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1.0 Introduction

The Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) is beginning the First Tier Environmental Impact Statement (FTEIS) for I-70 in Kansas City Metro beginning from the end of the last ramp termini east of the Missouri – Kansas state line to east of the I-470 interchange, including the entire Kansas City, Missouri Downtown Central Business District Freeway Loop. This portion of I-70 spans approximately 18 miles and currently serves:

- Kansas City, Missouri-Kansas
- Independence, Missouri
- Local and Regional Business and Industry
- Interstate and International Freight Movements
- Neighborhoods
- Commuters
- Surrounding Cities



A map of the Study Area is attached at the end of this document.

MoDOT and a consultant team, lead by Wilbur Smith Associates with Patti Banks Associates for public involvement will:

- Examine the purpose and need for the I-70 FTEIS and the initial improvement concepts developed during the *I-70 Major Investment Study (2004)*.
- Narrow the list of initial concepts and create a set of potential first tier strategies.
- Use a set of criteria to evaluate the first tier strategies.
- Recommend a single preferred strategy.

The planning process is anticipated to be completed in 2010 with the Final First Tier Environmental Impact Statement and Record of Decision.

The public involvement program will focus on achieving quality public participation that brings people together.

The document outlines the plans and process for the Study Team to achieve public participation and agency coordination as required by Section 6002 and other National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and MoDOT requirements. Per Section 6002, this Public Involvement and Agency Coordination Plan will be circulated to potential cooperating and participating agencies and other lay stakeholders for review and comment.

Since the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) is expected to provide funding for this project, FHWA serves as the lead federal agency for the project. MoDOT, as the direct recipient of Federal funds for the project, is the joint lead agency.

Section 6002 of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act – A Legacy for Users of 2005 (SAFETEA-LU) requires that the lead agencies establish a plan for coordinating public and agency participation and comment during the environmental review process.

The public involvement process for the I-70 FTEIS will focus on achieving quality public participation that brings people together to resolve issues, establishes communication between diverse groups, and finds solutions to problems. It will also:

- Outline the community involvement process with targets and reminders as to what is happening at each phase of the project.
- Identify key contacts with agencies, the news media, citizen groups, and the general public.
- Explain the various methods and media to be used throughout the process including the basic information to be included with each.

- Include a contact list and the communications protocol to be used with stakeholders, especially for reaching minority, low income, and elderly populations.
- Clearly explain how the I-70 FTEIS fits within the context of other I-70 studies statewide and in relation to future second tier studies.

The Plan includes a statement of its goals and intent, an initial list of stakeholders, tools, an overview of the public and agency coordination involvement process, timing, key milestones and deliverables, and contact information for the Study Team. The plan will be placed on the project website and made available for public review and comment. The plan will be updated periodically to reflect any changes to the project schedule and other items that typically require updating over the course of the project.



A truly effective public involvement process gathers the right information from the right people at the right time using the most appropriate methods possible.

2.0 Goals and Intent

A truly effective coordination process gathers the right information from the right people at the right time using the most appropriate methods possible. The information gathered is then used to refine the project in a way that assures the public that their input is valuable and makes the overall project better. The process supports the idea that public involvement should be timely, useful, and used. In keeping with this idea, goals for this I-70 FTEIS Public Involvement and Agency Coordination Plan include:

- Identify early coordination efforts.
- Identify cooperating and participating agencies to be involved in agency coordination.
- Establish the timing and form for agency involvement in defining the project's purpose and need, the range of strategies to be investigated, and impact

assessment methodologies, as well as reviewing the preliminary Draft FTEIS.

- Maximizing stakeholder communication effectiveness.
- Increasing responsiveness to stakeholder key issues and concerns.
- Establish timing and form for public opportunities to be involved and commenting on the study.
- Describing the communication methods that will be implemented to inform the community.
- Developing a process that achieves informed public consent regarding the project and its outcomes.

3.0 Public Involvement Process

This section outlines the activities that will constitute the public involvement process for the I-70 FTEIS.

