




Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations



Safety Regulations

You are subject to safety regulations in Interstate commerce if:

- GVWR /GCWR/ GVW/GCW is 10,001 pounds or more
- Hauling an amount /type of hazardous materials requiring placards
- Designed to transport/ transporting 9 or more passengers for compensation
- Designed or used to transport 16 or more passengers regardless of compensation



Safety Regulations

Safety Regulations apply in *Intrastate* commerce if:

- GVWR/ GCWR/GVW/GCW is 26,001 pounds or more
- Hauling any amount of hazardous materials in a vehicle with a GVWR/ GCWR/GVW/GCW of at least 10,001 pounds
- Hauling an amount /type of hazardous materials requiring placards
- Operating vehicle designed to/ or transporting 9 or more passengers inclusive of the driver for compensation
- Operating vehicle designed to/ or transporting 16 or more passengers inclusive of the driver regardless of compensation







CDL

Part 383



Applicability

- Based on GVWR/GCWR/GVW/ or GCW or
- Carrying hazardous materials type/ quantity requiring placards, or
- Operating a vehicle designed to carry 16 or more passengers



Who needs a CDL?

A- having a GCWR or gross combination weight of 26,001 pounds or more whichever is greater, inclusive of a towed unit with a GVWR or gross vehicle weight of more than (10,000 pounds), whichever is greater; or



Who needs a CDL?

B- having a GVWR or gross vehicle weight of 26,001 pounds or more, whichever is greater; or



Who needs a CDL?

- **C** Vehicle that does not meet Group A or B requirements but that either -
- Is designed to transport 16 or more passengers, including the driver; or
- Is of any size and is used in the transportation of hazardous materials as defined in this section.
 - Hazardous materials means any material that has been designated as hazardous under 49 U.S.C. 5103 and is required to be placarded under subpart F of 49 CFR part 172 or any quantity of a material listed as a select agent or toxin in 42 CFR part 73.

Part 380 ELDT

Effective February 7, 2022

- Must complete training from a training provider listed on FMCSA's Training Provider Registry if applying for a CDL, a CDL upgrade, or a hazardous materials, passenger, or school bus endorsement
- Training now has specific curriculum requirements for each endorsement and classification as well as two core segments:
 - ✓ Theory training
 - ✓ Behind the wheel training

Steps To Get a CDL



Take and pass written test(s) at a State testing facility to obtain commercial learner's permit (CLP)

ELDT Courses

Complete both theory and BTW training from a training provider listed on FMCSA's Training Provider Registry

Skills Test

Pass the CDL skills test with the MSHP

HM endorsement requires only theory training

A CLP is not necessary for theory training except for hazmat theory training

DefinitionsPart 390.5

Accident means -

- an occurrence involving a commercial motor vehicle operating on a highway in interstate or intrastate commerce which results in:
- A fatality; or
- Bodily injury to a person who, as a result of the injury, immediately receives medical treatment away from the scene of the accident; or
- One or more motor vehicles incurring disabling damage as a result of the accident, requiring the motor vehicle(s) to be transported away from the scene by a tow truck or other motor vehicle

Situational tests:

Post Accident - Drug/Alcohol

- √ 8 hours: Alcohol (document after 2 hours)
- √ 32 hours: Controlled substances

Situational tests:

- Reasonable Suspicion-supervisor must receive 60 minutes training for controlled substances/ alcohol (each)
- Return-to-Duty- following prohibited conduct and completion of SAP evaluation/ recommended treatment
- Follow-up- minimum of 6 follows ups within 12 months after negative RTD test

Positive Test Results

- Alcohol >/= .04
- Controlled substances confirmed positive test
- Refusal to test or failure to complete test

Company Policy (382.601)

- Outlines program

Inquiry to previous employers

- Effective 1/6/2023, inquiries must be conducted through FMCSA's Drug & Alcohol Clearinghouse.
- A pre-employment query must be conducted prior to allowing a driver to perform a safety sensitive function (driving).

Note: Drivers previously employed with non-FMCSA DOT regulated employers must have inquiries conducted outside of the Clearinghouse.

Drug & Alcohol Clearinghouse (DACH)- What is it?

- A secure online database
- Provides real-time information of CDL/ CLP drug and alcohol program violations

DACH Queries

- Employers are required to query the Clearinghouse for current and prospective employees' drug and alcohol violations before permitting those employees to operate a CMV on public roads.
- Employers are required to annually query the Clearinghouse for each driver they currently employ.

What records are stored in the Clearinghouse?

- Refusals for drug and/or alcohol tests
- Positive test results
- Return to duty tests
- Any violation that would prohibit a driver from performing any safety sensitive function

Who has access to the Clearinghouse?

