Reconstruction of the existing I-70 lanes is underway between Callaway County Routes J and M

project segment, <u>Columbia to Kingdom City</u>, in June 2024. One year later, crews have made significant progress on this 20-mile stretch of interstate. Crews have been completing paving work along various sections of I-70 in the area, bridge work along U.S. Route 63 near Conley Rd., and along U.S. Route 54 at I-70. Construction is anticipated to be complete by late 2027. MoDOT reminds motorists to use caution in work zones, drive the posted speed limits, and eliminate distractions.

WARRENTON TO WENTZVILLE: I-70 TRAFFIC SWITCH BEGINNING IN AUGUST

The Warrenton to Wentzville project continues to make strides. On July 11, the first bit of concrete pavement was placed on I-70 in Warren County just east of Warrenton. This new pavement will be the future eastbound shoulder of I-70, plus it will be utilized as part of the traffic shift to Phase 2 of construction.


Beginning in August, crews will start relocating the temporary concrete traffic barrier in order to shift eastbound traffic to the far right. Shifting the traffic to this configuration will allow crews to re-construct the existing eastbound I-70 pavement.

IMPROVE I-70 INFRA GRANT INFORMATION

In an effort to leverage funding for the Improve I-70 program, MoDOT submitted an aggressive grant application to the U.S. Department of Transportation through the INFRA Grant Program. This discretionary federal grant program allows transportation owners to compete for federal funding. In 2024, MoDOT received a partial award for Improve I-70 with a discretional federal grant. A total of \$92 million in federal funds were awarded for the Improve I-70 Program. The INFRA grant funds will be used to make improvements beyond the addition of a third lane on the first three segments of the Improve I-70 Program. Learn more at www.modot.org/improvei70/grants
