the surrounding community and how people use it.

There are two main typologies on Gravois: **Urban Main Street** and **Urban Mixed-Use Street**.



TYPOLOGIES HELP GUIDE DECISIONS ABOUT:

- How to support all users (people walking, biking, taking transit, and driving)
- How space is allocated
- Which improvements are appropriate

Typologies aid the transportation planning process by providing a flexible toolkit of design options, rather than a one-size-fits-all solution.

URBAN MIXED-USE STREET

Intended to support areas where people live, work, shop, and spend time, all in close proximity.

What that looks like on Gravois:

- Safer and more comfortable sidewalks and crossings.
- Space for bike connections or facilities.
- Transit access improvements (bus stops, crossings).
- Design that supports business activity and redevelopment.

URBAN MAIN STREET

Focused on creating a walkable, community-centered street that supports local businesses and neighborhood identity.

What that looks like on Gravois:

- Strong focus on safe, frequent crossings.
- On-street parking to support businesses.
- Traffic calming for lower speeds.
- A street that prioritizes pedestrians and feels comfortable to walk along and spend time on.
