What to do at RRFBs

(Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon)



Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) are pedestrian-activated flashing devices that can be easily seen by drivers from longer distances. RRFBs increase driver awareness and provide a safer crossing opportunity for pedestrians like you and me!



WALKERS:



to activate the RRFB lights, so that motorists are more likely to notice that you are trying to cross.



- with drivers and WAIT until traffic is yielding before stepping out.
- Make sure each traffic lane is clear before you move on to the next.
- Say thanks by flashing a smile to drivers!

DRIVERS:

- when approaching a mid-block crosswalk or intersection.
- 2 STOP FOR WALKERS trying to cross at crosswalks, even if RRFB lights are not flashing.
- GIVE PLENTY OF SPACE:
 Stop at the stop bar or yield triangle pavement markings.
- NEVER PASS another vehicle that has stopped or is slowing down at a crosswalk.