3.1 Stakeholders

Stakeholders are individuals and groups who are affected by or have an interest in a particular project or action. A wide variety of stakeholders make up the Study Area including property owners and residents, community groups, business groups, developers, utility companies, school districts, umbrella organizations (chambers of commerce, neighborhood associations, etc.), and elected and appointed officials at the federal, state, county, and local levels. (*List of I-70 FTEIS stakeholders by area and organization is in **Appendix A***). The list of stakeholders will be updated as new stakeholders are identified or stakeholder contact information changes.

3.2 Public Involvement Tools

Printed materials, the internet, a variety of meetings, a central point of contact, and the media, will be used to share information about and gather feedback for the I-70 FTEIS. The use of each of these tools will be coordinated to ensure that each truly:

- **Informs** the community of the project, its timeframe, challenges, decisions to be made, and how it will impact residents, businesses, and communities.
- Gains community understanding, support, and **advocacy for project funding and implementation.**
- **Solicits community input** on the purpose and need constraints including issues, concerns, and ideas for making the project effective in terms of transportation, on concepts, and on strategies.
- **Helps develop a relationship** for the development of the second tier environmental document.

A mailing/e-mailing list and a public involvement log will also be kept for the project and the Public Involvement Plan will be updated as necessary. Descriptions of the vision, purpose, and implementation method for each tool are included below.

- **Printed Materials:** A creative blueprint resulting in the design of a graphic family consisting of photo, font, and color pallets that communicates the project and message to the audience will be prepared for the project. The family will also include templates for all meeting materials.



The newsletters will serve to set the overall graphic look and identity for the project as well as provide project information.

- ✓ The **newsletters** will serve to set the overall graphic look and identity for the project as well as provide project information. Four newsletters will be designed and distributed for the project to area residents and interested parties on behalf of MoDOT. The newsletters will communicate project milestones to the public beginning first with the purpose and need, constraints, and initial concepts. The second will communicate the first tier strategies and the third will communicate the recommended preferred strategy. The last newsletter will outline final remaining steps in the project.
- ✓ In addition, a **flier** will be designed and distributed for the project. It will also convey project milestones including the purpose and need, constraints, and initial concepts to the public. Copies of the flier will be distributed to key locations in the community, e.g. restaurants, grocery stores, places of worship, community centers, multifamily housing complexes and management, etc.



Slideshows will be converted into interactive PDFs for posting on the project website similar to MoDOT's Improve I-70 project.

- **Slideshows:** The Study Team will develop two PowerPoint presentations for the project. The first will focus on the overall I-70 FTEIS process and improvement strategy packages; the second on the preferred strategy. Each of the slideshows will be converted into **interactive PDFs** for posting on the project website. The design of the PDFs will be similar to that developed for MoDOT's Improve I-70 project: <http://www.improvei70.org/pdf/OnlinePublicMeeting.pdf>. However, they will also include links to MoDOT's blog software to afford on-line viewers the opportunity to comment and develop discussion threads related to the content presented.

- ✓ One series of two **“Saturday Coffees”** will be conducted to discuss the project with local residents. The coffees will occur after the pre-location public meetings. They will be held per round. As a result, the first round of coffees will be held to discuss the purpose and need, constraints, and initial concepts with the community. The coffees will be formatted as open houses and include a formal presentation.
- ✓ A **Speakers Bureau** will be established for the project. Designated Study Team members will attend neighborhood, business, and community organization meetings by request. Two rounds of speaking opportunities will be coordinated for the Speakers Bureau: the first will communicate the improvement strategy packages and the second will communicate the preferred strategy. Invitation letters will be distributed to potential organizations to announce each round and invite them to invite the Study Team to participate in their meetings.
- ✓ A **Listening Post** will be coordinated to communicate the I-70 FTEIS improvement strategy packages to the public. The Listening Post will be formatted as an open house public meeting. Participants will have the opportunity to review the project slideshow and then discuss the improvement strategy packages with staff in small groups over exhibits, e.g. maps and display boards.
- ✓ A series of **Interactive MoDOT Mobile Meetings** will be used to share information about the strategy packages and preferred strategy with