- Employers
- Drivers
- 3rd Party Consortiums
- Medical Review Officers
- Substance Abuse Professionals
- State Driver Licensing Agencies

Employer Reporting

- An alcohol confirmation test with concentration of 0.04% or higher
- Refusal to test (alcohol)
- Refusal to test (drug) not requiring a determination by the MRO
- Negative RTD test results (drug and alcohol testing, as applicable)
- Completion of follow-up testing

Employer Reporting

Actual knowledge that a driver has:

- used alcohol on duty
- used alcohol within four hours of coming on duty
- used alcohol prior to post-accident testing, or
- used a controlled substance

MRO Reporting

- Verified positive, adulterated, or substituted drug test result
- Refusal to test (drug) requiring a determination by the MRO as specified in 49 CFR 40.191
- Changes a verified drug test per 49
 CFR Part 40

SAP Reporting

 Identification of driver and date the initial assessment was initiated

 Date of determination of eligibility for RTD testing

Carrier Record Retention (382.401)

- Five Years- positives/ refusals, driver evaluations/ referrals; calendar year summaries; administrative records regarding drug/ alcohol
- Two Years- records relating to collection process
- One Year- negative/ cancelled tests & alcohol tests below .02
- ✓ Location of Records must be secure

Motor Carrier Identification Reports

- Applicable to interstate carriers and intrastate for-hire carriers
- MCS-150
- Assigns carrier a USDOT number
- Before operations begin, and update every 24 months
- Annual update required for IFTA/IRP account carriers

Driver Qualification

Applicability

- Drivers of CMVs including owner operators
- Exceptions
 - ✓ Custom harvesting operations
 - ✓ Apiarian industries (beekeeper)
 - ✓ Covered Farm Vehicles (MAP-21)
 - Farm vehicle drivers of combination/articulated vehicles
 - ✓ Private Motor Carriers of Passengers (Non-Business)



Driver Qualification

Must meet certain conditions such as:

- ✓ At least 21 years old / 18 for intrastate
- ✓ Read and speak English
- ✓ Safely operate CMV
- ✓ Physically qualified
- ✓ Possess current valid CMV operator's license
- ✓ Driver prepares list of violations for employer (391.27 removal 5-9-2022)
- ✓ Not disqualified
- ✓ Successfully complete driver's road test with employer



Driver Qualification Missouri Class E license

- Not part of CDL classification
- For Hire and Private carriers in commerce
- Driver receives a wage, salary or commission
- Includes owner operators
- At least 18 years of age



Driver Qualification file check list

- ✓ Driver Application for Employment
- ✓ Inquiry to Previous Employers
- ✓ Inquiry To State Agencies (MVR)
- ✓ Annual Review of Driving Record



Driver Qualification file check list:

- ✓ Annual Driver's Certification of Violations
 (5-9-2022 no longer required-retain for 3 years)
- ✓ Driver's Road Test Certificate OR Equivalent
- ✓ Medical Examiners Certificate CDL driver MVR must have updated medical certification status (15-day grace period upon issuance of new card)
- ✓ Note of Verification Examiner is on National Registry

Medical Qualifications

- All drivers of CMVs must be medically qualified
- There are some exceptions such as:
 - Missouri grandfather clause
 - Government, Military, etc.
 - Some private property farmer exemptions
- Performed by a licensed medical examiner trained and registered by FMCSA
 - Note in Driver File proving this was verified
- Certificate must also be carried by driver (15 days after added at DMV for CDL drivers)

Medical Qualifications

All CDL holders must claim a certification category

- ✓ Non-Excepted Interstate (NI)
- ✓ Non-Excepted Intrastate (NA)
- ✓ Excepted Interstate (EI)
- ✓ Excepted Intrastate (EA)

Failure to notify DOR of your certification category will result in a downgrade of your CDL to a Class E License

New medical card must be presented to DOR upon each renewal

Medical Exemption Program

Interstate Waivers / SPEs

- Effective March 22, 2022: Implementation of Alternative Vision Standard

Intrastate Waivers / SPEs

- Limb SPE & Hearing Exemptions
 - Effective March 22, 2022: Mirror Federal Alternative Vision Standard

Alternative Vision Standard

 The new alternative vision standard replaces the former vision exemption program as a basis for determining the physical qualification of drivers who cannot otherwise meet the vision standard.

