QUESTIONS

Question 1: In the RFB, it specifies we are to provide materials and service necessary for

asphalt paving and striping. I do not see any layout to determine how much

striping to figure?

Answer: Per Item # 7 shown on the drawing: "PAVEMENT MARKING BY OTHERS".

The RFB should not have indicated striping as part of the project.

Question 2: If prime is required, the lot will have to be sprayed and set overnight at least

before mix can be placed on it. Per MoDOT specs, if you lay material 4" thick,

then prime is not required.

Answer: Prime will be required on this project.



Question 3: Can the Bit. Base be laid in one lift, if we can get compaction?

Answer: Yes.

Question 4 Will prime be required on the rock base?

Answer: Yes.

Question 5: Clarification of prime and tack coat application rates:

REMOVE #5 from drawings as shown: "5. Prime will be required and Tack coat shall be applied between lifts of asphalt (0.05GAL/SY)"

REPLACE with: "5. Prime (0.35GAL/SY) will be required and Tack coat (0.05GAL/SY) shall be applied between lifts of asphalt."
