The State Historic Preservation Office may require a **Phase I Survey** at the onset of your construction project. This study includes a search of relevant historic documents and a field survey of the actual construction site. If remains of past human occupations are located, they will be evaluated according to criteria established under federal legislation. Upon the recovery of Asignificant@ remains, the State Historic Preservation Office may require that the site either be avoided by construction or be tested at a Phase II level. If no remains are located or if the discovered remains are deemed Ainsignificant,@ a report is filed, the process is completed, and construction may proceed.

A **Phase II Testing** involves the excavation of a small portion of the site to determine its subsurface Antegrity. @ In other words, are buried remains present and do they meet the criteria of significance? If the answer is Ano, @ a report is filed, the process is completed, and construction may proceed.

Occasionally, sites with significant, buried remains are discovered. If such sites cannot be avoided during construction, a **Phase III Data Recovery** may be required to mitigate the loss of cultural data incurred by the construction project.

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# Why would I need a Cultural Resource(CRM) Study?

*These studies are required for construction projects that involve:*

## Federal Permits

*if a permit such as an Army Corps of Engineers 404 Permit is needed*

## Federal Properties

*if the project is located on federally owned or governed property*

## Federal Funds

*if you are obtaining funding from*

*a government agency, such as EPA, VA, FCC, FHA, HUD, FDIC, FmHA, FEMA, or FAA*

## Human Remains

*if an unmarked human burial or cemetery is present*
