Question:

The RFP states that *MoDOT* has the responsibility to ensure that sub-recipient agencies of those FTA funds flowing through MoDOT comply with FTA's grant terms and conditions. Does the offeror assume any contractual liability for non-compliant sub-recipient agencies?

Response:

Yes. Ultimately it is the responsibility of MoDOT to ensure sub-recipients who receive federal funding are complying to federal rules. This is an area of review during the State Management Review performed by FTA every 3 years.

Question:

Is it incumbent upon the offeror to successfully move non-compliant sub-recipients (regarding grant terms and conditions) to compliant status?

Response:

We will perform the review and determine the deficiencies necessary to be federally compliant. It is intended to move non-compliant sub-recipients to compliant status.

Question:

The RFP states that *due to MoDOT's recent agency-wide staffing reductions* ... along with FTA's expanded oversight obligations, the Transit Section has not kept pace with the desired degree of on-site reviews of sub-recipients. Will you identify the total number of MoDOT sub-recipient agency grants requiring reviews in the most recent year, and (within that number) the total number of MoDOT sub-recipient agency grants in compliance in the same most fiscal year as determined by MoDOT?

Response:

MoDOT has approximately 250 sub-recipients. Most are in the 5310 program with others in the 5311 and 5309 programs. All sub-recipients receive a review at a minimum once every 3 years. Approximately 80-85 reviews are performed per year.

Question:

Are there any vendors of record currently sub-contracted, or were there any vendors of record subcontracted in the most recent fiscal year by MoDOT, conducting reviews of sub-recipients?

Response:

Yes, Milligan & Co.

Question:

Will you be more specific regarding the RFP language, *on-site reviews of sub-recipients*? Can the offeror make good faith effort to communicate, obtain information, review information, and determine compliance status by electronic communication and correspondence, instead of on-site reviews (excepting instances of on-site review as determined by offeror)?

Response:

All sub-recipients will have an on-site review at a minimum, once every 3 years. The awarded consultant will be charged with communication, obtaining information, and review of information to determine compliance. Each year a risk analysis will be performed by MoDOT to determine the sub-recipients who will be reviewed.