MoDOT Mobile Meetings at Arrowhead Stadium and other locations will be used to share information about the strategy packages and preferred strategy with commuters.

commuters. MoDOT will use its existing 12-passenger van, display tent, and backdrop for the meetings. The van should be stationed for two-hours at the following key events:

- At Arrowhead Stadium for the University of Missouri vs. University of Kansas “Border Wars” Football Game
 - One Royals Baseball Game at Kauffman Stadium
 - One First Friday in the Crossroads Arts District
 - One visit to Kansas City’s River Market Area
 - One visit to the Wal-Mart Super Center on Blue Ridge Road in Independence, Missouri
 - Three other opportunities that may include a repeat of the aforementioned locations.
- ✓ As part of the meetings MoDOT will staff an information table that provides information about the project to interested stakeholders. The Study Team will also circulate the event location to talk with members of the public about the project and distribute “Contact Us” business cards.
- ✓ The **location public hearing** is required by the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) for all projects being processed with an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). The location public hearing for the I-70 FTEIS will be held at two locations in the Study Area. Quarter-page display ads will be placed in five local newspapers that together reach the general public and ensure all groups have access to the process. In addition, ten 30-second radio spots will run the week before the hearing. A court reporter will document oral public comments for the hearing. Draft responses

to substantive comments will be created for inclusion in the location/environmental document. Final responses will be included with the final environmental document.

- ✓ **Spanish and Vietnamese Translators** will be available at Public Meetings, Saturday Coffees, and the Public Hearing as those are key language groups other than English identified in the Study Area.

- **Central Point of Contact:** The MoDOT District 4—Kansas City phone number (1-888-ASK-MODOT (275-6636)) will be used as the phone number for the project. MoDOT's Kansas City office (600 NE Colbern Road, Lee's Summit, Missouri 64086) address will be used as the mailing address for the project.
- **Mailing List:** A Master electronic mailing list will be created using base lists that MoDOT provides electronically and the Jackson County property owner list for locations in the Study Area. This list will be maintained and updated throughout the FTEIS. It will contain community groups, property owners, interested residents, agencies, local officials, and state elected officials. Key stakeholders and public officials will be identified appropriately on this list. All interested parties will be encouraged to add their names to the electronic mailing list.
- **Media:** An Introductory Media Kit will be produced that contains project information, an introduction to the environmental planning and NEPA processes, the difference between an MIS and EIS, corridor maps, a contact list, and other material as deemed appropriate by MoDOT District Community Relations.

- ✓ **Media Advisories and Releases:** The MoDOT Community Relations Specialist will develop and distribute Media advisories and releases.
- ✓ **Media List:** MoDOT District 4 will maintain a media list.
- **Public Involvement Log:** A Public Involvement Log will be maintained for the project. It serves as a filing structure that is intended to allow for the summary of public correspondence for the comments and coordination in the environmental document.
- **Public Involvement Plan:** The plan will be updated as warranted.

4.0 Agency Coordination as Required by Section 6002 of SAFETEA-LU

The I-70 First Tier Environmental Impact Statement study will follow the guidelines for agency participation as stated in the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU). The Study Team will follow the guidance from FHWA for compliance with the public participation provisions of SAFETEA-LU.

SAFETEA-LU identifies three different types of agencies for coordination along with the general public: cooperating agencies, participating agencies, and other stakeholders (usually private sector associations or groups). Early in the I-70 FTEIS project, the Study Team will identify key federal, state, and local stakeholders with whom coordination is needed and determine their likely level of involvement.

A Notice of Intent to complete the FTEIS was published in the Federal Register on July 9, 2008. This was the first step in the agency (and public) coordination process.

