About This Project

This study evaluates the future of Route 30 (Gravois), a **5.7-mile corridor** that connects neighborhoods, businesses, and destinations across the City of St. Louis.

Led by MoDOT in coordination with the City of St. Louis and project partners, **this study focuses on safety improvements ahead of a planned resurfacing in 2029.**

Since the first Public Meeting in March, the team has heard feedback from residents, businesses, and corridor users about safety concerns, travel needs, and opportunities for improvement.

What We've Accomplished So Far Analyzing Existing Conditions

Jan.-April 2026

The team took a deep dive into how Gravois looks, feels, and functions today.



The team has completed analyzing the existing conditions on Gravois. The team evaluated the effectiveness of past and present safety improvements on Gravois, how different modes of travel use the corridor, and gathered input from residents, businesses, and stakeholders who interact with Gravois every day.

Auditing the Corridor On-Foot

Feb. 2026

In February 2026, the project team conducted a walk audit along Gravois to experience the corridor on the ground.

The audit brought together community members, emergency service responders, and representatives from both the City of St. Louis and MoDOT to observe conditions firsthand.



This on-the-ground review helps identify potential safety concerns, accessibility challenges, and areas for improvement that may not be fully captured through data alone.

By walking the corridor together, the team gained valuable insight into how Gravois operates for all users, including pedestrians, drivers, and transit riders.

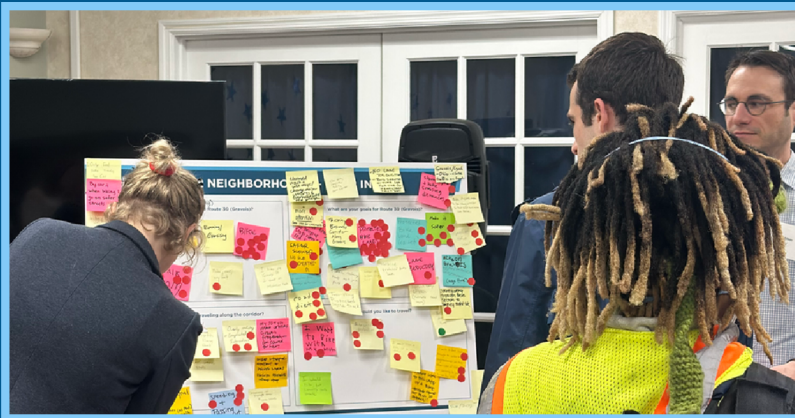

Where We Are Now Identifying Solutions



April-June 2026

The project is currently in the **concept development phase** to identify potential solutions to improve safety, based on concerns and ideas shared by corridor users. **MoDOT and the City of St. Louis are proposing changes to pedestrian crossings, intersections, and lane configurations.** These concepts will be presented at the second Public Meeting on June 10, 2026.



Because this project could significantly affect how people access businesses, schools, neighborhoods, and organizations along the corridor, your input is critical at this stage.

The feedback from the second public meeting and ongoing community conversations will be incorporated into the study recommendations.

Convening Advisory Committees

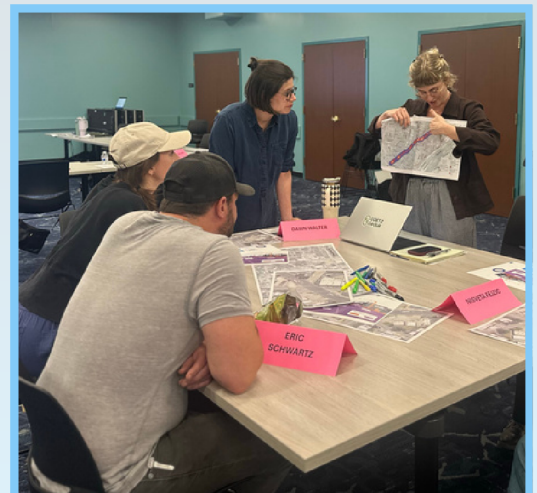
2 committees, 32 total members



April 13 and 14, 2026

The project's two advisory committees met for the first time in April 2026. The Resident Advisory Committee includes people who live and/or work near Gravois, while the Multimodal Advisory Committee includes people who use transit, biking, walking, and other non-car travel options along the corridor.

Committee members reviewed the project's progress and shared insights based on their experiences using and living near Gravois. They also participated in activities focused on improving safety, access, and intersection design. Their feedback helped shape the interactive activities that will be featured at the second Public Meeting on June 10.
