An Update on Missouri's Funding Situation

MoDOT received some good news last month. A 4.5-percent increase over our projected amount in state tax revenue resulted in a onetime increase of \$47 million dollars in revenue for the state. This unanticipated revenue allows the state to match federal funding in 2017 and take care of our overall system of roads and bridges.

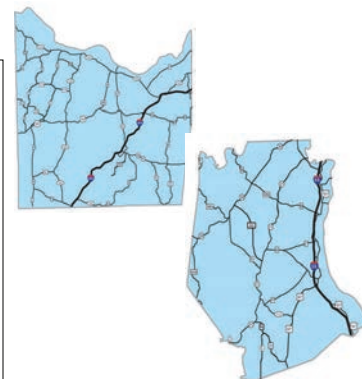
