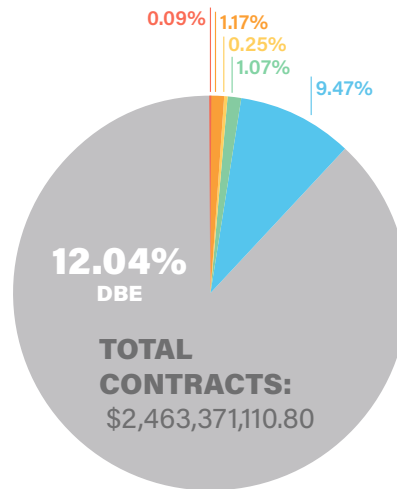
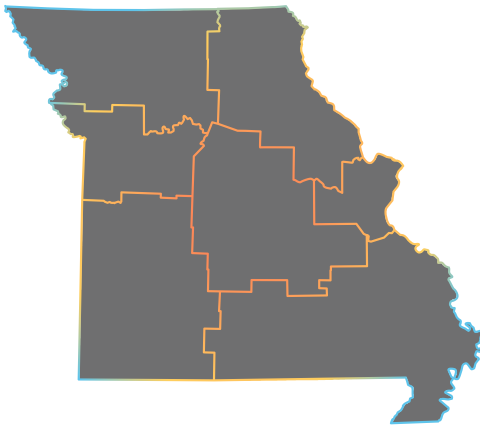


Disadvantaged Business Enterprises

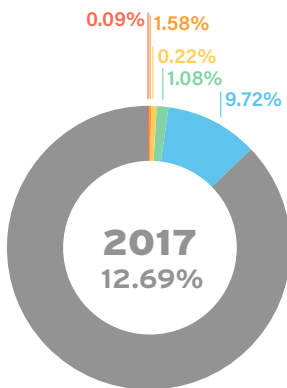

Statewide TOTAL FFY 17-19

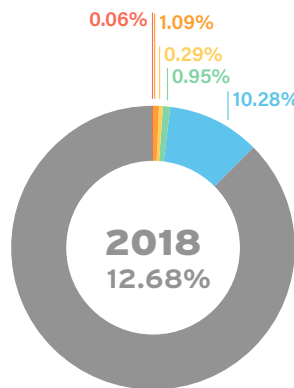

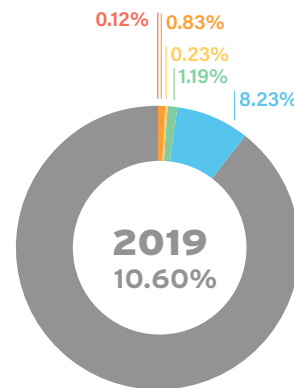