Coordination letters will be prepared and distributed to stakeholder agencies notifying them of the study and requesting their involvement. The letters will describe how the study will be conducted to fulfill Section 6002 of SAFETEA-LU and other NEPA requirements and identify the agencies potential involvement as a cooperating or participating agency. The Study Team will also hold a site meeting and tour with cooperating/resource Agencies on July 16, 2008 to review the project. The letter and meeting are meant to fulfill the scoping activities point of collaboration.

4.1 Cooperating Agencies

Cooperating agencies are those governmental agencies specifically requested by the lead agency to participate during the environmental evaluation process for the project. FHWA's NEPA regulations (23 CFR 771.111(d)) require that those federal agencies with jurisdiction by law (with permitting or land transfer authority) be invited to be cooperating agencies for an EIS.

The United States Environmental Protection Agency has been requested by letter act as a formal cooperating agency for the I-70 FTEIS. If new information reveals the need to request another agency to serve as a cooperating agency, then MoDOT in consultation with FHWA will issue that agency an invitation.

4.2 Participating Agencies

SAFETEA-LU (Section 6002) created a new category of agencies to participate in the environmental review process for EISs. These are federal and non-federal governmental agencies that may have an interest in the project because of their jurisdictional authority, special expertise and/or statewide interest. All federal, state, regional, and local

government agencies that may have an interest in the project will be invited to serve as participating agencies. Non-governmental organizations and private entities cannot serve as participating agencies. To date 14 agencies have been invited to become participating agencies. If, during the progress of the project, new information indicates that an agency not previously requested to be a participating agency does indeed have authority, jurisdiction, acknowledged expertise or information relevant to the project, then MoDOT, in consultation with FHWA, will promptly extend an invitation to that agency to be a participating agency.

The roles and responsibilities of participating agencies include, but are not limited to:

- ✓ Participating in the NEPA process starting at the earliest possible time, especially with regard to the development of the purpose and need statement, range of strategies, methodologies, and the level of detail for the analysis of strategies.
- ✓ Identifying, as early as practicable, any issues of concern regarding the project's potential environmental or socioeconomic impacts. Participating agencies also may participate in the issue resolution process described later in this guidance.
- ✓ Providing meaningful and timely input on unresolved issues.
- ✓ Participating in the scoping process.
- ✓ Reviewing and providing comment on the preliminary version of the Draft FTEIS.

Accepting the designation as a participating agency does not indicate project support and does not provide an agency with increased oversight or approval authority beyond its statutory limits, if applicable. Cooperating agencies are, by definition, participating agencies, but not all participating agencies are cooperating agencies. The roles and responsibilities of cooperating and participating agencies are very similar, but cooperating agencies have a slightly higher degree of authority, responsibility, and involvement in the environmental review process.

Comment periods for the public or participating agencies will not exceed 30 days unless a different comment period is established by the Study Team, project sponsor, and all participating agencies.

4.3 Collaboration Points and Cooperating and Participating Agency Protocols

SAFETEA-LU incorporates changes aimed at improving and streamlining the environmental process for transportation projects. Lead and participating agencies have legal and general governmental obligations to work cooperatively to improve the environmental review process. The roles and responsibilities specified in Section 6002 for lead agencies and participating agencies form a part of those obligations.

Lead and cooperating agencies for the project must agree that the project may move forward at key points including the impact assessment methodologies, purpose and need, first tier strategies, preliminary Draft FTEIS, and preliminary Final FTEIS. Cooperating agencies may also be asked to review key technical memoranda that deal with their expertise/jurisdiction. Cooperating agencies have special authority or expertise regarding certain aspects of the project.

Participating agencies may also be asked to review deliverables and provide feedback at the same collaboration points, including impact assessment methodologies, purpose and need, first tier strategies, preliminary Draft FTEIS, and preliminary Final FTEIS. The Study Team will address comments received from participating agencies before finalizing documents for official approval.

