A synopsis of the June 11, 2026 Cost Share Committee Meeting

Summary of Program Activity

- ❑ One STAR Loan request was approved for \$320,000.
- ❑ Fifteen projects were approved for \$58.6 million.
- ❑ MoDOT's Cost Share Program has \$16.8 million available in state fiscal year 2026, \$22.5 million available in state fiscal year 2027, \$3.0 million available in state fiscal year 2028, \$0.5 million available in state fiscal year 2029, and \$10.5 million available in state fiscal year 2030 for cost share projects.
- ❑ MoDOT's Cost Share Program has \$2.9 million available in state fiscal year 2026, \$9.4 million available in state fiscal year 2027, \$9.0 million available in state fiscal year 2028, \$4.5 million available in state fiscal year 2029, and \$4.5 million available in state fiscal year 2030 for cost share projects that encourage economic development.

STAR Loans Approved

City of El Dorado Springs - \$320,000 to construct a new runway and taxiway and remove the existing asphalt runway, fly ash treated base and partial tile drain system. The loan request will be presented to the Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission in July 2026 for approval.

MoDOT's Cost Share Program Partnerships Approved

City of Columbia - \$1,529,500 to construct a new signalized intersection on Route B at the site of the future extension of Starke Avenue, including a new pedestrian crossing and modify or remove existing entrances.

The Boeing Company - \$2,435,972 to modify the existing signal layout to improve the traffic flow on Airport Road and widen the on-ramps to Interstate 170.

Martin Energy Group Services - \$1,997,540 to construct dedicated left and right turn lanes on Route 50 east of Tipton at the entrance to Martin Energy Group's plant.

City of Chesterfield - \$10,000,000 to reconstruct and convert the existing Interstate 64 and Long Road partial interchange to a new full access interchange.

City of Camdenton - \$1,119,408 to construct an auxiliary lane for westbound Route 54 from north of Jack Crowell Road to the northbound Route 5 on-ramp.

St. Charles County - \$23,750,000 to reconstruct nearly four miles of existing Route N from an undivided two-lane road to a divided, realigned multi-lane roadway between Ebert Lane to Hawk Ridge Trail.



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City of St. Clair - \$8,557,500 to construct vertical curve improvements on Route 47 north of East Happy Sac Road to North Outer Road, construct a roundabout and realign the intersections of East Happy Sac Road and Airport Road on Route 47, and construct a northbound left turn lane and a northbound right turn lane at the intersection of Route 47 and North Outer Road.

City of Kansas City - \$1,223,184 to add traffic signals and geometric improvements at the Route 291 and N Eastern Road intersection.

Cape Girardeau County Commission - \$375,750 to add traffic signals and lane improvements at the intersection of Route 61 and Cape Girardeau County Road 601.

City of Hillsboro - \$434,950 to install a new traffic signal on Route B at Peachtree Drive, construct new sidewalks along Route B to Route 21 and south along Route 21 to the City Park, and complete sidewalks along Route 21 from the north city limits to the City Park.

City of Wentzville - \$4,819,554 to construct a new two-lane roadway on Mar-Le Drive on the north side from West Pearce Boulevard to Lodora Drive. Construct the Linn Pedestrian Bridge, a two-span pedestrian bridge over Interstate 70.

State Technical College of Missouri - \$924,500 to construct turn lanes and create a north leg to the current three-legged "T" intersection at a new eastern entrance to State Technical College of Missouri off of Route 50.

City of Grain Valley - \$300,000 to widen the bridge by constructing approximately 26 feet of roadway to the Lefholz Road bridge in conjunction with the Improve I-70 project JST0019.

Grundy County - \$885,795 to construct a left turn lane on Route 65 at Southeast 20th Street south of Trenton, MO.

City of Kansas City - \$207,355 to construct concrete median islands to restrict left turn movements at the intersection of Route 291 and 108th Street and install new lighting.
