The Missouri Highways and Transportation Commission is requesting the services of a consulting engineering firm to perform the described professional services for the project included on the attached list.

If your firm would like to be considered for these consulting services, you may express your interest by responding to the appropriate office, which is indicated on the attachments. Limit your letter of interest to no more than three pages. This letter should include a statement to indicate your firm's understanding of the project. It should also include any other information which might help us in the selection process, including key personnel you would assign to the project and the backgrounds of those individuals, and any sub-consultants you would propose to use, and an indication of your firm's approach to promoting and developing a diverse workforce. MoDOT is committed to reflecting the diversity of the communities we serve and we expect our partners to do the same. We will utilize the consultant information already on file so we will not need a lengthy submittal of other general company information. In addition, please attach one page with detailed information on similar projects that your key personnel have worked on. Indicate the role your key personnel played in the projects and include reference contact information.

DBE firms must be certified by the Missouri Department of Transportation in order to be counted as participation towards an established DBE Goal. We encourage DBE firms to submit letters of interest as prime consultants for any projects they feel can be managed by their firm. We also encourage both DBE firms and non-DBE firms to consider joining MoDOT's Mentor/Protégé program whenever possible as part of a MoDOT project.

MoDOT will evaluate firms based on: Past Performance, Qualifications of Personnel Assigned, Familiarity/Capability, General Experience of Firm, and Accessibility of Firm and Staff. Firm's not providing a response on approach to workforce diversity will be considered non-responsive to this solicitation. Firm's that are not current on all of the required prequalification categories found in MoDOT's Approved Consultant Prequalification List at the date of the solicitation expiration will be considered non-responsive.

We request all letters be received by 3:00 pm, September 23, 2016 at the appropriate office.

Consultant Services Required:	The consultant team will prepare a conceptual plan (Phase No. 1) and roadway and bridge preliminary and final plans (Phase No. 2) for the proposed improvements.	
Other Comments:	The improvements along this corridor are divided in to three separate areas: the Rte. I-35 and Rte. 152 Interchange, the Kansas Street and Rte. 291 Intersection and the section of Kansas Street between these two locations. The initial contract will be negotiated for only the conceptual study phase (Phase No. 1), which is scheduled to be completed by February 15, 2017. Upon successful completion of this phase, a supplemental agreement will be negotiated for the preliminary and final design phase (Phase No. 2). During Phase No. 1, the Consultant will be expected to perform a detailed traffic projection and traffic modeling analysis as well as providing alternatives with cost estimates for improving the corridor traffic operations. The conceptual study will include all three project areas listed above. The Consultant will be required to provide any traffic control and any equipment necessary for data collection, traffic projection, traffic modeling and analysis, and conceptual study. A traffic study report and conceptual plan for all three project areas will be the main deliverable for Phase No. 1.	

Phase No. 2 of the project will include all the services necessary for completing the roadway and bridge final design and survey tasks required to develop a final PS&E package in time for an September 2018 letting. MoDOT will be responsible for the environmental study, geotechnical report, utilities clearance, right of way acquisition, organizing public meeting. In addition to the final design activities the consultant will be responsible for the following services: providing displays/layouts and information for utility clearance, right of way acquisition and public meeting.

Phase No. 2 will, at a minimum, include the improvements to the Rte. I-35 and Rte. 152 Interchange. Based on the results of the conceptual study and future funding negotiations the other two project areas may or may not be included in Phase No. 2.

The consultant will provide project support during the construction phase to help answer questions or evaluate value engineering proposals.