Coordination between the Study Team and cooperating and participating agencies will take place as follows:

- ✓ The MoDOT Study Team will submit written requests for reviews and concurrence on major documents, as listed above, and request that the cooperating and participating agencies complete their reviews of major documents within 30 days.
- ✓ MoDOT will work with FHWA to distribute material to federal agencies.
- ✓ MoDOT will provide all state and local agencies with notices and materials for review.
- ✓ Comments from the cooperating and participating agencies are to be provided in writing, although meetings and/or phone calls may also be held with representatives from the cooperating and participating agencies to supplement these comments.
- ✓ In order to facilitate the timely review of key documents, the MoDOT Study Team will continue to keep the cooperating and participating agencies apprised of the project schedule and notify them well in advance when they can expect to receive documents for review.

4.3.1 Collaboration on Impact Assessment Methodologies and Coordination Plan

The I-70 FTEIS in Kansas City Metro is following a tiered environmental documentation process. First tier documents address broad programs or overall corridor strategies and issues in an initial, higher level environmental analyses. More specific proposals and impacts are analyzed in subsequent second tier studies. The tiered process enables a decision-making process that focuses on issues that are ready for decision and reduces repetition in environmental documentation. First tier documents frame and narrow the scope for second tier studies and related decisions.

The assessment of impacts for different categories in the I-70 FTEIS will follow the FHWA Technical Advisory T 6640.8A Guidance for Preparing and Processing Environmental and Section 4(f) Documents and other relevant FHWA and MoDOT guidance as appropriate. As this is a first tier document, protocols established by prior first tier documents completed by MoDOT will be drawn upon. A separate methodologies summary will be provided for agency review and coordination along with copies of this coordination plan.

The output of this collaboration point should include input from the participating agencies on:

- ✓ The proposed impact assessment methodologies;
- ✓ The Public Involvement and Agency Coordination Plan.

Additionally, the agencies should provide input on environmental features, resources, and issues of concern.

4.3.2 Collaboration on Purpose and Need

A draft Purpose and Need Statement will be developed by MoDOT and reviewed by the FHWA. Based upon comments received during the scoping period from agencies and the public, MoDOT will prepare and forward to the participating agencies the revised purpose and need statement. A description of the initial concepts for the FTEIS will be included for agency input for screening purposes.

The output of this collaboration point should include input from the participating agencies on:

- ✓ The purpose and need statement and the Study Area of the project;
- ✓ Initial concepts to be considered.

Additionally, the agencies should provide further input on environmental features, resources, and issues of concern if new issues have arisen.

4.3.3 Collaboration on First Tier Strategies

Based on the output of the previous collaboration points as well as the public meeting on purpose and need/initial concepts and preliminary strategies analysis conducted during the project development process, MoDOT will prepare a “first tier strategies to be evaluated” information packet. This information to be forwarded to the participating agencies may include the following:

- ✓ Revised purpose and need statement and Study Area;
- ✓ Results of the initial concepts analysis and environmental screening (based on existing data sources and GIS inventories);

- ✓ Description of any other factors, besides purpose and need that will be considered in the screening of strategies, such as cost and environmental factors;
- ✓ Any updates to the coordination plan;
- ✓ A summary of all first tier strategies to be evaluated and their anticipated effectiveness in addressing the purpose and need of the project, as well as a map showing the location of the first tier strategies.

The output of this collaboration point should include input from the participating agencies on:

- ✓ The first tier strategies to be carried forward into the DEIS;
- ✓ The revisions to the purpose and need statement, if applicable;
- ✓ The revisions to the coordination plan, if applicable.

The joint lead agencies will decide on the range of first tier strategies after considering input from the agencies and the public. These project decisions made by the joint lead agencies are to be made at the "collaboration point" and are not required to be revisited later in the project if concerns are expressed later on.

4.3.4 Collaboration on Preliminary Draft FTEIS

Based on the output of the previous collaboration points and the subsequent detailed investigation of first tier strategies and analysis of impacts, MoDOT will prepare a Preliminary Draft FTEIS document. Cooperating agencies will be sent a copy of the Preliminary Draft FTEIS for review. MoDOT will inquire of participating agencies interest in reviewing and commenting on the Preliminary Draft FTEIS document.

