

INVITATION TO BID

Hudson Township Bridge Replacement

Sealed bids for Hudson Township Bridge No. 582AR01, will be received at: 107 Butler Street, P.O. Box 366, Macon, MO 63552 until **4:00 pm** on the **7th day of August, 2015**, at the office of the Shafer, Kline & Warren, Inc., and at that time will be publicly opened and read. All bids shall be submitted in the form of a hard copy.

The proposed work includes: Channel improvements including the placement of bank stabilization/protection along the East Fork of Chariton River and concrete back wall repair under and around Bridge 582AR01 on Jaguar Street.

All labor used in the construction of this public improvement shall be paid a wage no less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages of work of a similar character in this locality as established by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations (Federal Wage Rate), or state wage rate, whichever is higher.

The Hudson Township Commission hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, businesses owned and controlled by socially and economically disadvantaged individuals will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, religion, creed, sex, age, ancestry, or national origin in consideration for an award."

Contractors and sub-contractors who sign a contract to work on public works project provide a 10-Hour OSHA construction safety program, or similar program approved by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, to be completed by their on-site employees within sixty (60) days of beginning work on the construction project.

A certified or cashier's check or a bid bond in the amount of 5% shall be submitted with each proposal.

The contract, if awarded, will be awarded to the lowest, responsive, responsible bidder complying with the Conditions of the Contract Documents within the Owner's budget. The Bidder to whom the awards are made will be notified at the earliest possible date. The Owner, however, reserves the right to reject any and all Bids and to waive any informality in Bids received whenever such rejection or waiver is in his interest.
