Frequently Asked Questions

What is the purpose of tonight's hearing?

The purpose of tonight's hearing is to provide information on plans for pavement and ADA improvements on Routes B and 763 in Boone County.

Why is this work necessary?

The milling and asphalt overlays on Route B and 763 are necessary to keep the pavements in good condition. The improved pavements will provide smoother, safer surfaces with better traction for motorists. The ADA improvements are needed to bring sidewalks and intersections along both routes into compliance with the federal Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. These improvements will provide safer access for all pedestrians, especially those with disabilities.

How will traffic be affected?

The milling and asphalt overlay work will be a moving operation with single lane closures. The ADA construction will require some sidewalk closures with pedestrian detours identified. Some private and commercial entrances will require partial closures. Lane closures will be necessary at some intersections during construction. Periodic night work will occur along Route 763 and portions of Route B to avoid peak traffic times.

When will the work take place?

Work on Route B is scheduled for 2017 while the work on Route 763 will take place during the spring and summer of 2018.

Will additional right of way be needed to construct these projects?

All pavement work will be done within existing state right of way. Some temporary and permanent easements will be needed for the ADA improvements.

What will the projects cost?

The cost for the Route B construction is approximately \$1.5 million, while the Route 763 construction is approximately \$1.9 million.