The output of this collaboration point should include input on the adequacy of the preliminary Draft FTEIS. The agencies will be asked to specify whether additional information is needed to fulfill other applicable environmental reviews or consultation requirements. In addition, the participating agencies will specify any additional information needed to comment adequately on the preliminary Draft FTEIS analysis of site-specific effects associated with the granting or approving by the agency of necessary permits, licenses, or entitlements.

Based on the output from this collaboration point, MoDOT will prepare the Draft FTEIS for submittal to FHWA. Based on FHWA's approval of the DEIS for circulation, a Public Hearing will be conducted in accordance with NEPA requirements. The document will be made available for a minimum 45-day public and agency review period. Substantive comments will be addressed in the Final FTEIS.

4.3.5 Collaboration on Final FTEIS

Based on FHWA's approval of the Final FTEIS, the Final FTEIS will be made available for public and agency review for a minimum of 30 days. This period is the last period during which comments on the environmental evaluation process will be received from the public and agencies. Upon addressing the substantive comments received in the Final FTEIS comment period, MoDOT and FHWA will prepare a request for a Record of Decision (ROD) indicating the Selected Strategy. FHWA approval of the ROD completes the NEPA process for the project.

4.3.6 Section 106 Early Coordination

The lead agency (FHWA) or its designee (in this case, MoDOT) may use its procedures for public involvement under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) to

satisfy the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) or Section 106 requirements for public involvement as well, providing they offer adequate opportunities for public involvement. The NHPA requires the federal agency or its designee to seek the participation and consider the opinions of interested and appropriate parties throughout the Section 106 process including the identification and evaluation of cultural resources potentially affected by the project, the evaluation of project effects to historic resources, and the development of appropriate mitigation plans as needed. This “involvement” is referred to as “consultation”. MoDOT shall consider the nature of the project and the kinds of historic resources potentially affected to identify the appropriate individuals, organizations, and entities with whom MoDOT will consult. Because MoDOT considers Section 106 requirements early in the NEPA process, compliance with both statutes is coordinated throughout the project. As this is a FTEIS Study, the Section 106 process will not be initiated in this study but fully completed as part of future second tier studies.

4.4 List of Cooperating and Participating Agencies

A list of cooperating and participating agencies will be amended to this plan once letters are exchanged between the Study Team and the agencies involved.

4.5 Agency Coordination Meetings/Groups

All of the cooperating and participating agencies for the project will be invited to participate in one or both of two agency coordination teams. The first is the Resource Agency Coordination Group, which will be the forum for discussion of environmental issues, coordination and impacts specifically with agencies with jurisdictions/interests in particular resources. Approximately four Resource Agency Coordination Group meetings will be held to provide project

information and discuss key issues, including the site tour and meeting identified above. These meetings will be held in conjunction with major deliverable/concurrence points. Some of these meetings may be held in Jefferson City, MO to facilitate agency involvement.

The second agency coordination team will be the Local Study Management Group, which will be the forum for local government agencies to provide greater input into the project. Approximately eight Local Study Management Group meetings, staggered throughout the project, will be held to assist in sharing of information and enhance local input into decision making for the project. These meetings will be held at a local venue within or near the Study Area.

5.0 Approach and Timing

Though there are a variety of tools included in the coordination, each will begin with an orientation as to where they fall in the scope of planning process, what the role of the participants and readers is, and what decisions can and cannot be made. During meetings information about the project including goals, participants involved, and the overall planning process will be provided with a brief presentation using slideshows, boards and handouts as appropriate. Throughout the process MoDOT staff will be “the face” of the project and the consultant team will support them in every aspect. The entire public involvement process will be held over a two-year long period ending in 2010. A public involvement activities schedule is attached at the end of this document.

5.1 Anticipated Key Milestone and Deliverable Dates for Agency Reviews and Comments

Below is a table of the I-70 FTEIS schedule which provides a timeline for key coordination items to be delivered. This timeline will be updated as the project proceeds.

