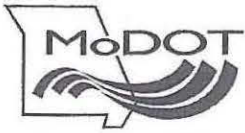

**EUGENE SKILES & CHARLES SKILES**

The two sons of Mr. and Mrs. Charles J. Skiles Sr. who lived about two miles north-west of Richmond were killed on the USS ARIZONA at Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941.  
At the time of their deaths Eugene was twenty-four years old and Charlie was eighteen years old.  
Eugene started to school in Exeter Springs before attending school in Richmond. Charles school years were spent in the Richmond schools.

Eugene was a member of the United Mine Workers of America #14.  
Before enlisting in the U.S. Navy in April 1941 both boys spent some time with the CCC Camps. Eugene was with them for about eighteen months and Charlie about six months.  
Both boys liked music and both of them played in the ships band.  
Eugene and Charles held the rating of Second Class Seaman and both were to be promoted to First Class in January 1942.

**GAROLD LEROY SKILES**

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Thomas Skiles of the Liberty school neighborhood, southeast of Millville, was killed on the USS OKLAHOMA at Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941.  
Garold was twenty-one years old at the time of his death.  
Garold spent most of his time on the farm. He started to school at Aske in Kansas City. Later he attended the Millville school where he graduated.  
Garold enlisted in the U.S. Navy in April 1941, as did his two cousins, Eugene and Charles.

# Gold Star Parents, Guests of V.F.W.-Navy Welcome Homeward Bound Veterans

For Mr. and Mrs. Charles J. Skiles, farm couple from Richmond, Missouri, whose two sons, Charles, Jr., 17, and Eugene, 21, died aboard the Battleship Arizona when the Japanese attacked Pearl Harbor, the week which began (for them) at 1:20 a. m., on Tuesday, February 12, will be one they will remember as long as they live.

For, in the darkness of that early morning, they and another son, Emmett, 15, rattled into the deep upholstered seats of a T. W. A. airliner at the airport at Kansas City and began a journey that was the fulfillment of their dreams, their prayers, their hopes.

Some time ago, Mrs. Skiles, mother of 13 children, eight of whom are still living, wrote to Harry Truman — the same Harry Truman who has gone far since her husband knew him as a minor Jackson county, Mo., politician. She told him that, since her two boys would not be coming back, it was her fervent wish that she and Charlie might be in hand somewhere, sometime, when a ship came in bringing other boys back.

Maybe Charles and Eugene might be among them — not really, of course; but, maybe from somewhere among the boys crowding down the gang-plank, Charles and Eugene might come, phantom-like, with arms outstretched, to receive a welcome-home from Mom and Dad.

in October, 1942, and served with the Polish Air Force in England from December, 1942, to February, 1943.

He then rejoined the American 85th Fighter Group, and served in various capacities. As acting squadron commander, he functioned as a group leader in combat. He was forced down over Germany on July 29, 1944, crash-landed and evaded the Germans for five days while working his way back to Belgium. He was captured by civilians and turned over to the Luftwaffe on July 28, 1944.

## HAS HIS 25TH

But, before falling into German hands, he clinched his claim to top combat fighter honors by shooting down the 28th Nazi plane on July 20, 1944, the day he was forced down. After this mission, which was to have been his last before his return to the United States—and his scheduled marriage to Miss Kay Cochran, of Grand Rapids, Michigan—he was reported "missing in action." He also is credited with three Nazi planes destroyed on the ground.

He remained in German prison camps for nine months, during which he lost 25 pounds, and was liberated when Allied troops overran a camp known as Stalag Luft 1, near Barth, north of Berlin.

After his release, he was re-
