IMPROVE I-70 MONTHLY REPORT

Missouri's FY2024 budget approved through the state legislative process and signed into law by the governor provides \$2.8 billion in General Revenue to build a third lane of I-70 across the state from Blue Springs to Wentzville.

2026 IMPROVE I-70 PROJECT LOOK AHEAD

MoDOT's historic \$2.8 billion Improve I-70 Program broke ground on its first construction project in June 2024 and continues to make progress across the I-70 corridor. Three projects are already under construction and two more are scheduled to begin this summer ([Improve I-70: Rocheport to Columbia](#) and [Improve I-70: Boonville to Rocheport](#)). As work along the corridor continues, traffic changes are anticipated. Crews are doing everything in their power to keep impacts to traffic minimal. In an effort to keep the traveling public updated as progress continues to be made, the following major traffic impacts are anticipated in 2026. PROJECT	ANTICIPATED 2026 TRAFFIC IMPACTS (DATES VARY AND ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE)
Columbia to Kingdom City	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Interchange improvements at I-70 and U.S. Route 63 connector (mile marker 128). Lake of the Woods bridge over I-70 full closure for approximately four months. This work is tentatively scheduled for Summer 2026. Add a third lane of travel to I-70 and rebuild existing pavement between Hatton and Kingdom City (mile markers 144-148). Sign up for project emails for the latest information.
Warrenton to Wentzville	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> MO Route 47 and I-70 interchange work in Warrenton requiring closure of Route 47 bridge for approximately four months. This work is tentatively scheduled for Summer 2026. Add a third lane of travel to I-70 and rebuild existing pavement between Warrenton and Wright City (mile markers 191-198), Wright City and Foristell (mile markers 201-205), Wentzville (mile markers 205-208). Interchange work at I-70/I-64/U.S. 61 interchange in St. Charles County ongoing through 2026. Add a third lane of travel to I-64 between Route 364 and the I-70/I-64/U.S. 61 interchange ongoing now through Summer 2026. Interchange work at I-70 and Route T/W in Foristell ongoing throughout Fall 2026. Various long-term ramp closures. Sign up for project emails for the latest information.
Blue Springs to Odessa	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Add a third lane of travel to I-70 and rebuild existing pavement between Blue Springs and Grain Valley (mile markers 20-26). Add a third lane of travel to I-70 and rebuild existing pavement between Route M/O and Route H in Lafayette County (mile markers 41-45). Demolition of Lefholz Rd. bridge over I-70 in approximately mid-February 2026. Sign up for project emails for the latest information.
Rocheport to Columbia	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> I-70 and Providence Rd. interchange work (mile marker 126) requiring closure of Providence Rd. bridge for approximately four months. This work is tentatively scheduled for Summer 2026. Sign up for project emails for the latest information.
Boonville to Rocheport	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Add a third lane of travel to I-70 and replace existing pavement between Boonville and Rocheport (mile markers 101-121). Sign up for project emails for the latest information.

IMPROVE I-70 TRUCK PARKING PROJECT BEGINS IN SPRING 2026

MoDOT's Improve I-70 Program includes approximately \$29 million in INFRA Grant funds to expand availability of truck parking along the I-70 corridor. This project could include improvements at existing truck parking and rest areas in Odessa, Concordia, Boonville, Mineola, and Wright City. This project will soon transition into a Design-Build project. Public information meetings highlighting the needs for more truck parking will be held in both Concordia and Wright City in late January. BLUE SPRINGS TO ODESSA PROJECT COMPLETES FIRST TRAFFIC SWITCH

Crews with the Improve I-70: Blue Springs to Odessa project have completed paving what will eventually be the third lane and inside shoulders of Interstate 70 between Route 7 in Blue Springs and Route AA/BB in Grain Valley, as well as between Route M/O and Route H in Lafayette County. In mid-December crews shifted westbound I-70 traffic in these areas onto the newly constructed lanes in the median. Switching traffic into this configuration will allow crews to reconstruct the existing westbound I-70 lanes. To learn more, [watch the video here](#) or scan the QR code.