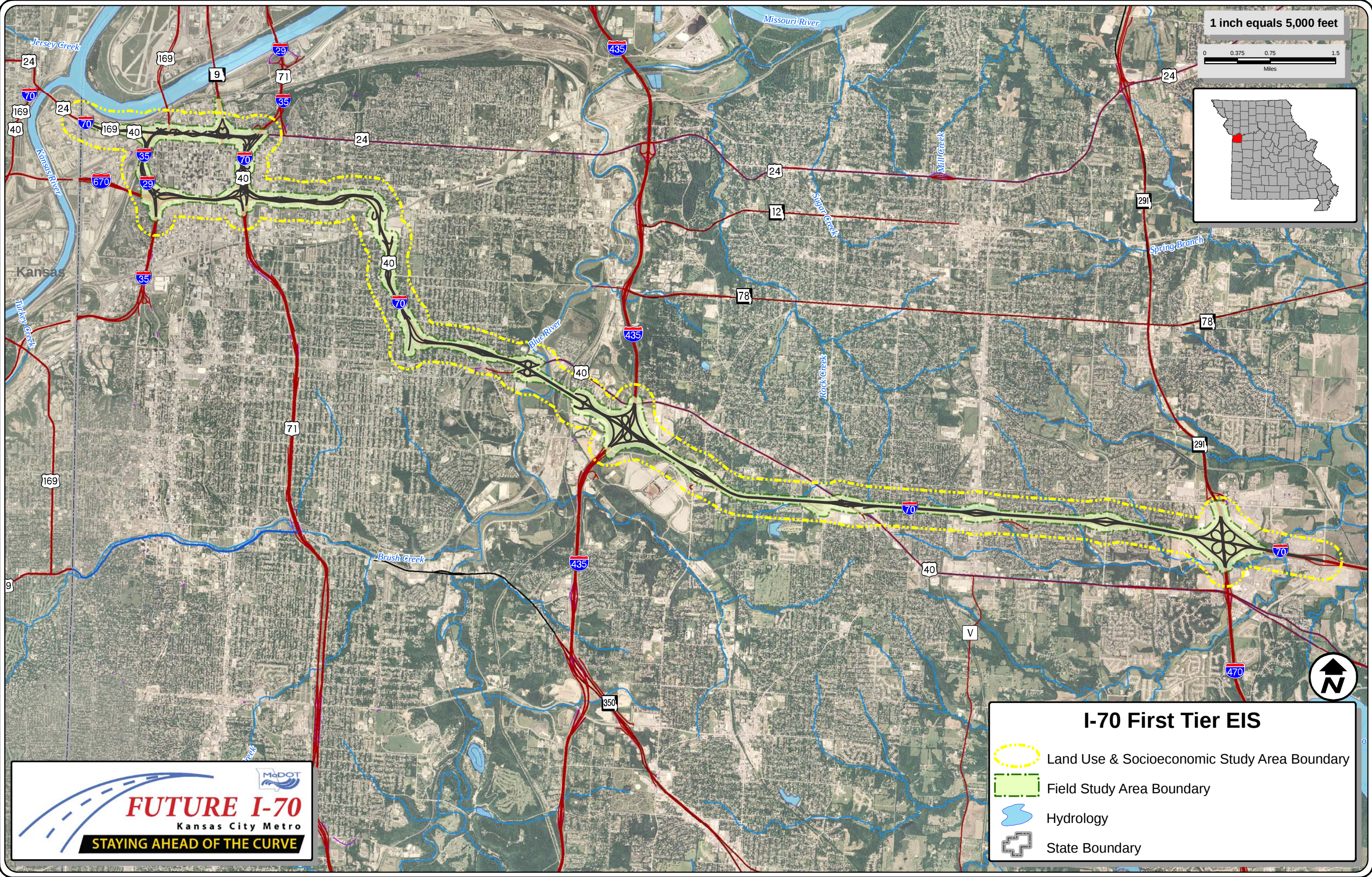
