General Summary

The senior facility operations specialist performs advanced and complex building and utilities maintenance, repairs, and renovations to department facilities. Responsibilities are performed under general supervision.

Minimum/Required Qualifications

- High school diploma or GED/HiSET.
- Six years equivalent combination of post-secondary education and experience in a building repair and maintenance field such as carpentry, electrical wiring, facilities operation and management, HVAC, or related.
- Successful completion of a work simulation examination and a medical-physical examination.

Special Working Conditions/Job Characteristics

- Job may require occasional overnight travel.
- Job requires heavy physical exertion and effort.
- Job requires exposure to physical hazards, health and safety risks, and/or adverse or otherwise undesirable characteristics in the environment.
- Job may require operation of vehicles to plow snow and spread ice control materials.

Examples of Work

1. Performs on-site inspections of building and utility repairs and maintenance performed by contractors to ensure work meets required specifications.
2. Installs and maintains heating and air conditioning equipment, power equipment, lighting fixtures, power panels and related building utilities.
3. Troubleshoots and repairs heating equipment, electrical systems, pumps, plumbing, utility lines, roofs, and related building maintenance.
4. Recommends or performs preventative maintenance for buildings and utilities.
5. Develops and prepares various building and utilities contracts for renovation, maintenance and repairs.
6. May serve as a liaison with external vendors, contractors, and engineers.
7. Researches and prepares cost estimates and specifications for materials and services to be bid.
8. Performs lead worker responsibilities, which may include providing general instruction, assigning and reviewing work, coaching and training, providing guidance and instruction in the proper and most efficient methods of accomplishing tasks, and providing input to the direct supervisor on staffing decisions and performance management.
9. Performs other responsibilities as required or assigned.