Alternative Vision Standard

To qualify under the new vision standard, a driver must:

- Have a distant visual acuity better than 20/40 in their better eye with or without corrective lenses
- Have a field of vision of at least 70 degrees in the horizontal meridian.
- Be able to recognize the color of traffic signals and devices.
- Have stable vision deficiency.
- Sufficient time has passed since the vision deficiency became stable to adapt to and compensate for the change in vision.
- Individuals granted exemption are required to requalify every 12 months

2 Sets of Rules

Passenger carriers

10 / 15 Hour rules

Property carriers

- 11 / 14 Hour rules
- We will only discuss the property carrier rules in this outreach.



Property Carrier Maximum Driving Time

- 11 Hour Rule
 - 11 hours driving / 10 hours off duty
- 14 Hour Rule
 - 14 hours after coming on duty / 10 hours off duty
 - Off Duty hours cannot extend your workday (split sb may)
- 60 / 70 Hour Rules
 - 60 hours on duty / in 7 days
 - 70 hours on duty / in 8 days



30 Min break requirement

- Requires a 30-minute break only when a driver has driven for a period of 8 hours without at least a 30minute interruption.
- Does not apply to passenger carriers
- Does not apply to 150 air-mile radius drivers
- Can be taken in either off duty, sleeper berth, or on duty – not driving period options.



Rest period options

- 10 hours consecutive off
- 10 hours consecutive sleeper berth
- 10 hours consecutive combined off-duty & sleeper berth
- Sleeper berth provision



34 Hour Restart Provision

- Property carriers only
- Restarts 7/8 consecutive day period
- Can be used as many times as driver wants



Record of Duty Status

- Applicability
 - Every motor carrier who operates CMVs
- Exceptions
 - Private motor carriers of passengers (nonbusiness)
 - Short haul carriers operating within 150 air mile radius (i.e. time sheets)
- Must record each 24 hour period using the ELD recording method unless exempted.
- Retention
 - RODS and supporting documents for 6 months



ELD General Information

- Who does this impact?
 ALL drivers who are required to prepare RODS.
- What vehicles does this impact?
 All makes and models year 2000 and newer
- Effective Date?

 Effective 12/18/2017

 AOBRDs no longer allowed as of 12/16/2019
- Which device to use?
 ELD Registry https://csa.fmcsa.dot.gov/ELD/List



ELD Exceptions:

- Local drivers who operate no more than 8 days in a 30 day period which require RODS
- Driveaway / Towaway operations/ Livestock & insect haulers
- Vehicles older than 2000 manufacture year engine model year 1999 or older are exempt
- Leased vehicles during the first 8 days of lease period. Lease agreement MUST be present



ELD Additional Information

AOBRDs

AOBRDs can continue to be used if otherwise exempted from ELDs, but Part 395 is still applicable.

Malfunction Procedures

Must be reported by driver within 24 hours of occurrence

Can only utilize paper logs for a maximum of 8 days unless an extension has been granted

Request for extension must be filed by 5th day after malfunction has taken place




Applying the 11-hour rule

Three step process


- 1. Determine last 10 hours of rest.
- 2. Determine next ten hours of rest
- 3. Count only "driving time" between those two periods.




Applying the 14-hour rule

- 1. Determine last 10 hours of rest.
- 2. Count all time except for time credited towards a qualifying split sleeper berth.
- 3. Violations begin when the driver drives the vehicle after the end of the 14th hour, after coming on duty following 10 consecutive hours off-duty.







Records

- Maintenance File
- Identifying information
- Preventive maintenance plan
- Log of operations performed
- Retain for 1 year while vehicle is in motor carrier's control and for 6 months thereafter



Inspection, repair and maintenance

396.11 - Post-trip inspection report

- End of day on each vehicle driven
- Only days where defects were found on each vehicle driven
- Note defects or indicate deficiencies
- Defects noted must be corrected before dispatch
- Next driver reviews previous days inspection
- Retain report for 90 days



Periodic Inspection (Federal Annual) 396.17

- Truck and trailer meet definition of CMV
- Performed each 12 month period
- Inspector qualifications
- Retain for 14 months
- Roadside inspections with CVSA decals are no longer acceptable equivalent




Periodic Inspection

Performed by commercial maintenance shop OR

 Performed in house by mechanic that meets criteria specified in 396.19 & 396.25

 Proof of a periodic inspection is required to be produced roadside

Brake Inspectors

- No motor carrier may require or permit any employee who does not meet the minimum brake inspector qualifications to be responsible for the inspection, maintenance, service or repairs of any brakes on its commercial vehicles.
- No motor carrier may employ any person as a brake inspector unless the evidence of their qualifications is maintained at their principal place of business, or at the location at which the inspector is employed.



CVSA Decal

- Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance
- Affixed after a successful level I or V inspection
- Government use only
- Decal is vehicle specific
- Indicates that vehicle inspected within past 90 days








